
Acr I—Don Alfonso, the elderly cynic, discussing the constancy of women with Ferrando and Guglielmo, involves them in a wager to test the virtue of their respective fiancées Dorabella and Fiordiligi. Setting the plot in motion, Don Alfonso visits the girls at their seaside garden, telling them the men have been ordered to the front, and soon the young officers enter to bid the girls a sad farewell.

The pert maid Despina cynically advises the lamenting ladies to console themselves with other suitors, and in disgust Dorabella and Fiordiligi depart. This gives Don Alfonso an opportunity to enlist Despina as an ally in his attempt to win the wager, and the two plot to introduce Ferrando and Guglielmo disguised as Albanians to the unsuspecting girls. The ladies, however, are unreceptive to their new suitors and leave in high dudgeon, much to the delight of the men who are now confident of winning the wager.

The grief-stricken sisters alone in their garden are again interrupted by the Albanians, who rejected have apparently taken poison. Moved by such obvious devotion, Dorabella and Fiordiligi relent a bit as Don Alfonso and Despina run for a doctor. Despina returns dressed as a doctor and with a giant magnet restores the two men to health.

Acr II—Despina's urgings persuade the ladies to amuse themselves with the Albanians. The two men with a band of musicians serenade the girls, and Guglielmo encouraged by Despina and Don Alfonso earnestly woos Dorabella and gives her a pendant. Ferrando has less success with Fiordiligi, but upon his departure she confesses that his wooing has moved her. Comparing notes, Guglielmo is reassured, but Ferrando is distressed when he is confronted with his own miniature secured from Dorabella. On their terrace, Dorabella and Fiordiligi admit to having followed Despina's advice, but Fiordiligi full of misgivings insists they must don uniforms and join their fiances at the front. As she contemplates Gugliel mo's sword, Ferrando rushes in threatening to kill himself with it unless she vows her love. Fiordiligi yields as Don Alfonso calms the irate Guglielmo.

Don Alfonso and Despina prepare the hall for a double wedding. The couples are about to have their marriages legalized by a notary (the disguised Despina), when the officers are announced. Panic-stricken the girls push their Albanian lovers into another room, and greet Ferrando and Guglielmo who reappear in uniform. The men reveal their disguise to Dorabella and Fiordiligi and accept their apologies. With everything forgiven, the lovers are re-united and all join in a philosophic finale.





"The Elixir of Love" (Donizetti)

Simon Boccanegra

NOTE—In fourteenth-century Genoa both patricians and plebians are in constant strife, and the commoner, Simon Boccanegra having achieved far-reaching fame is on the brink of political triumph. However, he is denied recognition by the patrician, Fiesco, whose daughter, Maria, loves Simon and has borne him a child.

Act I—Plebian leaders, Paolo and Pietro plan to raise Simon to the Doge's throne in return for certain favors. Simon agrees knowing that Fiesco will then be unable to prevent his marriage to Maria. The two meet and Fiesco demands custody of the child as the price of friendship. Simon cannot comply as the girl has disappeared, and the two men part enemies. Boccanegra entering the palace finds Maria dead.

Acr II—Twenty-five years have elapsed. Fiesco, after Simon's rise to power has obtained anonymity by assuming the name of Andrea. Living in his care under the name of Amelia Grimaldi, her real identity unknown, is Simon's lost daughter. Plotting to overthrow Simon, Fiesco is aided by Gabriele Adorno, whom Amelia loves. Paolo also desires her, and Simon while at her castle to plead his courtier's cause discovers her true identity. He reveals himself as her father and learning that she loves Adorno refuses to look favorably upon Paolo, who then has her abducted.

Act III—Adorno, accused of killing Lorenzini, in whose home the abducted Amelia was found, is brought before the Doge. Paolo fearful of discovery tries to leave but the doors are guarded. Certain that Simon has masterminded the plot, Adorno tries to kill him, but Amelia intervenes. The Doge suspecting Paolo's treachery demands that he join him in a curse upon the abductor—an order Paolo cannot refuse.

ACT IV, Scene 1—The revengeful Paolo pours poison into the Doge's cup, and to make death certain tries to persuade Fiesco to kill him. When he refuses, Paolo tells Adorno that Amelia is now Simon's mistress. Adorno jealously confronts her, but Amelia denies the accusation and at Simon's approach she hides Adorno and pleads for his life. Simon agrees and left alone drinks from the poisoned cup. Adorno reveals himself and is about to kill the Doge when Amelia returns and tells him that Simon is her father. The repentant Adorno then vows loyalty to Simon and promises to help end the political rebellion. Scene 2—The uprising is quelled, and Paolo, captured in the ranks, although condemned to death triumphantly confesses to Fiesco that he has poisoned the Doge. Fiesco is aghast, even more so, when the dying Simon reveals Amelia's true identity. At that point the young couple and their bridal attendants enter, and the dying Simon summons his final strength to give them his blessing, and to confer the Doge's crown upon Adorno.
