The Story of "Falstaff"

Acr I—Falstaff and his trusty followers, Bardolph and Pistol, are driving their ribald sport with Dr. Caius whom they have just robbed. After the Doctor leaves the fat knight unfolds his latest scheme for making money. He will make love to the two wealthy wives, Mistress Ford and Mistress Page. He asks Bardolph and Pistol to deliver to each an identical note of affection he has written. They balk. Falstaff kicks them out and sends the notes by a page. (Scene 2) Mistress Ford and Mistress Page meet and compare notes. They are identical. With Nanette and Dame Quickly they plan revenge upon Falstaff and depart. Entering with Ford, Dr. Caius and Fenton, Bardolph and Pistol disclose Falstaff's amorous project. They, too, plan revenge. Ford will visit Falstaff in disguise and lure him into a trap. They leave while Fenton and Nanette enjoy a love scene which is soon interrupted by the returning women.

Act II-Dame Quickly delivers to Falstaff a note from Mistress Ford making an appointment for the afternoon. The fat knight is overjoyed. Ford is announced under the name of Brook. He pretends to love Mistress Ford and offers Falstaff a fee if he will aid him in his hopeless quest. Falstaff agrees and discloses that he has a rendezvous with the lady that very afternoon. This astounds Ford who now believes that his wife is deceiving him after all. Falstaff leaves to don his best attire for the adventure of the afternoon. (Scene 2) Dame Quickly tells the women of her visit to Falstaff and that he soon will arrive. Perceiving him coming they retire. Falstaff enters and immediately begins making violent love to Mistress Ford. Mistress Quickly rushes in crying that Ford is coming on the hunt for his wife's lover. Falstaff hides behind a screen as Ford and his friends arrive. Ford searches a basket of dirty linen which the women had provided for the occasion but finds nothing. During his search of other parts of the house Falstaff is hidden in the basket. Fenton and Nanette take advantage of the screen for a little love-making. Ford returns and, hearing a kiss from behind the screen. thinks he has Falstaff. Disgusted at his error he continues his search while Mistress Ford commands the servants to carry the basket of linen with the now almost suffocating Falstaff to the window and dump its contents into the river.

Acr III—Dame Quickly comes to express Mistress Ford's sorrow at the occurrence of the day before and to make a new appointment in Windsor Park for the night. Sir John falls into the trap. Ford is taken into the secret this time. Dame Quickly overhears Ford promising Dr. Caius to let him have Nanette as his wife immediately and runs to warn the lovers. (Scene 2) Fenton and Nanette arrive and pledge their vows anew. Mistress Ford meets Falstaff and he again begins making mad love. The men, disguised as elfs and nymphs bear down on him and beat him unmercifully. Ford, satisfied with his vengeance on Falstaff, consents to the wedding of Nanette and Fenton, to the happiness of all.



The Story of "La Traviata"

Acr I—A party is in progress in the salon of Violetta's home, and Alfredo, who has come with friends, succumbs to the charms and beauty of the hostess. The guests retire to an adjoining room to dance, but Violetta, who is suffering from the early stages of consumption, is prevented from joining them by a severe coughing-spell, and remains on the lounge to recover. Alfredo remains with her, expressing first his solicitation and then his love, which deeply touches Violetta. Later, when the guests have departed, Violetta contemplates this great new love which has come to her.

Acr II—Violetta has deserted her former life and friends, and is living most happily with Alfredo in a small country house near Paris to which they have retired. Alfredo, upon learning from Annina that Violetta has quietly been selling her jewelry to aid in defraying expenses, departs for Paris to get money with which to repay her. Alfredo's father (Germont) arrives and succeeds in persuading Violetta that she must give up Alfredo and their happiness, not only because Alfredo's own career is threatened by this liaison, but also because its continuance will jeopardize the marriage of Alfredo's sister, for whom the father also pleads. As Germont departs, Violetta writes a note of farewell to Alfredo, but he returns before she finishes. She hides the letter and conceals her real feelings. When Alfredo tells her he has heard his father is to visit them. she departs on the pretext of leaving them alone, but sends the letter back by messenger. When Germont arrives he finds his son in despair. and vainly attempts to stir him by recalling memories of his home in "fair Provence."

Acr III—Alfredo returns to Paris seeking Violetta and finds her with her new companion, Baron Douphol, at a ball being held at the palace of her friend Flora. Alfredo, winning heavily at the gaming-table, challenges the Baron to a game and adds further to his winnings. When the guests retire for supper, Violetta returns, followed at her request by Alfredo, whom she implores to leave, fearful of the prospect of a duel between the two men. Alfredo bitterly charges her with falseness, which, remembering her promise to Germont, she does not deny. Alfredo summons the guests and before them all denounces her, throwing at her feet his winnings of the evening. As Violetta faints, Germont arrives seeking his son. He alone knows the tragic significance of the scene, but for the sake of his son and daughter cannot disclose it.

Acr IV—Violetta is now confined to her bed by the ravages of the disease from which she has suffered, and, although the doctor attempts to cheer and reassure her, she knows she has not long to live. She is cheered by a letter from Germont, who would seek to undo the damage he has done, and writes that Alfredo is returning to seek her pardon. But she feels it will be too late. Alfredo arrives, and in the great happiness of the moment they plan to leave Paris; but the excitement proves too much, and, as Germont and the doctor arrive, Violetta collapses in her lover's arms.






