The Story of "Lohengrin"

Act I—King Henry, come to enlist the aid of the nobles against invading Huns, finds Brabant in chaos. Telramund, appointed as Elsa and Gottfried's guardian by the dying Duke of Brabant, has accused Elsa of fratricide in the mysterious disappearance of her brother. Telramund, breaking his betrothal to her, has married Ortrud and now claims the throne of Brabant. Elsa, summoned by the King to defend herself, affirms her innocence and tells of a visionary knight who will champion her. Three trumpet calls summon Lohengrin who offers himself as her champion and husband, providing she will never ask his name. Elsa agrees and the knight fells Telramund.

Act II—Upbraided by Telramund for their downfall, Ortrud plots to gain reinstatement by undermining Elsa's faith in Lohengrin. Feigning repentence she goes to Elsa and succeeds in arousing the girl's suspicions. The wedding plans proceed, however, and as Elsa prepares to enter the chapel, Ortrud reappears claiming priority over the bride-elect of a nameless knight. Telramund, too, joins in accusing the knight of sorcery, but to no avail; the wedding procession continues and Elsa and Lohengrin are united.

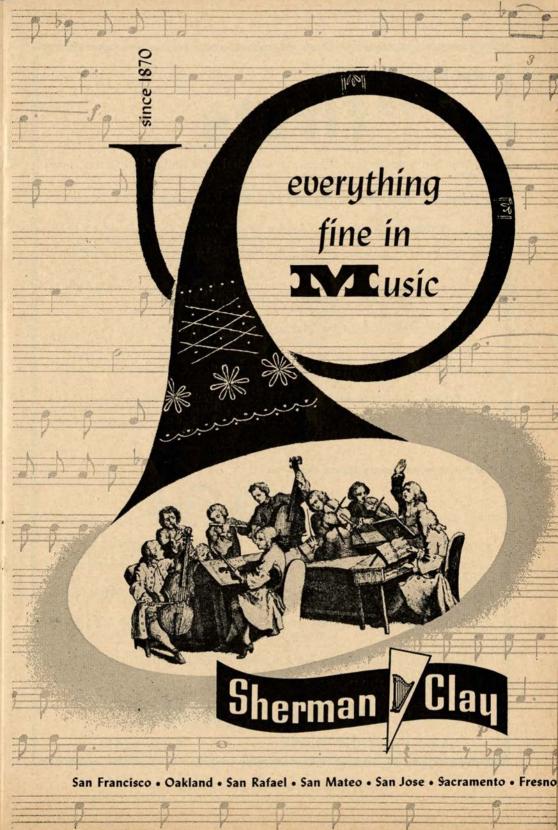
Act III—Arriving at the bridal chamber, Elsa, no longer able to withhold her doubts, demands that Lohengrin reveal his identity. At that moment, Telramund enters with four followers, intending to kill Lohengrin but is slain by him instead. Placing Elsa in the care of her ladies, Lohengrin departs for the Oak of Justice to vindicate himself. (Scene 2) Lohengrin, exonerated by the King, is compelled by Elsa's request to reveal his secret. He then discloses himself as the son of Parsifal, Knight of the Holy Grail, and announces that he must return to its guardianship. In parting, Lohengrin reunites Elsa and her brother, but grief-stricken over the loss of her husband, she falls prostrate.

The Story of "Le Coq D'Or"

Acr I—The fairy tale is recounted by the Astrologer. In an ancient court an aged King unhappily bemoans the fate of his armies under attack from all sides. To King Dodon's aid comes the Astrologer bearing a magic Golden Cockerel with the power to warn his possessor whenever danger threatens. Joyfully accepting the gift, the King promises the Astrologer his first spoken wish and mounting the Golden Cockerel on a spire he prepares to enjoy the pleasure of his court. Soon, however, the Cockerel's warning rouses the court and King Dodon's sons lead their troops to battle. Learning of their defeat, the King himself leaves to command his forces.

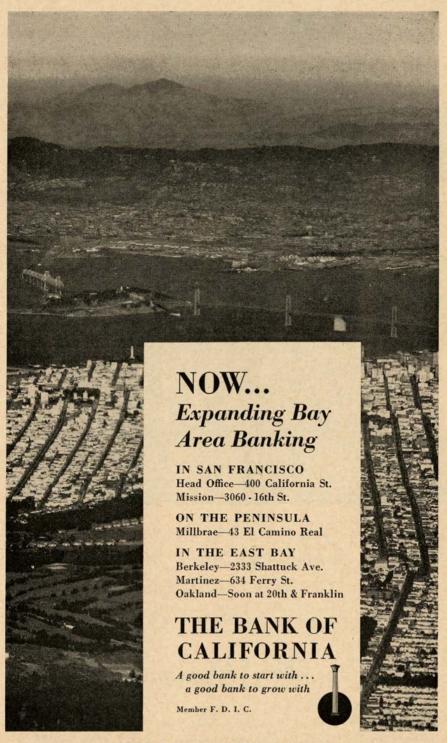
Act II—The King, forced to retreat to a narrow mountain pass, finds the two dead princes there and mourns them. Then the lifting mist reveals a large tent from which a beautiful Queen emerges. Enchanted by her and seeking to win her favor he performs before her, and then asks her to share his throne. Mockingly she accepts his offer and the two leave for his city in a golden carriage.

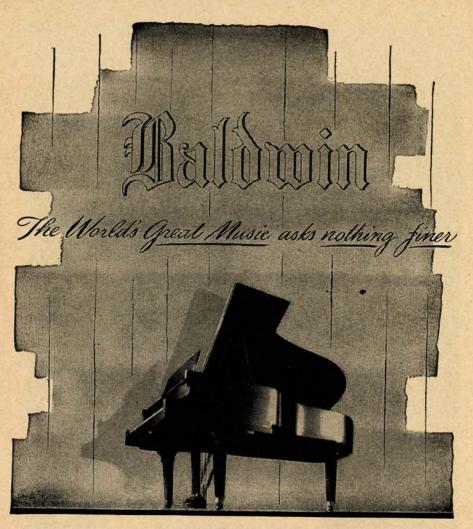
Act III—In the courtyard of the King's palace his subjects await his return with the Queen, but are fearful of an ominous cloud on the horizon. As the King and Queen arrive in the midst of the cheering throng, the Astrologer approaches. He requests, as his price for the Golden Cockerel, the Queen's hand in marriage. Enraged, the King kills the Astrologer and furiously the Queen foretells King Dodon's death. The Golden Cockerel, leaving its perch, flies down and pecks the King to death. The dark cloud now covers the sun. When it has passed the Queen and the Golden Cockerel are gone, leaving the people to mourn their dead King.

The Story of "I Pagliacci"

Act I—Tonio, appearing in the prologue, tells that the performance to come portrays an actual occurrence. A member of Canio's group of strolling players, Tonio is aware that Canio suspects his wife, Nedda, of infidelity. Despite Canio's vows to avenge any insult involving Nedda's affections, Tonio approaches her. When she repulses him, he plots revenge. Nedda, fearing that Canio has discovered her love for Silvio, plans to escape with him that evening but Tonio, overhearing her, tells Canio. The jealous husband demands to know the name of her lover but to no avail, and Tonio suggests that he may reveal his identity at the evening performance.

Acr II—Silvio, attending the comedy, is warned by Nedda before she takes her place on stage. There the distracted Canio, stumbling through his lines, again demands the name of Nedda's lover. When she refuses, attempting to put him off lightly as in the play, he seizes a knife and stabs her. Silvio, in an effort to save her, is also slain by Canio who then closes the play and opera with "The comedy is ended."
