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


#### **DEBUT OF THE WEEK**

OTTO VON ROHR

A native of Berlin, bass von Rohr also studied in that city. His first operatic engagement was with the Duisburg Opera, followed by contracts in Stuttgart and Frankfurt. This week marks his American debut with performances of Pogner in "Die Meistersinger von Nuernberg" Saturday night and Rocco in "Fidelio" on Tuesday. He will repeat both roles in Los Angeles and also "Fidelio" in San Diego.

In recent years von Rohr's travels have taken him to Buenos Aires in 1960 for "Tannhauser" and "Walkuere" at the Colon, to Paris earlier this year for "Die Zauberflote," to Rio de Janeiro in 1959 for "Der Rosenkavalier" and to Florence, Rome and Naples.






LUCIA DI LAMMERMOOR — Joan Sutherland in the title role.





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

#### THE STORY OF "DIE MEISTERSINGER VON NUERNBERG"

ACT I—A young Franconian knight, Walther von Stolzing—who reads the poems of others in his lonely castle in winter-time and writes his own in the springtide forests—falls in love and gains acquaintance with Eva, daughter of the wealthy Nuernberg goldsmith, Pogner, in St. Katherine's church. When Walther learns Eva's hand in marriage goes to the winner in the morrow's Mastersinger contest he determines to enter and win. David (apprentice of Hans Sachs, the popular cobbler) tries to teach Walther the endless pedantic rules governing singing as the Mastersingers practice it. Walther sings his trial song—all of love and spring—but Beckmesser, the stupid, jealous, and malicious "official marker", covers his slate with Walther's violations of the rules. Though Hans Sachs sees the beauty of his heartfelt and untutored song, Walther is refused admission to the guild and rushes from the hall in despair.

ACT II—After David gives indignant Magdalena, Eva's companion, the news of Walther's defeat, and fights jeering fellow apprentices, Hans Sachs sits down in front of the cobbler-shop. There Eva discloses that she loves Walther, and Sachs, though he loves the girl, determines to help his rival. Now Beckmesser sings beneath Eva's window, but Sachs insists on scanning the music with a hammer blow for every error. The noise wakens the neighbors. David thinks Beckmesser is serenading Magdalena and uses his cudgel on him. Townsfolk and apprentices pour into the street and fight, but Hans Sachs stops Eva and Walther as they try to elope under cover of the confusion. He sends Eva home and takes Walther into his own house, while with the mellow sound of the watchman's horn the crowd disappears from the moonlight street.

ACT III—Scene 1—To Sachs, brooding over the folly of man, comes Walther, who has dreamed of a wonderful song. He sings it and at Sach's request jots down the words on a bit of paper. Beckmesser, crawling in after Sachs and Walther have left, finds the paper, and is caught in the act of stealing. Sachs, however, tells him he can keep the poem. When Eva comes in Walther sings her a stanza of his dream song, and the arrival of David and Magdalena motivates the famous Quintet.

Scene 2—On the banks of the Pegnitz River the Nuernberg guilds and their families watch the Mastersingers move in procession to the platform. Sachs calls on Beckmesser to sing and the pedant makes a pitiful botch of fitting Walther's new words to his old tune. Laughed from the platform, his place is taken by Walther, whose singing of the "Prize Song", the love melody to Eva, wins the laurel crown and his sweetheart's hand in marriage. Sachs, who has shown that Art's future lies in the happy union of the traditional and the inspired, is acclaimed by all.

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
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#### A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT

To Friends of the San Francisco Opera:

There was special cause for alarm at this time last year. Our annual income in 1958 had fallen short of expenses by \$10,016 and in 1959 the gap had widened to \$60,454. The implication was obvious; if this trend continued the San Francisco Opera could not survive.

The generous and widespread response to the 1960 drive by opera fans and business organizations helped us to protect the Opera from the dangers of deficit spending. Twice as many contributions were received than ever before and the amount raised, \$122,101, was almost 50% more than the fund-raising income of any previous year.

Particularly encouraging to opera management was the knowledge that an increasing number of opera goers and businessmen realized that the San Francisco Opera not only belongs to them, but depends on them for its very survival.

Yet we can never rest on past accomplishments, either financial or artistic. As production costs continue to increase so must our fund raising become increasingly effective. What was sufficient income to offset the expenses of previous seasons will not, in all probability, be enough to cover the expenses for this year.

The goal of the current drive is \$150,000, which is almost \$28,000 more than we raised in 1960. To reach this goal we need even wider and "deeper" support.

If you did not contribute to the 1960 drive we appeal to you to contribute now. If you did contribute last year, we are depending on you to contribute again. To those who can afford it, we must appeal for increased contributions.


