# CAVALCADE



A cavalcade of costumes will take us back to the beginning of motion pictures on the Pacific coast. In 1909, Goldstein & Co. costumed for Mr. Turner the first multi-reel film produced on the Pacific coast, named "Captain Kidd." In 1911, D. W. Griffith produced the first five-reel picture, "Judith of Bethulda," starring Blanche Sweet, which incidentally opened the Tivoli Opera House as a motion picture theater. We costumed that. Selig Picture Corporation produced many pictures, outstanding "The Cherry Pickers"; Biograph followed with Wallace Reid's "In Old Heidelberg." The Epoch Producing Company followed with that miracle of the then picture world, "The Birth of a Nation." Triangle produced the "Avenging Heart" and for Miss Lillian Gish, "Broken Blossoms." We costumed all. To the Township of San Rafael came Mitchelina with the "Rose of the Rancho," "Girl of the West," and others. In 1914 we were honored with the contract for all costuming used in that outstanding spectacle, "Intolerance," which in 1916 was followed by Theda Bara in "Cleopatra" and "The Sign of the Red Rose." During that time we costumed the first World War picture, "The Beast of Berlin," quickly followed by "Treason," "The Little American" and "We Are French." The storm of war over, Lasky produced "Carmen" and "Joan of Arc" with Miss Gertrude Ferrar. Then came Milton Sills in that wonderful production "The Sea Hawk." Later pictures which we participated in the costuming of, were "The Spirit of '76," "Richelieu" with George Arliss, "Under the Red Robe," "Marie Antoinette" with Miss Shearer and recently climaxed with assisting in the costuming of "The Hunchback of Notre Dame." These and many more were costumed by Goldstein & Co. Our industry has been advanced, employment benefited until we have arrived in a position of having a stock of costumes second to none in the United States. These costumes have been accumulated for your pleasure and we welcome your patronage. A firm such as ours, we feel, is a credit to a community and motivated with the sincere desire to please, may we, at all times, serve you.

### THE STORY OF "I PAGLIACCI"

Act I: Tonio appears before the curtain in a prologue telling of the performance to come as an actual occurrence. The curtain reveals the townspeople gathered to greet the arrival of the strolling players. The actors parade and Tonio is sharply reproved by Canio, chief of the troupe, for familiarity toward Nedda, Canio's wife. Players and peasants depart for an adjoining inn, leaving Tonio and Nedda after Canio warned that he will avenge any insult involving Nedda's affections. Nedda, who loves another, trembles at his words and sings to conceal her fears. Nedda repulses the advances of Tonio with a whip and he departs, vowing vengeance. Silvio, Nedda's lover, induces her to agree to flight with him. Tonio, overhearing, summons Canio but Silvio escapes unrecognized. Canio demands from Nedda the name of her lover but to no avail. Tonio whispers to Canio that the unknown will surely attend the performance and betray himself.

ACT II. The comedy is about to begin and Nedda as Columbine, collecting money from the crowd, warns Silvio, who is present. Canio, distracted, stumbles through the lines of the play, again demanding from Nedda the name of her lover. She refuses, trying to put him off lightly as in the play. Canio, now beside himself with jealous rage, seizes a knife from the table and stabs Nedda to the heart. Silvio attempts to come to her aid and he, too, is slain by Canio. As the crowd stands horrified, Canio brings the play and the opera to a close with "The comedy is ended."

# THE STORY OF "COPPELIA"

### ACT I

Scene: Street in a Galician Village. Opposite the home of Swanhilda, betrothed to Frantz, is the studio of Coppelius, an eccentric toy maker who makes life-sized automatons. So lifelike is the Doll that sits in Coppelius' window that many of the villagers believe it to be alive. Frantz has become infatuated with the Doll.

As the scene opens Swanhilda comes from her home. She resents the presence of the Doll which has captivated Frantz. When she sees Frantz flirting with the Doll, her suspicions are confirmed and she leaves in anger. Groups of young peasant girls and boys arrive dancing. They have

come to meet the Burgomeister who tells them that tomorrow is a festival day, as the Lord of the Village has made a gift of a clock. Suddenly there is a flash from the studio of Coppelius and everyone draws back in fear.

It is only Coppelius, who is always working mysteriously.

When the Burgomeister reminds Swanhilda that the Lord of the Village will endow all couples who are to be married soon, and that she and Frantz will be among the first, Swanhilda is doubtful. Remembering the Legend of the Blade of Wheat, which supposedly reveals all secrets, she entreats it to tell her the truth. Frantz is unfaithful, is the answer.

Swanhilda's companions console her with a gay dance, in which she finally joins. As night draws on the young people disperse leaving only Swanhilda and her six companions. It is then Coppelius comes from his house, carefully locking the door. The girls plague him until he chases

them in rage. He loses the key to his studio in the melee.

Finding the key, Swanhilda persuades her companions to join her in investigating Coppelius' mysterious house. After they enter the house Frantz steals in with a ladder, intent upon reaching the beautiful creature in the window. But Coppelius' entrance drives him away.

### ACT II

Interior of Coppelius' studio. Swanhilda and her companions look about in evident fear. When they encounter the first of the life-sized automatons that Coppelius has created they draw back in doubt and fear. But it is the mysterious creature in the window that interests Swanhilda. She finally has the courage to draw the curtains which expose the Doll.

Suddenly Coppelius arrives and the girls are terror stricken. They run about in panic, gradually escaping down the staircase. Only Swanhilda

has failed to get away. In desperation she hides behind the Doll.

Frantz arrives, seeking adventure with the marvelous creature in the window. Coppelius binds him before he can unveil the Doll and Frantz explains that only his infatuation for the wonderful creature could have drawn him into the studio.

Coppelius is struck with a thought. At last he has a living creature with whom he can carry out an idea! In a book of sorcery he has read wild tales of taking the heart and mind from a living person and transplanting it into an automaton. He lulls Frantz into sleep with a potent drink.

Meantime, Swanhilda has changed clothes with the Doll and taken its place in the chair. Coppelius does not know this and in the ensuing scenes believes he has accomplished the supernatural with the Doll, his own

creation.

Coppelius, believing that he has succeeded in giving life to one of his automatons, gives her a Spanish shawl and she does a Spanish dance. He suggests a Scotch theme and she obeys. But finally she gets entirely out of hand, chasing Coppelius, until he puts her back in her niche.

But before Swanhilda leaves, she turns over his automatons and raises

great havoc in Coppelius' workshop.

### ACT III

The Festival of the Clock. The Lord of the Village presents a clock as a gift to the villagers which affords them an opportunity for a gala day, to dance and make merry.

Frantz and Swanhilda are reunited and express their new found happiness in a pas de deux which plights their troth. Even Coppelius is made happy by a gift of gold from the Lord to compensate him for the damage done to his beloved automatons.

The peasant girls and boys are promised gifts for their forthcoming nuptials and there is general rejoicing as the curtains close.


