Falstaff

Acr I—(1) At an inn after a drinking bout in which he manages to fleece Dr. Caius, Falstaff tells his followers, Bardolfo and Pistola of two new conquests he hopes to make—Mrs. Ford and Mrs. Page. He asks his companions to deliver identical love notes to the ladies, and when they refuse he chases them out and sends the messages by a page. (2) Comparing notes, the matrons with Nanetta and Dame Quickly plan revenge on Falstaff. Entering with Ford, Dr. Caius and Fenton, Bardolfo and Pistola disclose Falstaff's amorous project, and the men too plan revenge in which the disguised Ford will lure Falstaff into a trap. They leave while Fenton and Nanetta enjoy a brief love scene, soon interrupted by the returning women.

Acr II—(1) Dame Quickly delivers a note to Falstaff from Alice Ford making an appointment for that afternoon. She leaves as the disguised Ford arrives. Calling himself Brook he asks Falstaff's aid in what he pretends is a hopeless romance with Mrs. Ford. Falstaff agrees to help revealing his afternoon rendezvous with her. This astonishes Ford who now fears she is deceiving him. (2) Warned by Quickly of Falstaff's imminent arrival the women retire leaving Alice to greet him. He immediately begins to make violent love to her, but is interrupted by Dame Quickly who announces that Ford has returned and is searching for his wife's lover. Falstaff is successfully hidden first behind a screen and then in a basket of dirty linen. Ford, certain he has surprised Falstaff behind the screen is dismayed to find only Nanetta and Fenton. Disgusted at his error he continues his search as Mrs. Ford orders the basket containing Falstaff to be dumped into the river.

Acr III—(1) Falstaff accepting a new engagement to meet Mrs. Ford at Windsor Park the next evening is unknowingly involved in another plot—one of which Ford is also aware. Dame Quickly returning with his acceptance overhears Ford promising Nanetta's hand to Dr. Caius. She tells Mrs. Ford who immediately warns the young lovers. (2) Arriving in the wood, Fenton and Nanetta re-avow their love. Now the others arrive disguised as elves and nymphs and secrete themselves awaiting Falstaff. He enters and has a moment alone with Alice before they descend on him and trounce him. All is done in a jestful manner, and Ford now satisfied with this revenge finally agrees to let Nanetta marry Fenton.


Francesca da Rimini

Act I—For reasons of State, Francesca of Polenta and Giovanni of Malatesta are betrothed. However, the families fearing that she would refuse to marry the lame and deformed Giovanni, lead her to believe that her fiance is the handsome Paolo. 

Boris Godounoff

Note: During the reign of Feodor, son of Ivan the Terrible, the all-powerful regent Boris Godounoff plots ambitiously to usurp the throne and craftily causes the death of Dimitri second son of Ivan. Upon Feodor's death, Boris feigning disinterest in the throne goes into seclusion in a monastery near Moscow, but secretly orders the police to force the populace of Moscow to beg him to assume their leadership.

ACT I, SCENE 1—Outside the monastery the multitudes fearful of the police urge Boris to declare himself Czar. As he pretends inflexibility a group of pilgrims enter and join in the supplication. Scene 2—Boris accepts the crown and is acclaimed by the populace. Scene 3—The aged monk Pimenn relates the story of Dimitri's murder to the novice Griorgi who determines to impersonate the slain youth and claim the throne. Scene 4—The false Dimitri with two accomplices narrowly escapes arrest at an Inn when soldiers suspecting his real identity try to apprehend him. Scene 5—Xenia and Feodor, children of Boris, are joined by their father who tries to comfort the grieving girl over the loss of her betrothed. Now, having attained power, he is beset with fears, which he voices when he is left alone by his children. At that point Prince Schouisky arrives bearing news of the uprising in Poland in behalf of the false Dimitri, and Boris overcome is again prey to remorse.

ACT II, SCENE 1—Incited by the Jesuit priest Rangoni, Marina resolves to further her own selfish ambition to become Czarina by supporting Grigori in his attempts to overthrow Boris. Scene 2—Grigori, in love with Marina is entertained at her castle, where she persuades him to lead the Polish uprising against Boris.

ACT III—SCENE 1—The people are in open revolt against Boris, as the usurper Dimitri and his troops pass by en route to Moscow. Acclaiming him their lawful Czar, the masses follow him, leaving only the village idiot who laments the fate of Russia. Scene 2—The Duma of Boyars gathered to decide Dimitri's punishment is joined by Boris, haggard from the terrible visions which haunt him. Shouisky asks the Czar to grant an audience to Pimenn, who entering relates a miracle which occurred at Dimitri's tomb . . . that of a blind shepherd whose vision was restored as he knelt in prayer at the grave. A cry of anguish from the fainting Boris interrupts the old monk. Regaining consciousness the dying Czar calls for Feodor, his successor. He commands him to rule wisely and gasping for breath Boris succumbs.


New productions highlight San Francisco Opera activities this week. Rimsky-Korsakoff's colorful version of Moussorgsky's "Boris Godounoff," premiered earlier this week, will be repeated on Saturday evening, September 29.

Zandonai's "Francesca da Rimini," a work popular in Europe since its composition in 1914 and unperformed in the U.S. for forty years, will receive its Western Premiere on Friday, September 28 and repeated Thursday, October 4.

Triple interest hinges on this season's "Boris." Famed Bulgarian basso Boris Christoff sings the title role, the opera is sung in the original Russian language; and it introduces a revolutionary new staging with spectacular settings by designer Leo Kerz. Stage director Paul Hager provided invaluable collaboration.

An interesting vocal sidelight is the amazing proficiency in Russian achieved by the San Francisco Opera Chorus. It was accomplished through a system of phonetic transliteration devised by a well-known Bay Area musician Mme. Seraphima Strelova who also coached the Chorus in this important phase of the production.

"Francesca," another Kerz-designed opera, introduces a beautiful young Turkish soprano, Leyla Gencer, to the San Francisco Opera roster. Miss Gencer has appeared successfully with major companies abroad and is a member of the Ankara State Opera. She is the first Turkish singer to receive a major operatic assignment in this country. Her colleagues are—three gifted young artists—tenor Richard Martell who is American-born and comes to us via Europe's top opera houses; Oakland's Cesare Curzi, a veteran of several seasons here who has recently been acclaimed in Germany and in Israel; and one of Italy's foremost baritones, Anselmo Colzani.
