DEBUTS OF THE WEEK



ETTORE BASTIANINI

With a repertoire of more than fifty operas to his credit, baritone Bastianini makes his San Francisco Opera debut with three of his greatest portrayals, Renato in "Un Ballo in Maschera" this Thursday and again October 20, "Rigoletto" on October 18 and "Nabucco" on October 23.

A native of Siena, Bastianini began singing there as a youth in the city choir. He later studied in Florence and at the age of nineteen began his career as a bass. In 1952 he switched to the baritone range and began his new status with a performance of "Pique Dame" in Florence. Since then Bastianini has appeared at the Metropolitan, La Scala, the Chicago Lyric, the Vienna Staatsoper, Salzburg, and possibly every other musical center of importance.

The voice is well-known to San Franciscans through many recordings, including recently released pressings of both "Ballo" and "Rigoletto." Following his San Francisco appearances, Bastianini is slated to open the forthcoming seasons at both La Scala in Milan and

the San Carlo in Naples.


JOY COGHILL

ANDREAS NOMIKOS

Designer Nomikos was born in Alexandria, Egypt, in 1917 of Greek parents. He graduated from Athens university and then studied further at London university, the Slade art school, and in Paris. His career as a scenic and costume designer began in Athens and he eventually worked with all the major Greek theater companies, on both contemporary and classic plays in addition to operas.

During the war Nomikos served with the Greek forces and was decorated twice. He came to the United States in 1956, worked for the Houston Grand Opera in 1957, and then with the New York City Opera for three seasons. Recently he has designed both "Idomeneo" (1955) and "Nausicaa" (1961) for the Athens festival, "Elektra" for the Salzburg festival (1957) and the Fenice in Venice (1961), and "Ernani" for the Maggio Musicale in Florence in 1957.

In 1962 Nomikos will do Monteverdi's "Incoronazione di Poppea" in Munich and "Fidelio" in Venice. In addition to his designing chores, he also teaches at Indiana

university.




RUSSELL OBERLIN

THE STORY OF "BLOOD MOON"

ACT I, SCENE 1—New Orleans around 1859. Cleo, a quadroon, listens to the song of the Negroes outside her cottage. She tells of her love for the white man who fathered her child and then deserted her. The police enter and order her and her daughter to wear a yellow scarf in public. According to a new law, this must be done by all women with any degree of Negro blood, free or slave.

Ninette, Cleo's daughter, bursts into the room. She has just been given her first contract to appear in the theater. When Cleo explains about the yellow scarf, Ninette refuses to wear it. Her mother warns Ninette that she cannot hide her identity and, breaking Ninette's jubilant mood, shows the scars she was given for loving one not of her race. Ninette casts the scarf aside. She is

going to pursue her life in her own way.

Scene 2—A fashionable ball is in progress in the garden of the Bardac estate. The host, Raymond Bardac, is the object of his friends' banter as he eagerly awaits Ninette. The actress, Edmee Le Blanc, whom Ninette has replaced as the star of New Orleans, strives for the attention of the assembled guests by singing a "couplet." Her song is interrupted by the arrival of Ninette who im-

mediately steals the limelight in a performance of her own.

As supper is being served, Edmee remains in the garden. She overhears Cleo who has come to warn her daughter that the police are looking for her. As Cleo slips out of the garden, Raymond comes from the house and tells Ninette of his love. As Raymond rejoins the guests to announce his engagement, Edmee confronts Ninette and threatens to expose her secret unless she leaves immediately. Ninette accepts her defeat and slips off. Raymond, bewildered at

her sudden departure, is taunted by Edmee.

ACT II, SCENE 1—In a New York theater, Ninette is taking her bows on stage while Cleo packs her trunks in the dressing room. Mr. Parker, the theater manager, is sorry to see his star leave for Paris. He hands Cleo, now playing the role of Ninette's maid, a note for her mistress which she is reluctant to give Ninette. It is from Raymond who has followed her to New York and promises to be at her apartment that night. Cleo is very disturbed. She urges Ninette to go out with Tom Henney and his followers, The Bowery Boys. Ninette, after cutting cards with Henney and losing, leaves with him.

Scene 2—Raymond arrives at Ninette's apartment and is met by Cleo. He presumes she is a servant and is astonished at her rudeness. He insists on waiting for Ninette. She returns with Henney and a dispute arises between the two men. When Henney resorts to physical violence, Ninette sends him away. She and Raymond affirm their love and agree to meet again in Paris where they

will be married.

Acr III—Cleo, still acting as Ninette's maid, welcomes a nun and a group of orphans into Ninette's Paris apartment on the Day of Epiphany. As they are distributing gifts to the children, Alexandre Dumas enters. After the children leave, Dumas, who also has Negro blood, and Ninette discuss her problem! They then, to break the mood, play the closing scene of his latest stage success. Their gaiety is abruptly ended when Raymond arrives. Since war is threatening the south, he wishes to marry Ninette immediately and return home to fight for his way of life. This time Cleo's baiting arouses such anger in him that Dumas is forced to restrain him. On his calling Cleo a black witch, Ninette reveals her true relationship to Cleo. She finally comes to the realization that she and Raymond must part forever since society would never condone their love. Left alone with Cleo, Ninette drapes the yellow scarf about her. Her mother takes it from her and contends she needs it no longer.

To Friends of the San Francisco Opera:

There was special cause for alarm at this time last year. Our annual income in 1958 had fallen short of expenses by \$10,016 and in 1959 the gap had widened to \$60,454. The implication was obvious; if this trend continued the San Francisco Opera could not survive.

The generous and widespread response to the 1960 drive by opera fans and business organizations helped us to protect the Opera from the dangers of deficit spending. Twice as many contributions were received than ever before and the amount raised, \$122,101, was almost 50% more than the fund-raising income of any previous year.

Particularly encouraging to opera management was the knowledge that an increasing number of opera goers and businessmen realized that the San Francisco Opera not only belongs to them, but depends on them for its very survival.

Yet we can never rest on past accomplishments, either financial or artistic. As production costs continue to increase so must our fund raising become increasingly effective. What was sufficient income to offset the expenses of previous seasons will not, in all probability, be enough to cover the expenses for this year.

The goal of the current drive is \$150,000, which is almost \$28,000 more than we raised in 1960. To reach this goal we need even wider and "deeper" support.

If you did not contribute to the 1960 drive we appeal to you to contribute now. If you did contribute last year, we are depending on you to contribute again. To those who can afford it, we must appeal for increased contributions.

It is through the generosity of its patrons, both individuals and businesses, that the San Francisco Opera has attained its high standards. Your support at this time will assure the continued vitality and development of your opera company.
