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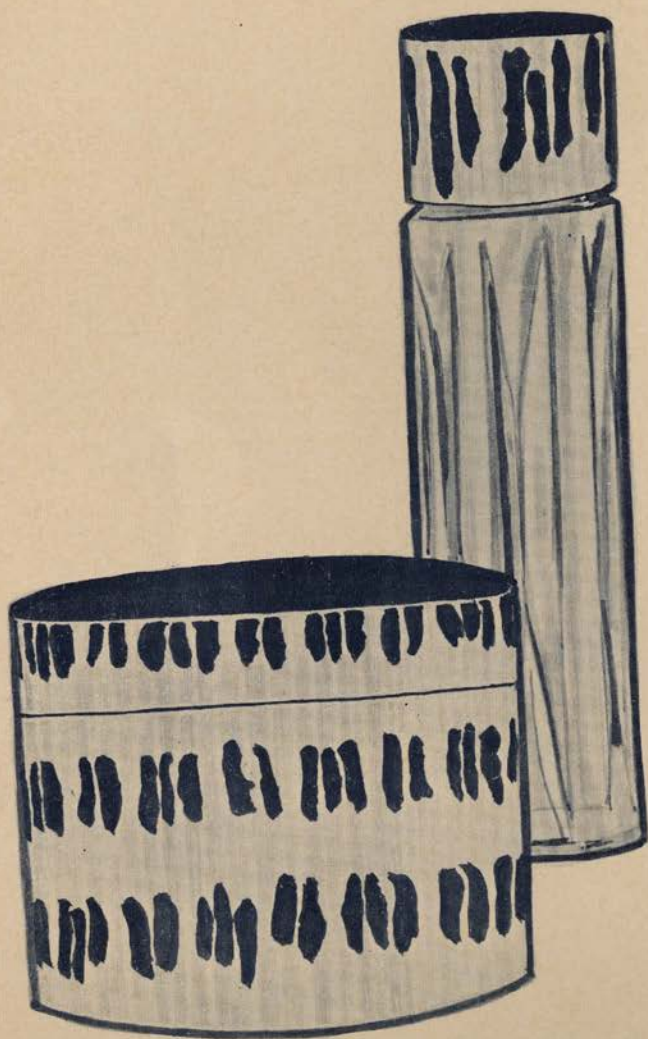

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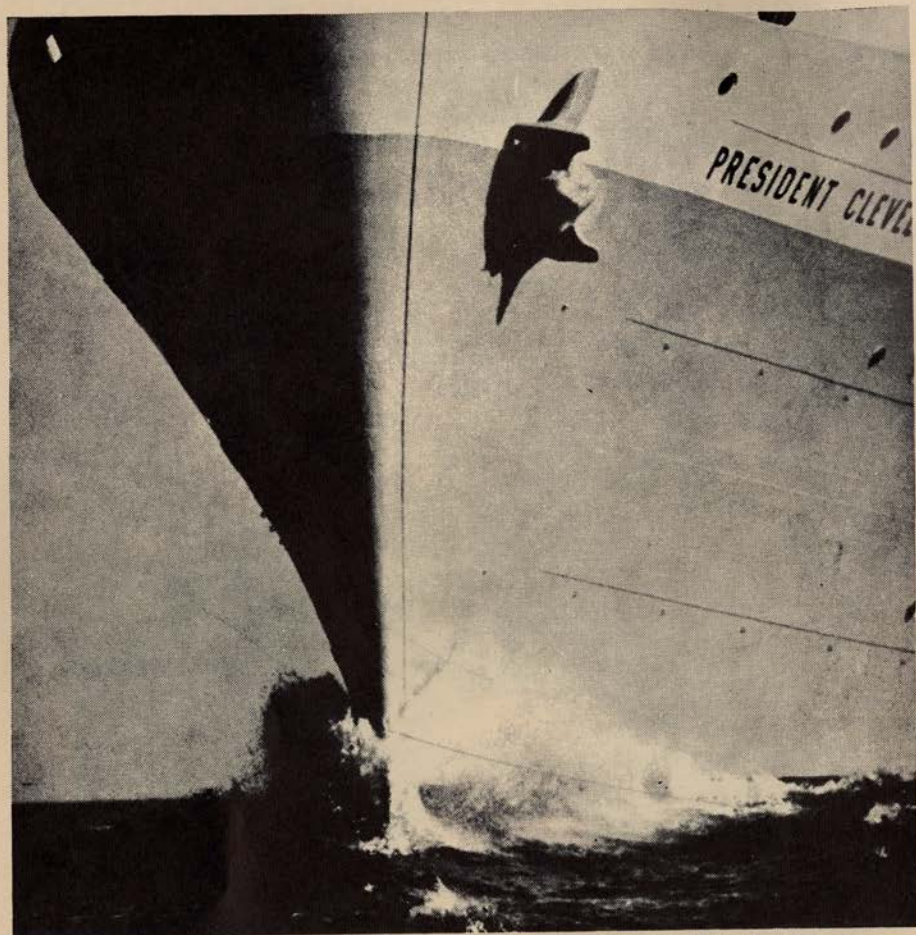
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### **KURT BOEHME**

Baron Ochs, the role of his debut this Thursday night, is one in which Boehme has been praised the world-over and which he recorded earlier this year for Decca. He has also recorded the complete "Don Giovanni", "Der Freischutz", "The Magic Flute", and "Das Rheingold".

Boehme, who holds the title of Kammermaenger (Court Singer) has been a member of the Munich Opera since 1949, and since 1955 has belonged to the Vienna Staatsoper. Guest engagements have taken him to possibly every important opera house in the world, including Bayreuth, the Metropolitan, Covent Garden, La Scala, Salzburg, Teatro Colon, the Paris Opera, Monte Carlo, etc.

In San Francisco Boehme will also be heard as King Henry in the revival of "Lohengrin" this season.



### **THOMAS CAPERELLO**

Brought to the attention of the Company through the 1960 San Francisco Opera Debut Auditions, young Caperello is a native of Sunnyvale, California. He attended San Jose state college and has already mastered such leading operatic roles as the Duke in "Rigoletto" and Tamino in "The Magic Flute".





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## **GWEN CURATILO**

An alumna of the San Francisco Opera Debut Auditions, Miss Curatilo has also participated in the Merola Memorial Fund Training Program for young singers. She appeared this spring as Magda Sorel in the San Francisco Conservatory of Music's acclaimed production of "The Consul".



## **SANDOR KONYA**

Born in Hungary, tenor Konya makes his American debut with the San Francisco Opera as the latest in a long series of brilliant importations by the Company. In Europe he has been compared by critics to the immortal Gigli and has displayed an amazing versatility that has taken him from Bayreuth to La Scala.

At the former, he has sung "Lohengrin" for the past three summers, and at the latter he made his debut only this spring performing in "Aida" and "Parsifal". Konya's musical instruction began at the Liszt Academy in Budapest and after the war he continued his studies in both Italy and Germany.

He has appeared at the Rome Opera, and in Turin, Palermo, and Catania, and this summer sung in "La Boheme", "Ariadne auf Naxos", and "Ballo in Maschera" at the Munich festival. Just before his arrival in America, Konya was heard as Pinkerton in a new production of "Madama Butterfly" in Berlin.



## **ORVA HOSKINSON**

Active with many bay area groups, tenor Hoskinson has sung with the Company of the Golden Hind, the University of California, and other groups in such operas as "Fidelio", "The Marriage of Figaro", "Albert Herring", "Cosi fan Tutte" and "Gianni Schicchi". He has been a soloist with the Stanford and Honolulu symphonies.





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*The San Francisco Opera* and the San Francisco Museum of Art are currently jointly sponsoring an exhibition of original scenic and costume designs executed by noted artists for some of the company's new productions of recent years.

The exhibit is in the museum's headquarters on the fourth floor of the Veterans' building, adjoining the opera house, and will be on display through October 16. It is open free of charge to the public.

Included are designs for this year's new "Wozzeck", which will introduce the famed European artist Leni Bauer-Ecsy to America, and for "La Sonnambula" which will mark the first work done in San Francisco by the noted Hungarian-born designer and teacher, Elemer Nagy.

Also in the exhibition is the work created by George Jenkins for "Cosi fan Tutte", Jean-Pierre Ponnelle for "Die Frau ohne Schatten", and Howard Bay for "Carmen". These are all new productions created within the last five years under the Company's policy of constantly refurbishing the standard repertoire as well as introducing new works to Western audiences. "Carmen" was a gift from the San Francisco Opera Guild during 1959.

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# MASTER OF THE WARDROBE

"This Company is like my child" explained wardrobe master Alexander Agnini the other day—and few others can make that claim with more justification, for Agnini has worked in every performance the San Francisco Opera has given since the Company's founding in 1923.

The short, stocky man who has personally dressed just about every male singer of the last five decades first displayed an interest in his work at the tender age of 12. In his native Naples, his father took him to hear a performance of "Rigoletto."

"And what a performance it was," recalls Alex, "—the tenor was Boncil But when we came out my father asked me how I liked it and my reply was that there had been beautiful costumes!"

"After that, I would save soldi (Italian pennies) and buy second-hand books on costuming." But the Agnini parents wanted Alex to be a monk and he was sent to a seminary for his studies.

Even here his unique interest was recognized and he was put in charge of the vestments—a chore that was to bear fruit later when he was able to advise his brother, stage director Armando Agnini, on the proper garments to be used in the first act of "Tosca."

After three years the seminary studies were abandoned and, following a stint in the Italian army, young Agnini joined his parents, six sisters and two brothers in America. The sisters did piece-work embroidering at home and since his lack of English prevented him from getting a job elsewhere, Alex helped them out.

Then, through his brother, he had a chance to go to Ravinia (near Chicago) for the summer opera season there, and a career was launched. The Ravinia costumes were rented from the Metropolitan and when Edward Ziegler, then business manager of the Met visited Ravinia and saw Agnini at work, he invited him to New York.

For 11 years Agnini worked at the Metropolitan and he was with Ravinia for 13 seasons. But the real love of his life is the San Francisco Opera.

And this despite the fact that he admits he showed up for the Company's first performance "drunk like a devil." It was in 1923 and the opera was "La Boheme." Alex had just arrived in San Francisco and laid out the costumes for the evening performance, when a stagehand invited him out to dinner. After dinner they went to "meet some Italian friends" who had some Italian wine which everyone drank in a flurry of homesickness for the old country.

"I arrived at the theater after the end of the second act," Alex reminisces now, "and when I said to Didur, the bass, 'come, it's time to dress' he replied 'better that you should go to sleep' but I stayed!"

And except for those two first acts, Agnini has never missed a single performance ever given by the Company. "Once," he explained, "I was sick during

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a dress rehearsal of "Tannhauser" and Maestro Merola told me to go home, but when I saw how bad the costuming was going I stayed."

In all this time, the favorite Agnini performance was a "Lucia" done in the Civic Auditorium before the opera house was built. So many people were there that one newspaper compared it to pouring a gallon of water into a quart bottle. Gigli was the tenor and, just before the performance he was told of his mother's death. As a result he poured out all his grief in his last-act aria in an incomparable way.

But Agnini also has fond memories of another tenor—the first soloist he ever dressed at the Met—Enrico Caruso. The two were both natives of Naples and Caruso would refer to Agnini as "scugnizzo" (little urchin).

One Christmas Eve when the great tenor was singing he came into the dressing room with his hands in his pockets and asked Alex, "how many of these do you want?" Thinking it was candy, Alex mentally counted his family members and said ten. And he was rewarded with ten gold pieces worth \$100!

By nature the most amiable of men, Agnini seldom has temperament problems with his singers.

"Many times they make me so mad," he says, "but then I just put my hands around their necks when I'm dressing them and say 'my, what a wonderful throat to produce such a magnificent voice' and I apply a little pressure and pretty soon they get the idea."

Probably the most terrible evening of his life was in Los Angeles a few years ago when the Company was to open with "Tristan und Isolde" with Lauritz Melchior. At 4:00 p.m. it was discovered that the costumes for the entire cast had been left behind in San Francisco. So Alex quickly dashed into a cab and went to a local costume house where he picked up an entire wardrobe in half an hour flat.

But Melchior was very particular about wearing his own costume and he asked that Agnini drive out to his home in Beverly Hills to show him the newly-rented one.

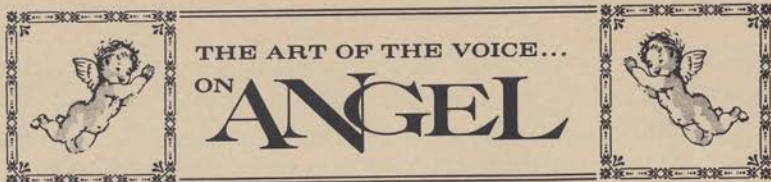
"When I got there," Alex says, "the phone rang and Melchior turned to his immense great Dane dog and said 'Christian, answer the phone.' The dog went over, picked up the receiver with his mouth, laid it down on the table, and said 'bow-wow.' Melchior then asked him 'who is it,' to which the dog replied 'bow-wow-wow.' 'Oh,' said Melchior, 'I don't want to talk to him right now'—so the dog hung up the phone.

"By this time I could barely believe what I was seeing," Alex continued, "but we got Melchior outfitted at home in his costume, wig, and make-up and we dashed down to the theater, arriving three minutes before curtain time!"

Such hectic activity, though, is his life's blood to Alex Agnini. This winter his wife had a serious illness in New York, where he lives, and he "thought I wouldn't come back to San Francisco this year."

"But I couldn't stay away," he explains. "After all, this Company is like my child."

## THE STORY OF "DIE FRAU OHNE SCHATTEN"

ACT I—In the Empire of the Southeastern Islands, the Nurse guards the palatial bedroom in which the Imperial pair is sleeping. Keikobad's messenger appears, and announces: "The irate father will turn the Emperor to stone, and reclaim his daughter, if she does not obtain a shadow within three days." He disappears. The Emperor emerges. He wants to go hunting for three days, to recover his Falcon.

As soon as he has disappeared into the dawn, the Empress discovers the Falcon, and learns from it the fate her father Keikobad is threatening — turning the Emperor to stone unless she obtains a shadow. A shadow can come only from a woman of the human world, from which the Emperor has jealously tried to keep her away.

She forces the reluctant nurse to help her look for a shadow.

(SCENE 2) The music during the change of scene describes their flight down to the drab reality of earth.

In a hovel under the city wall, the young wife of the Dyer, Barak, is quarrelling with his misshapen brothers. She is unhappy in her marriage with the older man, who longs for children.

The Empress and the Nurse enter. The Nurse senses the unhappiness of the Dyer's wife, and plays upon it, hoping to turn it to her own advantage. By promises of a beautiful life filled with all the luxuries of which she has dreamed, she tempts the Dyer's wife to induce her to sell her shadow. As a condition the Dyer's wife must refuse herself to her husband for three days. During this time, the Empress and the Nurse will serve her during the day as maids — nights they will spend in the Imperial falcon-house. For the return of Barak, the Nurse prepares a meal, and provides for separate beds. The Dyer's wife hears the wailing, warning voices of her unborn children. Nevertheless, she refuses herself to her husband, though the exhorting voices of the gity guards are praising the sacredness of marriage.

ACT II—The next day Barak is away at work and the Nurse continues to tempt his wife. She makes the phantom of a youth appear, personifying the wife's most secret desires. But as the youth seeks to touch her, she pushes him away.

Barak returns with rich food, and is surrounded by poor people and begging children. Deeply perturbed she does not enjoy the feast, and ruins his enjoyment too.

(SCENE 2) The Falcon has returned to the Emperor, and induces him to come at night to the falcon-house, where, according to a message, the Empress will be. But the house is empty. Suspicion grips the Emperor. He sees the Empress steal in, secretly, and fears that she has been in touch with the human world. He resolves to murder her. But he cannot bring himself to do it, and flees into the wilderness.

(SCENE 3) In the falcon-house, the Empress dreams of seeing the Emperor force his entry into Keikobad's domain, lured into the Temple by the messenger. She fears that his fate is overcoming him.

(SCENE 4) On the third day, the Dyer's wife taunts her guileless husband. She makes her wicked intentions appear fact: that she has been un-

faithful and has sold her shadow. Barak wants to kill her. The Nurse, assuming that the shadow is now free, hands him the sword. The Dyer's wife realizes that in truth she loves him. The Empress becomes aware of the sinfulness of the shadow-barter, and now repudiates the ownerless shadow. Keikobad's messenger enters, takes the shadow, stops Barak from murder, and calls them all to Keikobad's judgment.

Emperor and Empress, Dyer and Dyer's wife, all have sinned. The Emperor has turned to stone. Barak has become a murderer. The wife has lost her shadow. The Empress has obtained no shadow. All four await Keikobad's judgment, because they have sinned against their fellow men, their husbands, and unborn children.

ACT III—Barak and his wife are led by spirit-servants into separate dungeons. In solitude, each one realizes that they love one another and belong together. The spirits free them to seek each other through further trials.

(SCENE 2) A shadowy boat takes the Empress and the Nurse to Keikobad's Temple. The Empress recognizes the portal—in her dream, the Emperor had entered it. The Nurse warns her against an encounter with her father, but the Empress enters the Temple.

(SCENE 3) In the Temple, the Empress wants to face Keikobad, to assume her responsibilities, and to ask for her husband's life. She does not succumb to the temptation to take the shadow from the Dyer's wife. Rather than have the unhappiness of other human beings pay for her happiness, she would die for her husband. Keikobad, as a last trial, shows her the Emperor turned to stone. Then as a gift of mercy, since she has learned to feel as a true human being, he gives her a shadow, liberates the Emperor, and frees both from the Spirit World.

(SCENE 4) Emperor and Empress return to the sun-flooded beauty of the springtime world, matured and understanding.

The Dyer couple find each other, and the wife's shadow is restored.

The chorus of future children is singing hymns of praise.
