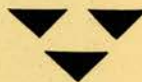

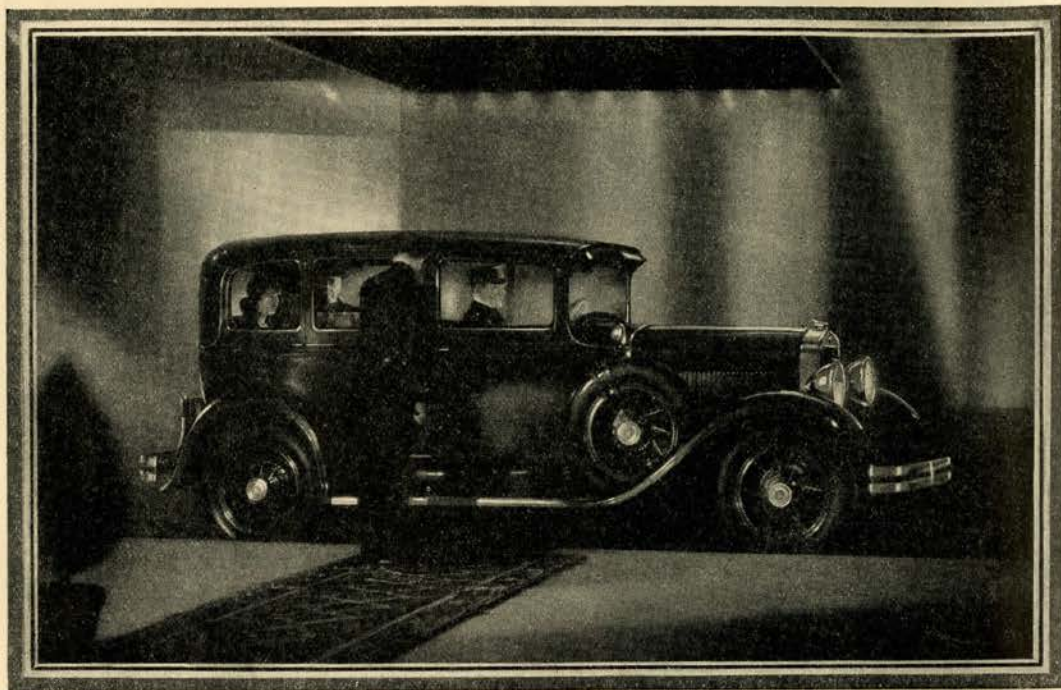

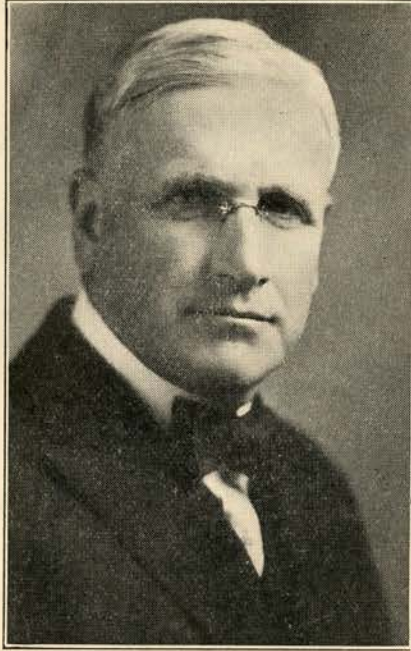

Mantua and Vicinity, Sixteenth Century

- Act I Ballroom in the Duke's Palace.  
Act II Outside of Rigoletto's Home.  
Act III A Hall in the Duke's Palace.  
Act IV Sparafucile's Inn at a lonely spot.

Founded on Victor Hugo's play "Le Rois' Amuse" (The King's Jester). The tale of the jester whose own daughter was ensnared by the master from whose affairs he derived such wicked pleasure. Planning the Duke's death as revenge he unwittingly brought about his daughter's death instead.

## Highlights in the Music

- Act I The Duke: "Questa o quella" (Mid the fair throng; this one or that one, to me 'tis the same).  
Rigoletto: Coarsely ridicules Monterone in the flippant "Ch'io le parli" (I will speak to him).
- Act II Rigoletto: Famous monologue, "Monologo—"Pari siamo" (We are equal) referring to the equal deadliness of his poisonous tongue and Sparafucile's dagger.  
Rigoletto and Gilda: Duet, "Deh non parlare al misero" (Recall not the past).  
Duke and Gilda: Duet, "E il sol dell' anima" (Love is the sun).  
Gilda: The lovely aria "Caro Nome" (Dearest Name).
- Act III Courtiers tormenting Rigoletto: "Povero Rigoletto" (Poor Rigoletto!).  
Rigoletto: In one of the most remarkable scenes in any opera, "Cortigiani, vil razza dannata" (Vile Race of Courtiers).  
Gilda to Rigoletto: "Tutte le feste al tempio" (On every festal morning).  
Rigoletto, comforting Gilda: "Piangi fanciulla" (Weep, my child).
- Act IV Gilda learns Mantua's falseness through his song, "La Donna e mobile" (Woman is fickle).  
Duke, Maddalena, Gilda, Rigoletto: "Bella figlia dell' amore" (Fairest daughter of the graces), the great Rigoletto Quartet.  
Rigoletto and Gilda: "Lassu in Cielo" (In Heaven Above).

Act III	Scene 1 Dulcamara and Adina: "Io son ricco" (I have riches). Scene 2 Adina and Dulcamara: "Quanto amore" (What love). Nemorino: "Una furtiva lagrima" (A furtive tear). (One of Schipa's most popular arias.) Adina: "Prendi, per me sei libero" (Take it, through me you're free again).

# Municipal Participation in Symphonic Music



The coming 1929-1930 season will mark the eighth year of Symphony concerts under municipal auspices at low admission prices. During this eight-year period many great works have been presented, including the Beethoven Ninth Symphony, Mahler's "Resurrection Symphony", the world premier of Ernest Bloch's prize rhapsody, "America", Handel's oratorio, "Messiah", Haydn's "Creation", and Verdi's "Requiem." Many of the world's greatest musicians have appeared as guest artists at these important events.

A great municipal chorus has been formed under the able directorship of Dr. Hans Leschke and this splendid body of trained voices is always in readiness to join with the orchestra in the presentation of oratorios and music festivals.

The Board of Supervisors has each year contributed a sum sufficient to cover the deficit incurred by the Summer Symphony Concerts, and this year will contribute substantially to the deficit sustained last season by the Musical Association's Winter Concerts. All this I believe to be a warranted investment in the artistic future of San Francisco.
