 Tacea la notte placida . . . Di tale amor Sondra Radvanovsky

Leonora serenely remembers that “the night was peaceful and silent” when she first heard the singing of the troubadour who won her heart. Then she joyfully declares that words alone cannot express the love she feels.

7:30 Deserto sulla terra . . . Di geloso amor Sondra Radvanovsky, Marco Berti, and Quinn Kelsey

The troubadour Manrico serenades beneath Leonora’s window, but his bitter rival Count di Luna overhears. In the darkness she mistakes the Count for Manrico, provoking a jealous outburst. In fury the two men draw swords and challenge each other to a duel.

5:00 THE ITALIAN GIRL IN ALGIERS Rossini  
 Cruda sorte Ewa Podles

Shipwrecked and taken captive, the plucky Isabella at first bemoans her “cruel fate,” but quickly pulls herself together, confident that she can handle her captors. After all, what all men really want is a beautiful woman to make them happy.

4:45 THE BARBER OF SEVILLE Rossini  
 La calunnia Andrea Silvestrelli

The crafty Don Basilio explains how a slanderous rumor can destroy an enemy, starting as a tiny whisper but gradually growing into a roaring explosion, leaving the hapless opponent lying crushed in the dust.

3:30: LA CENERENTOLA (CINDERELLA) Rossini  
 Non più mesta Daniela Mack

8:00 IL TROVATORE Verdi  
 Ah, si, ben mio . . .Di quella pira Marco Berti

About to marry Leonora before going off to battle, Manrico assures her that his love for her will endure even beyond the grave. Then, learning that his mother has been captured by the enemy, who plan to execute her, he boldly rallies his men to hurry off to the rescue.

4:30 IL TROVATORE Verdi Quinn Kelsey  
Il balen del suo sorriso

Count di Luna plans to abduct Leonora before she can fulfill her wish to enter a convent. About to launch his daring plan, he fervently declares that the "brilliant flash of her smile" awakens his love and gives him new courage.

3:35 THE MARRIAGE OF FIGARO Mozart Daniela Mack  
Voi che sapete

The lovesick teenage pageboy Cherubino is just discovering girls, and asks the Countess and her maid Susanna to explain the strange new sensations he is feeling: he trembles and sighs, burns and freezes, and is filled with inexplicable desires.

8:30 LUCIA DI LAMMERMOOR Donizetti Leah Crocetto  
Regnava nel silenzio . . . Quando rapita in estasi

Lucia emotionally recalls how "then night reigned in silence" when she saw the ghost of a murdered maiden. But her mood quickly changes as she thinks of her beloved Edgardo, who makes her feel "enraptured in ecstasy" when he speaks to her of love.

Intermezzo

4:30 LA BOHÈME Puccini David Lomeli  
Che gelida manina

The penniless poet Rodolfo meets Mimì when she knocks at his chilly garret seeking to light her candle. Clutching her "freezing hand" to warm it in his own, he tells her of his life and dreams, confessing that her beautiful eyes give him newfound hope.

2:30 GIANNI SCHICCHI Puccini Leah Crocetto  
O mio babbino caro

Lauretta begs her father Gianni Schicchi to let her marry Rinuccio, though the boy's arrogant family insultingly disapproves of the match. Playing on her father's sympathies, she tearfully threatens to drown herself if he doesn't take pity on her.

7:00 LA BOHÈME Puccini David Lomeli, Quinn Kelsey  
O Mimi, tu più non torni

The painter Marcello and the poet Rodolfo put up a brave front with one another as they laughingly pretend not to care about their recent break-ups with their respective girlfriends Musetta and Mimì. But quietly to themselves they express their sadness and heartbreak.

5:00 TOSCA Puccini Brandon Jovanovich  
E lucevan le stelle

Awaiting execution for treason, Mario thinks of his love for Tosca, recalling that "the stars were shining" during one of their passionate moments together. He bitterly regrets that his life must end just when he cherishes it the most.
