The Story of "The Portuguese Inn"

Gabriela has fled her home accompanied by her faithful servant, Ines, in order to be reunited with her lover, Carlos, and at the same time to escape the amorous attentions of her guardian, Roselbo. They stop at Rodrigo's Inn. Rodrigo, who is fascinated by intrigue, is suspicious of their secretive behaviour. He believes his two guests to be the wife of a Spanish governor and her servant who are known to have crossed the frontier to escape a political uprising. He determines to protect them at all costs. As prearranged, Carlos arrives with his servant, Pedrillo. Mistaking them for secret agents in pursuit of the two Spanish ladies, Rodrigo sidetracks them. Now Roselbo arrives at the Inn. Rodrigo confides to him that two ladies of high society, involved in a Spanish political affair, are hiding out at the Inn, and that he intends to protect them. When Roselbo suggests that they be taken to Lisbon and safety, Rodrigo is convinced he has proved himself a master detective. When he introduces the two ladies to Roselbo, Gabriela and Ines are thereupon thrown into despair. Unaware of the true situation, Rodrigo begins to doubt his ability as a detective. Carlos returns with a Royal Decree annulling the will of Gabriela's father which had made Roselbo her guardian. Everything turns out well, for Roselbo leaves in a rage and Rodrigo is the laughingstock of the group.

The Portuguese Inn, opera-buffa in one act by Luigi Cherubini (1760-1842) and edited and adpated by Giulio Confalonieri, is being given its American premiere performances by the San Francisco Opera Association this season. Although such a place was actually unknown to him, the faintly exotic atmosphere of this mid-seventeenth century Portuguese inn, and the rollicking events taking place there, are described by Cherubini with a melodic grace, orchestral vigour, and psychological rightness uncommon in operas of his time. The stage settings of the present production are designed in terms of the Italian commedia dell'arte and make no claim to reality. In like manner, the characters come to us out of commedia dell'arte. They do not wear their masks, as they did in the stylized and fantastical sixteenth and seventeenth century Italian stage; but Pantalone is here as the pompous guardian Roselbo, Arlequino appears in the guise of the resourceful Carlos, and Ducinella lives again in Gabriela. Without their conventional costumes and masks these three personalities, found again in Bartolo, Figaro, and Rosina of Rossini's "Il Barbiere di Siviglia," move throughout the history of musical and spoken theatre. Despite their familiarity they appear always fresh by virtue of the situations in which they find themselves.

The Story of "Salome"

Jochanaan, the Prophet, has been imprisoned by Herod because of his teachings. But fearing the Jews, Herod will not put him to death. Narraboth, who is madly infatuated with the beautiful and sensuous Salome, and his soldiers guard the entrance to a banquet hall where revel reigns. Salome, tired of the banquet and the sensuous advances of Herod, comes onto the terrace. She hears Jochanaan's voice coming from the cistern in which he is held prisoner and demands that he be brought out. Unable to resist her cajoling, Narraboth complies. Jochanaan begins a terrible denunciation of Herodias. Salome falls wildly in love with him and gives vent to her infatuation in abandoned song. Denouncing her, Jochanaan descends into the cistern and Narraboth, crazed by what he has witnessed, kills himself. Herod, Herodias and the entire court come onto the terrace. The warning voice of the Prophet is heard from the cistern. Herodias urges the king to order his execution but Herod, still fearing the Jews, refuses. Herod then commands Salome to dance for him but she refuses unless he grants her any wish. At his promise, Salome begins the Dance of the Veils and at the urging of Herodias claims the head of Jochanaan for her reward. The horrified Herod begs release from his promise but Salome will not be dissuaded. A headsman descends into the cistern and comes up with the dripping head of Jochanaan on a platter. Salome receives the head from the executioner, embracing it with reckless passion. But when she kisses the lifeless lips, Herod can stand no more and at his command the guards crush the ghoulish princess to death under their shields.
