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Acr I—The Egyptian king, learning of the approaching Ethiopian invasion to be led by King Amonasro, selects Rhadames to command the defending Egyptian forces. This choice pleases Princess Amneris, for victory would make Rhadames, whom she loves, a desirable mate for her. However, she correctly perceives that her Ethiopian slave girl, Aida (unknown to the Egyptians, Amonasro's daughter) is her rival for Rhadames' affections. Knowing that her father and lover will have to oppose each other on the battlefield, Aida is apprehensive as the warrior is escorted to the temple to receive his command. (Scene 2) In the recesses of the temple of Vulcan, Rhadames receives the sacred sword and is dedicated to the protection of Egypt.

Acr II—Amneris joins her slave girls in singing the praises of the victorious Rhadames, and as Aida approaches, she deftly gains from her the confession of her love for him. Then admitting her own love for the warrior, Amneris commands that Aida shall witness Rhadames' obedience to herself on his triumphant return. (Scene 2) Rhadames is royally welcomed upon his return with the conquered Ethiopians. Among the captives is the disguised Amonasro, soon recognized by Aida. Signaling her not to betray his rank, he acknowledges her as his daughter and tells how the king, wounded, had died at his feet. Rhadames, as his reward for victory, requests the freedom of the Ethiopians. His wish is granted, but Amonasro and Aida are retained as hostages. The king then gives Rhadames, as his supreme reward, the hand of Amneris.

Acr III—Amneris goes to the temple on the eve of her marriage to Rhadames. Aida following, is met by Amonasro who forces her to aid him in a plot against the Egyptians. He conceals himself, and when Rhadames appears, Aida begs her lover to flee with her. In planning their flight, Rhadames unwittingly discloses his army's movements, and is overheard by Amonasro. Amneris concealed among the palms has also overheard, and enraged rushes out to denounce Rhadames. Amonasro and Aida escape as the warrior surrenders himself as a traitor.

Acr IV—Amneris sends for Rhadames offering to save him in return for his love. Enraged when he refuses, she invokes the wrath of the gods on him as he is led away to be sentenced. Hearing the trial as it is conducted behind the scenes, the now remorseful Amneris wildly curses the Priests as they condemn Rhadames to death. (Scene 2) Rhadames entering the tomb, discovers Aida, who has concealed herself there so that they may both die together.




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#### The Story of "Carmen"

Acr I—Coming on duty, Don José learns that in his absence Micaela, his fiancée, has paid him a visit. As he sits thinking of her, cigarette girls stream out from a nearby factory, among them the gypsy, Carmen. Attracted by Don José's indifference she sings directly to him and to his bewilderment throws him a rose. Later the gypsy is arrested for stabbing a rival factory girl and is placed in Don José's care. Exercising her charm on the young sergeant, she persuades him to allow her to escape and invites him to meet her later at the Tavern of Lillas Pastia.

Act II—Don José, having served a prison term for aiding Carmen, is now at liberty. With a group of gypsy friends Carmen awaits him at a tavern. While there the great bull-fighter, Escamillo, enters and tries to win her favor. Smugglers persuade her companions to join them at their mountain retreat. Carmen, awaiting Don José, refuses to leave. Upon his arrival she tries to persuade him to flee with her to the mountains. Despite her charms Don José is about to return to duty when his officer appears, ordering him back to line. Resentfully José defies the captain and escapes to the smugglers' camp with Carmen.

Acr III—Don José, unhappy in the life of a bandit and aware that Carmen is tiring of him, threatens to kill her if she abandons him. She answers, "Death comes as Fate decrees," and reading the cards predicts that she and her lover will die. Two visitors arrive: Escamillo to see Carmen, and Micaela with a message from Don José's dying mother. Jealous, Don José attempts to kill Escamillo but fails when Carmen protects the toreador. Micaela implores Don José to go to his mother and they leave together. Acr IV—Carmen, now Escamillo's mistress, comes to the arena with him. There she learns that Don José is searching for her and she agrees to see him. He pleads with her to be kind to him but Carmen scornfully repulses him and, enraged, he stabs her.
