

PLÁCIDO DOMINGO RETURNS OCTOBER 6

The incomparable Plácido Domingo returns to the War Memorial Opera House on Sunday, October 6 for a sold-out afternoon concert celebrating the 50th anniversary of his San Francisco Opera debut. Worldrenowned, Domingo is one of the finest and most influential singing actors in the history of opera with a repertory of 151 roles and more than 3,900 career performances. This multifaceted artist who has triumphed in both the tenor and baritone repertory, made his San Francisco Opera debut in 1969 replacing an ailing colleague as Rodolfo in Puccini's La Bohème. He appeared with the Company in over 100 performances of 14 different roles, including the lead in Alfano's Cyrano de Bergerac. His PBS telecasts from the War Memorial Opera House include L'Africaine and Samson et Dalila, and he appeared many times in concerts and recitals at the Opera House, Civic Auditorium, Stern Grove, and Golden Gate Park. In 1994, he was awarded the San Francisco Opera Medal, the Company's highest honor.

For his upcoming concert, Domingo will be under the baton of Spanish conductor Jordi Bernàcer with the San Francisco Opera Orchestra and guest artists to be announced.



On Friday, the 6th of September, San Francisco Opera Guild will produce Opera Ball, the iconic gala celebration that launches the new San Francisco Opera repertory season, the Company's 97th. For this special occasion, Guild President Mary Poland has invited Elizabeth Birka-White and Jane S. Mudge to co-chair this inaugural evening of extraordinary music, fine dining, couture fashion, and design all in support of opera education programs. Reflecting the opening night opera, Charles Gounod's romantic *Romeo and Juliet*, the theme of the Opera Ball is "The Capulets' Masked Ball," offering the perfect opportunity for attendees to wear an elegant mask. Acclaimed stylist J. Riccardo Benavides will curate the event design evoking the spirit of Renaissance Verona while McCalls Catering & Events will create the dinner and afterglow buffet to compliment the late-night dancing. OPERA GUILD SCOUTS & MADRIGALS

For the past 80 years, San Francisco Opera Guild has been offering education programs to students throughout the Bay Area. Working under the title of "Giving Voice to Potential," one of these successful activities is the ensemble-based Opera Scouts, a performing arts organization for boys and

girls ages 12–18, providing a social, developmental, career, and artistic home base for arts-minded youth. Building on the success of last season's performance trip to Italy, the Scouts will travel to Austria in March 2020 for a 10-day performance itinerary in Salzburg, Melk, and Vienna.

New this year is the launch of the Opera Madrigals, a junior version of the Scouts for boys and girls ages 7–11. The Madrigals will focus on folk songs, composition, storytelling, and honing performance skills, providing an inspiring introduction to the world of opera.



ADLER FELLOW COUNTERTENOR

Francisco Opera Center has shepherded talented young artists toward major operatic careers. Professional opportunities sometimes arise for the artists while they are still under the wing of their mentors in the Center's programs. This was certainly the case with Merola Opera Program graduate and second-year Adler Fellow Aryeh Nussbaum Cohen. In between coachings, language classes, and other training activities, the 25-

year-old countertenor has experienced a rapid ascent, including a win at the Metropolitan Opera's National Council Auditions, Grammy Award recognition, and rave reviews for performances in opera houses, on concert stages, and even an onstage role with San Francisco Ballet.

This month, Nussbaum Cohen makes his San Francisco Opera debut as Medoro in Handel's *Orlando*. Joining the cast as a late replacement, the Brooklyn-born countertenor integrated this thrilling assignment into an already packed schedule through strict planning. "I'm very type A," he said. "For every season I have a Google spreadsheet where I mark out every piece of music I have to know, how long it is going to take to learn and coach it, and the date I need it ready for rehearsals."

The preparation has really paid off. The year began with sessions for his first solo recording followed by six weeks with Lyric Opera of Chicago for Handel's *Ariodante*. The final performance was on a Sunday, and he flew to San Francisco on Monday to begin rehearsals with San Francisco Ballet on Tuesday. After a week of rehearsals and another week of performances, he went directly into rehearsals for Handel's *Saul* with Philharmonia Baroque Orchestra. Once *Saul* wrapped up, Nussbaum Cohen began *Orlando* rehearsals. "There hasn't been much breathing time, but I

can't complain. This has truly been a dream for me."

Nussbaum Cohen feels a special kinship with his part in *Orlando*. "Medoro's affections and actions cause a lot of trouble and heartbreak for others, but he's fundamentally someone who loves very deeply and authentically. A lot of the characters in Handel's operas give the appearance of being pleasant, but they are usually scheming or playing people for political reasons. I'm excited to be portray-

ing a character who is motivated by true love."

Though he has been a singer for most of his life, the opera bug bit Nussbaum Cohen when he was an undergraduate at Princeton and won free tickets to see Puccini's *La Bohème* at the Metropolitan Opera. "The Zeffirelli production," he emphasized. "My life has never been the same."

Nussbaum Cohen feels the countertenor's high vocal range has always suited him. "As a child, I had been singing soprano and treble in children's choir and my voice dropped when I was twelve. I didn't know what a countertenor was, but I wanted to keep singing in choir so I thought that if I sang alto, I could probably still finagle and hit the notes. That's how it started, and I've just always sung in that register. I didn't really choose to be a countertenor; it kind of chose me."

As an Adler Fellow, this rising star's operatic journey has progressed rapidly through the training he has received and from just being around world-class opera in San Francisco. "I've gained so much from watching opera being made at this level and on this scale. Watching the greatest singers of our time up close as they rehearse and perform, day after day, has been a great supplement to the education I have received. What a joy and honor it has been to soak that in."

HIDDEN MAESTRO

hen a twenty-four-year-old Beverly Sills arrived in San Francisco for her first engagement with San Francisco Opera in 1953, she went straight to the home of Gaetano Merola, unaware he had passed away suddenly while conducting at Stern Grove the day before. What was to have been an apprenticeship under the wing of an illustrious maestro became a depressing stint in a strange city. Highlights of the trip included cooking frankfurters on the radiator of a questionable Market Street hotel, and jumping in for an ailing Gerhilde, only to suffer a wardrobe malfunction of Walkürean proportions. (A helmet mishap prompted Acting Artistic Director Kurt Herbert Adler to ask her if she was drunk.) Sills returned in 1971, a star in earnest, but that bumpy beginning is exactly what today's well-strung Merola Opera Program seeks to avoid.

Enter Mark Morash, Director of Musical Studies.

Even true fans of the opera may not know the name. When a story about the Merola program or the Adler Fellows goes to press, the spokesperson cited most often is Sheri Greenawald, a vivacious former diva who serves as director of the San Francisco Opera Center, coordinating the development of all the young singers brought under the Company's auspices. But followers of these burgeoning careers know Morash well. They've enjoyed his jovial emceeing at Merola galas, and admired his artful conducting and piano playing at countless performances spanning two decades. For these devotees, Morash is equal parts fixture and blessing.

Observing him in a recent coaching, the Nova Scotiaborn Morash has a paradoxical quality, studious yet carefree, simultaneously giving the impression that every note matters intensely, and not at all. It is the nature of a coaching to stop and start, nevertheless he plays fluidly, reading music on an oversized iPad, deftly tapping his toe on an electronic page-turning device nestled beneath the piano.

An inconvenient comma begins to irritate one of the singers. "Oh that?" Morash says. "Don't worry about it. It's a mistake." (Most coaches know that scores are rife with errors. Few can tell you where they are.) A sustained note at the end of a long phrase becomes problematic. Morash appeases the singer's anxiety with a shrug. "You hold it for as long as you hold it."

Renowned collaborative pianist Martin Katz is familiar with this equanimity. "If he's stressed," Katz says, "he certainly doesn't show it, which is perhaps a prime prerequisite for working in opera. Stuff happens; Mark deals."

It was under Katz's tutelage at the University of Michigan that Morash first began to understand the niche he might occupy in the music world. It is a special talent to work well with singers, and Katz says Morash has got it. "Mark could probably charm birds out of trees, perhaps with only his smile and attitude as tools. He has an amazing ability to help people sing and play their best."

Bass-baritone Christian Pursell, a second-year Adler Fellow, agrees. Whether preparing an entire role, or a difficult passage in an audition aria, Pursell says Morash "knows the character of the piece. And he's not judgmental. If it's been a bad week and I'm behind on something, he's not mean about it. Mark really cares about each and every one of us," says Pursell, who will cover the role of Escamillo in this June's *Carmen*. "If we run into each other in the hallway, he always asks about my projects and how he can help. He's that kind of guy."

Morash exudes an unassuming, just-doing-my-job ethos that allows him to flourish in a building of creative personalities, where storms of temper may roll in as frequently as the afternoon fog. Morash brings his lunch every day, (and composts after, in large white bins that once contained pecans from the farm of the late pianist George Darden, a friend and colleague). Morash, along with his wife, Dallis, has raised two grown children. He has a dog. He likes to go to brunch. No surprise that around the opera house Morash is well liked.

His biggest admirer is Greenawald. Their friendship has stood the test of time, and travel. Morash began in 1998, Greenawald in 2002. Their schedule is grueling. January to April they're training the Adlers. May is prep time for Merola, which runs from Memorial Day to mid-August. Then it's time to get the Adlers ready for the fall season. "If there is a calm month in the Opera Center, and it doesn't ever feel very calm, it's September," Morash says. "But then the applications are coming in for Merola, and in October we go out on the road for auditions." That takes them to Thanksgiving, then on to the Adlers' "Future Is Now" concert. A couple of weeks off for Christmas, and they're ready to start the whole thing again in January.

Former San Francisco Opera General Director Kurt Herbert Adler once said, "If we can find one outstanding singer per year, that's OK. Someone who is really going to develop, who has star quality, then we have done our job."

In auditions, Greenawald listens mainly for what she

calls "the goo," i.e., the intrinsic caliber of the voice itself, while Morash, who has perfect pitch and a love of musical minutia, listens for everything else. Both listen for someone they can feel good about putting on the main stage three weeks after arrival to sing for the general director. And both keep in mind how much will be asked of the singers.

The dial has moved over the years from a theoretical pedagogy to a highly practical approach. "It's a fine line to walk when they're asked to do too much, or if they're sitting on their hands," Morash says. "These singers are racehorses. They don't get better sitting in the barn. You have to keep them challenged so they're always upping their game, without overwhelming them."

To Adler's point, they also take the long view.

"We pride ourselves on taking voices that are unconventional for a young artist program," Morash says. "It's easy to take the nice, compact voices that can execute all the musical details everybody wants. But there's somebody coming right down the pike who can do the same thing. We take voices for whom it's a longer trajectory. Otherwise there'll be nobody to sing the big roles. If it's a voice that's not going to really launch till it's forty, if the material is there, we want it."

In choosing Adlers from among the Merola, many minds come together. General Director Matthew Shil-

vock, Managing Director, Artistic, Gregory Henkel, and Head of Music Staff John Churchwell, as well as Administrative Director Chris Bragg, Greenawald, and Morash also receive input from Master Voice Teacher César Ulloa, and will in the future also have the counsel of mezzosoprano Susanne Mentzer. "In a big opera company things tend to be by committee," Morash says. Far from minding this communal aspect, it's clear Morash thrives on the social synergy that makes opera.

Morash is a Merola alum, Class of '87. For him, the summer was epiphanic. He left knowing what he wanted to do for the rest of his life. "I tell the Merola on their first day, 'If we can do for you what Merola did for me, we'll have succeeded."

"He loved the music," says soprano Janet Williams, a Merola classmate from that summer who went on to an international career and now teaches at the Hochschule für Musik in Berlin. "He's one of my favorite memories of the Merola program," she says, describing the young Morash as "serious, but fun."

Music was fun for Morash from the beginning. At three or four he was picking out melodies on the piano by ear, emulating his mother, who played favorites and accompanied sing-alongs as a regular part of the family's vibrant social life.

"As a child," Morash says, "I was not the kid practicing two hours every day, but I probably played that much or more lots of days, for enjoyment." Soon he was in demand, playing in churches and for the community.

Playing by ear is more than a parlor trick. It's a core skill for someone who must enhance a perhaps antiseptic piano score into something that the singers will recognize when they perform with the more sonorous orchestra.

Playing violin in the Nova Scotia Youth Orchestra was Morash's invitation to that world of sound. It also introduced him to "the first real musician I ever met," a Czech violinist named Jan Wicha, who had settled in Canada after fleeing the Prague Spring.

Those early years of precocity left their mark. Morash is comfortable in front of an audience, possessing his own brand of warm-hearted stage charisma and a tasteful showmanship. At a recent recital of Adler Fellows Mary Evelyn Hangley and Christopher Oglesby, he gives a short but gripping introduction to Britten's "Still Falls the Rain," describing the Blitz to evoke a vivid wartime mood. "I wanted to drop everybody in it," he tells me later, "to be ready at the downbeat." For the brief instrumental outro of Fauré's "En Sourdine," Morash's light touch allows the beauty of the music to sneak up on the audience, much like the surprising, nocturnal song of the nightingale just mentioned in the lyric. When I arrived at his studio for our first meeting, Morash is quick to say he cannot imagine what I will find to say about him. His comment is something more than humility. It is recognition that perhaps the most significant and lasting impact he will have on the art form he so cherishes, is not the man himself, but rather his influence on the musical minds of countless singers and colleagues. It is an artistic sensibility which once passed on, will be manifest in opera houses the world over for generations to come.

On that fateful moment when Merola died at the podium, the aria being sung was "Un bel di" from *Madama Butterfly*. The exact line was "Io senza dar risposta me ne starò nascosta." *I give no answer, but remain hidden*. Like his foot moving swiftly under the piano, or the hours upon hours of preparation and encouragement he pours upon the stars of tomorrow, Morash's contribution to the opera is made mostly in modest rooms, and in micro-installments, his quotidian importance vanishing almost magically as others take the curtain call. Perhaps in the end, an essential artist like Morash is as the nightingale: at the moment of greatest glory, he remains hidden.



RUSALKA

ACT I

Wood nymphs are playing in a forest on a moonlit night. They call the water goblin, Vodník, who is the father of Rusalka. He emerges and tries to pull the wood nymphs to the bottom of the lake. They escape and tease him before running off. Rusalka, a water nymph, rises from the water and tells her father of her deep unhappiness. She is drawn to the Prince who swims in the lake. She longs to be human, to possess a soul and to experience love. Vodník is horrified, but reluctantly advises her to seek the help of Ježibaba, the forest witch.

Rusalka appeals to the moon, begging to know where her beloved may be. Gathering her courage, Rusalka calls to Ježibaba and begs her help. The witch presents two conditions before agreeing to the deal. Rusalka must give up her power of speech, and if she fails to gain love, she may never return to the water. Rusalka agrees, and Ježibaba brews her a potion.

Dawn breaks and the Prince appears pursuing a white doe. He is drawn to the lake and Rusalka, now human, instantly captivates him. He woos her, but she cannot reply. Hearing her sisters lamenting her absence, she is frightened and throws herself into the arms of the Prince. He leads her out of the forest.

ACT III

Alone and condemned, Rusalka returns to the lake. Ježibaba arrives and suggests she can be saved by killing the Prince. Rusalka refuses and so must wander the forest, a will-o'-the-wisp, luring men to their deaths with her kiss.

The Gamekeeper and Kitchen Boy come to ask Ježibaba for advice about the Prince. He has fallen ill under a strange spell. They suspect Rusalka. Vodník emerges, swearing revenge for his daughter. He catches the Kitchen Boy, the Gamekeeper runs away in fear, and Ježibaba laughs at the stupidity of humankind. The Prince frantically searches the forest for Rusalka. When she appears to him, she asks why he betrayed her, but his only desire is for her kiss. She finally gives him what he desires, and as the Prince dies, Rusalka asks God to have mercy on his soul. She vanishes.

ACT II

At the castle the Gamekeeper and Kitchen Boy gossip about the upcoming marriage of the Prince to a strange, speechless maiden. They suspect witchcraft and are glad to hear that the Prince's interest in the girl is waning. A Foreign Princess, who is a guest at the castle, is winning his attention.

Rusalka and the Prince enter. He wonders why his passion frightens her, and he finds her embrace cold. The Foreign Princess observes them imperiously and then speaks seductively to the Prince. Rusalka cannot compete with this worldly woman.

Outside the palace, Vodník laments Rusalka's unhappiness. When Rusalka sees Vodník, she tells him of her despair. At the end of the evening, the Prince rejects Rusalka. Vodník appears and curses the Prince, and as the Prince begs the Princess for help, she cruelly laughs and advises him to follow his bride into hell. FINDING THE WAYTO RUSALKA BY LARRY ROTHE

aving reached his late fifties, Antonín Dvořák refused to be the kind of aging man that William Butler Yeats would lament as "a paltry thing, a tattered coat upon a stick." Like Yeats, Dvořák knew time could condemn anyone to irrelevance. And, like Yeats, he understood that the spirit calcifies "unless soul clap its hands and sing, and louder sing for every tatter in its mortal dress." So now, with a 30-year career behind him and having won a following that spanned the Atlantic, Dvořák determined to embrace an even broader audience, shifting his creative focus from symphonies and chamber music to opera. That new focus would be his way of clapping his hands, singing, and doing what he did best.

In that late-19th-century world of European music,

composers fell into two camps—traditionalists (like Brahms) who wrote so-called "absolute" music in conventional genres, and radicals (like Liszt and Richard Strauss) who saw themselves as musical storytellers, and who produced tone poems that illustrated underlying programs. Dvořák had always been a reliable member of the first camp. In fact it had been Brahms, impressed years before by the impoverished young Czech's sober approach to composition, who championed him and helped him gain traction. But in 1896, the 55-year-old Dvořák had recently returned from a sojourn in America, where homesickness intensified his already consuming love for his native country. In the literary ballads of the folklorist Karel Jaromír Erben, Dvořák found his affection for the Bohemian countryside echoed and the Czech essence distilled. Four Erben ballads inspired him to compose the first tone poems he had ever written. Those works—*The Water Goblin, The Noon Witch, The Golden Spinning Wheel,* and *The Wild Dove*—are Czech folklore in music. The flesh-and-blood titles seemed to belong to another composer, not one whose catalog was filled with entries as abstract as Symphony in D Major or String Quartet in F Major. Something had changed.

No one but Dvořák could have produced those tone poems. What changed was his attitude. He came to accept the value of musical storytelling—a new way to extend his audience and fulfill what he believed was his mission. Dvořák treated his genius as an endowment from heaven. (Reading the phrase "Thanks be to God!" at the end of his manuscripts, you practically hear him sigh: one more work he'd been granted time and capacity to complete.) Although he never would have described his relationship with his maker as a partnership, he understood he possessed the power to embellish God's world, and that, with his talent, he could unlock a listener's sense of inner grandeur, offer a nudge toward the vistas that music is uniquely equipped to reveal. Perhaps Dvořák experienced a late-life revelation as did Tolstoy, whose taste for increasingly simple art led him to condemn Beethoven's Ninth Symphony and renounce his own earlier writing, including War and Peace and Anna Karenina. While Dvořák never went that far, never turned his back on music he had already composed, he shared the Russian's eagerness to broaden his appeal.

But Tolstoy was a grouch. Dvořák was a mensch. His disposition seemed to improve with the years. "Dvořák emanated some kind of rare affability," said another Czech composer, Bohuslav Martinů, "a sense of humanity and well-being. If anyone expressed a healthy and joyful attitude to life, it was him."

Hungry for work and a steward of his gifts, Dvořák now engaged with one more genre. As he told a reporter for a Vienna newspaper in 1904: "I wanted to devote all my powers, for as long as the dear Lord gives me health, to the creation of opera. This is not, however, because of a yearning for glory as far as the stage is concerned, but simply for the reason that I consider opera to be the most suitable form for the people. The broad masses listen to this music, and very frequently...." A symphony, he said, could take forever to reach them. Writing symphonies interested him no longer.

Dvořák knew what made opera work. Early on, as violist in the orchestra at Prague's National Theatre, he learned about the stage. By 1901, when *Rusalka* was premiered, he had already written eight operas, although none had attracted much interest outside Bohemia. *Rusalka* changed that. It brought him his biggest theatrical triumph, at home and abroad. In *Rusalka*, Dvořák's opera ambition coincided with his love of legend.

He found his libretto by accident. Jaroslav Kvapil was a Czech dramatist almost 30 years Dvořák's junior. In 1900, he completed a libretto commissioned by Josef Jiránek, a composer about whom virtually nothing is known today. Nothing much was known of him then, either, and that was Kvapil's problem. He believed his Rusalka was too good a piece for Jiránek. So he began shopping his libretto around. (We can assume he accepted no payment from Jiránek since no legal issues appear to have arisen.) But while he wanted to pair his work with a better composer, he now failed to aim high enough. Never imagining someone of Dvořák's stature would be interested, he offered the libretto to Oskar Nedbal, Josef Bohuslav Foerster, Karel Kovarovic, and Josef Suk. Busy with other projects, they each turned him down. Then he spotted an ad placed by the National Theatre. The great Dvořák was looking for a libretto. Kvapil took a chance. When Dvořák saw what the young man had written, he was sold.

Kvapil created *Rusalka* from several sources—mainly Hans Christian Anderson's *The Little Mermaid*, but also *Undine* by the German writer Friedrich de la Motte Fouqué. With their aquatic settings and fantastic characters, these stories provided material that Kvapil framed as a folk tale, meshing with Dvořák's current passion. Kvapil claimed he had emulated the spirit of Karel Jaromír Erben's ballads and guessed that his Erbenesque tone may have "captured Dvořák's imagination more than the libretto itself." The libretto indeed reveals few particularly Slavic elements beyond the names in the *dramatis personae* (although the witch Ježibaba will reappear in operas by another Czech composer, morphing into one of Janáček's mean-spirited village crones). Dvořák's music is what makes this opera Czech.

Whether it was the story Kvapil told or the tone he adopted, his libretto touched Dvořák. Awful librettos have derailed many operas. Too often, mediocre literary talents imagine music will complete what their imaginations could not. Dvořák had seen his earlier operas doomed by weak librettos. In *Rusalka* he found a captivating story—a human story, presented as a fairy tale.

Rusalka's humanness resides in its complexities. The water sprite Rusalka faces one of those dilemmas that can trigger madness. She must become human if she has any hope of approaching the man she loves. But the witchcraft that can transform her will cost her the power of speech,

ensuring she will never be able to communicate her love. No one here lives happily ever after.

For all its folkloric appeal, Kvapil's libretto is distinctively *fin de siècle*, though Dvořák's straightforward style, developed in the very different world of earlier times, never feels at odds with the action. The composer seems unbothered by a sometimes blurry plot with the potential to encourage considerable interpretive leeway. While Debussy would have relished the mystery and symbolism—*Pelléas* premiered exactly a year later—Dvořák folded

these into the musical context of Slavic legend. We hear the bardic harp as Rusalka is introduced, and again as the Prince meets her. We hear melodies inspired by Czech folk tunes and dances. Kvapil dwells on images of the moon, whose mysterious light radiates throughout a world fraught with the dangers of wished-for enchantment. Early on, Dvořák offers his most beguiling music as Rusalka implores the moon to enrapture the Prince, binding him to her with its glow. This gorgeous aria is kin to Rusalka's motif, the first identifiable theme we hear, moments into the prelude. That motif returns again and again, but no less important is Rusalka's moon aria, to which Dvořák also harkens back at crucial moments. As Act I concludes, the Prince, ravished at the sight of the water nymph-turned-woman, addresses her-"a golden star"-in music whose contours, serenity, and ecstatic harmonies resonate with traces of her song to the moon—spanning the act in that single stroke, uniting the earlier moment with this moment, just as the lovers' passion unites them. And at the opera's end, the final decrescendo is followed by a brief postlude, closing the work with a reference to the lunar aria.

Rusalka, a late entry in the annals of 19th-century musical nationalism, displays Dvořák's trademark melodic abundance and rhythmic energy, fusing in what seems unforced spontaneity. His speed in completing *Rusalka*—late April through late

November, 1900—suggests that the stories about his working style are true: that he simply notated the music surging from some bottomless inner well. But what we hear, as his biographer John Clapham tells us, resulted from methodical effort. "A line will take us hours maybe"—Yeats again, describing how good poets work—"yet if it does not seem a moment's thought, our stitching and unstitching has been naught." Dvořák knew how much labor genius demands, a fact learned over the long haul of his professional life. After *Rusalka,* only three years remained to him. For now, he showed no signs of stopping.

RUSALKA IN THE NEW WORLD

hroughout his American sojourn (1892–1895) as director of the National Conservatory of Music in New York City, Czech composer Antonín Dvořák longed for his native Bohemia and channeled his homesickness into some of his most poignant and emotionally stirring music, including Symphony No. 9 in E minor (*From the New World*) and "American" string quartet. Among his musical jottings from the period was a melancholic, four-measure idea intended for a cello sonata. The unused melody found expression nearly a decade later as the central motive for his new opera, *Rusalka*, which had its premiere on March 31, 1901 at Prague's National Theatre.

Dvořák's fairy tale work about a lovelorn water spirit and her unattainable prince was an immediate hit in Bohemia, but slow to catch on elsewhere. Like many turnof-the-century Czech operas, *Rusalka*'s foreign exposure was circumscribed by language barriers, nationalism, and the turbulent history of Dvořák's homeland during the twentieth century. It would take generations of artistevangelists to secure the opera's future abroad. The successful export of *Rusalka* seemed, at first, assured. Shortly after its premiere Gustav Mahler, director of the Vienna Court Opera (1897–1907) and staunch advocate of fellow Bohemian composers, agreed to present *Rusalka* in German translation. The premiere was delayed several times and, when Dvořák died in 1904, the opportunity passed; Vienna would not present the opera until 1987.

Though he failed *Rusalka*, Mahler's promotion of Bedřich Smetana's *The Bartered Bride*—the prototypical Czech national opera—was enormously successful. He conducted the opera in Hamburg, Vienna, and, in 1909, brought it to the Metropolitan Opera in New York. Mahler's rearranged, German–language version of the work also became the first Czech opera to be presented by San Francisco Opera in 1934.

Music from *Rusalka* was first heard in America thanks to the creator of the title role, soprano Růžena Maturová. In 1903, representatives of the Czech community in Chicago invited this reigning diva of Prague's National Theatre to headline a Chicago benefit. Maturová made the long journey and sang Czech folk songs and "Song to the

Moon" from *Rusalka*. Before returning to her homeland, she repeated her program for another Czech community, this time in Omaha, Nebraska.

The opera received an additional boost from another Czech soprano, Emmy Destinn, who, unlike Maturová, left Bohemia to establish an international career. One of the Met's leading pre-WWI artists, Destinn sang "Song to the Moon" at a New York concert in 1912 and recorded the aria, in German, for the Victor record company in 1915.

Rusalka received its American premiere on March 17, 1935, in a concert presentation at Chicago's Sokol Hall. Presented to honor the

85th birthday of Tomáš Masaryk, Czechoslovakia's first president, the performance featured 63-year-old tenor Otakar Mařák—nicknamed "the Czech Caruso" in his heyday—as the Prince.

Ten years later, a Detroit opera troupe mounted a fully staged *Rusalka* in English with sets and costumes by innovative designer Richard Rychtarik and members of the Detroit Symphony in the pit, but the cast was unremarkable. In 1950, New York's Sokol Hall staged a performance of *Rusalka* in Czech with piano accompaniment featuring soprano Lidia Bodenova in the title role and her husband, Boris, directing. These intrepid, amateur efforts were followed in 1955 by a Town Hall concert presentation conducted by Peter Herman Adler (no relation to longtime SF Opera General Director Kurt Herbert Adler) about which the *New York Times* commented, "We heard a delightful score, done with much sincerity and understanding that were contagious."

Though *Rusalka*'s premiere at San Francisco Opera was still decades off, the 1960s saw significant engagement with Czech opera by the Company. In 1966, Leoš Janáček's *Věc Makropulos* was given for the first time in the United States at the War Memorial Opera House. *Jenůfa* and *Kát'a Kabanová* followed, also in English translations, in 1969 and 1977 respectively, with *The Cunning Little Vixen* making its overdue premiere in 2004.

The Company's 1980 revival of *Jenůfa* in Czech starring Sena Jurinac and Elisabeth Söderström established a new norm of performing these works in their original language. With Cold War tensions beginning to thaw in Eastern

Europe, the late Sir Charles Mackerras became a driving force for Czech opera in San Francisco during the 1980s and 1990s. Along with reintroducing Janáček operas in corrected editions and with excellent casts, he conducted the Company's first *Rusalka* in 1995. Years later, the Company's lofty standards in the Czech repertory were reconfirmed in revivals of *Věc Makropulos* in 2010 and *Jenůfa* in 2016, both starring Finnish soprano Karita Mattila and conducted by the late Czech maestro Jiří Belohlávek.

As operas by the big three Czech composers—Smetana, Dvořák, and Janáček—won new audiences in America, *Rusalka*'s success began to

outpace the others; 1975 was the tipping point. A student production was mounted at The Juilliard School with African-American mezzo-soprano Florence Quivar as both Ježibaba and the Foreign Princess. On the West Coast, the University of Southern California staged the opera on campus and San Diego Opera, with Argentine director Tito Capobianco, unveiled arguably the first professional staging of Dvořák's work in America.

Yet more than any artist before her, it was Renée Fleming who popularized *Rusalka* in America. After performing "Song to the Moon" in 1988 at the Met's National Council Winners Concert, the American soprano portrayed the role at Seattle Opera (1990), Houston Grand Opera (1991), San Francisco Opera (1995), and in four Met revivals (1997, 2004, 2009, 2014). Her recordings and concert performances of the aria helped make it one of opera's greatest hits.

Unlike the water nymph who tragically longs for an impossible human love in the opera, *Rusalka* has at last won a place in the hearts of humankind and that affection extends well beyond the borders of the modern-day Czech Republic. Despite nearly 100 years of geo-political strife in his homeland, including Austrian rule, a Nazi takeover, Russian occupation, and decades of isolation behind the Iron Curtain, Dvořák's touching masterpiece has been embraced here in the land that, long ago, provided him with its spark. *Rusalka* has come home.

CZECH, *JOCOSE, JOCOSE,* AN INTERVIEW WITH RADOSLAVA BIANCALANA

n Prague today, one may stumble upon streets so quiet that you can hear your own voice at a whisper. Despite the tourist traps, there are countless places where the city retains its intimate atmosphere. Locals are constantly on the move, and yet they make time to sit in cafés and hang out for hours. Romanesque monuments stand aside Art Nouveau buildings, such as the Municipal House, and Cubist icons such as Café Orient. Music is imprinted on the face of the city thanks to its no fewer than three opera houses, along with the many theaters and music halls, all of which attest to the city's lively soundscape.

I've never been to Prague, but San Francisco Opera Czech language coach Radoslava Biancalana painted the above picture for me while sitting and conversing for hours—many miles from a Prague café, but instead at the War Memorial Opera House on a sunny, windy afternoon.

For many of us living far away from our country of origin, remaining connected to our native culture can be a daunting task. How does she keep memories of her favorite places fresh? She has found one practical and joyful way to keep her culture alive at the San Francisco Opera: "I love language coaching because I think I can really be of use to a lot of singers, introducing them to the beauty of Czech and its rhythm, and simplify it dramatically."

Many speakers of English believe that singing in Czech will be difficult. Why? "For several reasons. The first one is because there are few operatic references in terms of sounds, especially considering that until the 1950s, the majority of Czech operas in the U.S. were performed in English." I wonder if the tense political climate during the Cold War played a role and made Western countries more hesitant to perform operas in Czech. Biancalana main-

tains that the issue was rather about a lack of resources: "Czech speakers are few in comparison to speakers of other major operatic languages; and, among those, even fewer are able to coach singers."

But there was a crucial factor that eventually made operas in Czech more popular—the advent of supertitles: "The moment supertitles became available [mid-1980s], they represented a revolution because the need to perform these operas in an English translation vanished. As a result, the nuances and complexities of the entire work were lifted off the page. I think that Czech operas suffered in translation because they didn't have the same dramatic vigor and rhythm." Once opera houses and audiences started to embrace operas in Czech, Biancalana explains, there was no going back: "Singers and audiences became comfortable with the language, and opera houses wanted to produce these operas in their original versions to achieve a high-quality product.

Biancalana points at yet another reason behind the myth of Czech as an extremely difficult language in opera: "It does have some peculiar sounds such as \check{D} and \check{R} , but many tend to group Czech together with other Slavic languages without acknowledging crucial differences." For example, Biancalana notes, while in Russian sounds are darker and sit at the back of the throat, in Czech they sit forward in the mask—the front of our face where the voice resonates the most. For this reason, vowels are up front and open.

"Let's go over to the blackboard and try to sing," she suggests. With her guidance, I could quickly pick up the correct pronunciation and sing the words she chose. To my surprise, it seemed like many sounds—vowels in particular—were similar to my native language, Italian. "Yes!" she exclaims, "Czech sits in the same place as Italian does, so Italian speakers have an even easier time than other Romance language speakers. And singers are used to producing sounds in Italian, so they know what to do with their palate and tongue."

I'm curious to know what her pedagogic strategy is when working with a singer who has never performed in Czech. "We start with some basic pronunciation rulesthe usual suspects! The young artists from the Opera Center's Adler Fellows get a crash course that has been designed to teach them to read any text that's put in front of them. Czech is easy to pronounce so long as the air supply is constantly in motion because it's a percussive language. I've heard many singers telling me that once they start singing, it's like being on a treadmill."

During our conversation, Biancalana shows me her handwritten materials and electronic copies of her coaching notes, allowing me to follow the linguistic journey a singer might take. I am in awe at the level of detail: "I collect each singer's linguistic patterns during the first readthrough music rehearsal. Once we have time for one-onone coaching, we first work on just *speaking* the role. Only after that, we work with an accompanist and practice *singing* the role so that we can establish the architecture as to where the singer is going with each particular phrase."

When staging rehearsals for *Rusalka* begin, she relies on written notes only. Each singer will get them electronically, following each rehearsal: "By having all the notes organized by rehearsals," she explains, "they have a history of their own learning process and are able to study on their own. This is a very careful process, and some artists are not accustomed to working with a language coach up to opening night. But that's the level of detail we're looking for."

Biancalana's profound expertise on how to produce specific sounds in her native language comes from her background as a musician. She came to the U.S. from the Czech Republic to pursue her flute studies at Notre Dame de Namur University in Belmont, California, and found herself

more and more involved in the musical life of the Bay Area: "When I started coaching the Adler Fellows, it helped tremendously to be a singer and a flutist because I was already familiar with the importance of all the elementssuch as the tongue, the mask, how the sound moves through your vocal cords."

Music has been an integral part of Biancalana's life since her early days: "I was born in Hodonín, near the Austrian border, where the play of *Jenůfa* was written." At 14, she moved to Prague-a city whose history intrigues her: "One of the first universities in Europe was founded in Prague. And the city became a very popular cultural center at the time of Mozart, when a lot of theaters were already public so they were not under the patronage of specific families that would dictate what they wanted to have composed."

It is this intellectual depth and fascination that drives Biancalana's singing and language coaching. And she loves her work. "Yes, I do love it. Not only because I get immersed in my own culture, but because I can support the Rusalka artists identifying with it and using this cultural knowledge to catapult their roles and truly inhabit them." With this type of language training, she hopes these singers, when asked in the future if they want to perform works by Dvořák, Smetana or Janáček, they will say, yes, Czech, please!




RACHEL WILLIS-SØRENSEN (Richland, Washington)

She made her San Francisco Opera debut as Eva in Die Meistersinger von Nürnberg in 2015 and returns to the Company in her role debut as Rusalka. Willis-Sørensen began the current season with her role and Italian stage debut as Leonora at the Teatro Regio di Torino. 

The **OPERA BOX OFFICE** is located in the Opera House, 301 Van Ness Avenue, and is open Monday 10 AM–5 PM, Tuesday through Saturday 10 AM–6 PM, and through the first intermission on performance days. Tickets may also be charged by phone at (415) 864-3330 or ordered online at sfopera.com. We accept American Express, VISA, MasterCard, and Discover.

If you are unable to use your tickets to a particular performance, you may exchange them for tickets to another performance, subject to availability, or donate them back to the Opera. Ticket exchanges for future performances can be accommodated up to one hour before curtain or during the first intermission. No refunds are associated with ticket exchanges, and a fee (plus any price differential) may apply.

ACCESSIBILITY San Francisco Opera is committed to providing easy access for all of our patrons. Please contact the Opera Box Office prior to your visit so that we can ensure your comfort. For Patrons in Wheelchairs, San Francisco Opera offers wheelchair-accessible seats at a range of prices. All entrances at the War Memorial Opera House are wheelchair accessible. Wheelchairaccessible stalls in restrooms can be found on all floors (except the Main Lobby and 5th floor Balcony levels). Accessible drinking fountains are located on all floors except the Balcony level.

LISTENING DEVICES Assistive listening devices are available at the North and South Lobby coat checks. ID deposit required.

LIVE TITLES: TEXT-TO-VOICE SUPERTITLES Headsets that provide a spoken version of the supertitles are available at the North Lobby coat check.

DINING & REFRESHMENTS Global Gourmet operates pre-show and intermission food and beverage concession services in lobby areas. Beginning two hours prior to all performances, Prelude at the Opera House in the lower lounge offers a changing seasonal buffet, as well as elevated *à la carte* dishes for pre-performance dining and intermission. The North Box Restaurant on the North Mezzanine (Box) level features locally sourced California cuisine with global influences.

Audiences may enjoy purchased beverages inside the auditorium in the appropriate containers. Outside food and drink are prohibited.

The **SAN FRANCISCO OPERA SHOP**, located in the South Mezzanine lobby, front lobby, and North Dress Circle of the Opera House, sells opera CDs, DVDs, SF Opera merchandise, and gift items. The Shop is open 90 minutes before performances, at intermissions, and afterward. All proceeds benefit San Francisco Opera. **COAT CHECK** A coat check for your convenience is located at the North and South ends of the main lobby. For the safety and comfort of our audience, large bags are strongly discouraged and are subject to search.

COURTESY TELEPHONE, for local calls only, is located in the main lobby across from the South passenger elevator.

DRINKING FOUNTAINS are available on all levels except the Lower level, where there is a courtesy water station on the north side. Water bottles are permitted in the auditorium.

OPERA GLASSES may be rented for \$5 at the North Lobby coat check. ID deposit is requested.

LARGE-PRINT CAST SHEETS AND SYNOPSES are available at the coat check stations in the main lobby.

FIRST AID STATION is located on the South Lower level. In case of emergency, please ask the nearest usher to assist you.

LOST AND FOUND items may be claimed at the North coat check during the performance. All unclaimed items are delivered to the War Memorial Performing Arts Center at 401 Van Ness Ave., Room 110, (415) 621-6600 (8 AM–5 PM, Monday–Friday).



TRUSTING IN THE FUTURE OF OPERA

pera companies should exist in a symbiotic relationship with the communities they serve: they have over time been the beating heart of cities, the gathering place for peoples, and an expression of the zeitgeist of a community. However, such a relationship between opera and community is not a given. It only happens when the community trusts that the company is producing work of meaning and value.



As we approach our centennial in

2022–23, it is imperative that we build trust between opera and community. To that end, the board and staff, headed by the board's Vice President, Lisa Erdberg, have been working on the creation of a new mission and vision for San Francisco Opera—a clear expression of why we exist and what we value. I'm so excited by what has transpired a strategic framework to guide us into our next century.

Our new mission statement is a credo, a heartfelt expression of our essential purpose:

We believe opera is a uniquely compelling, entertaining and emotionally thrilling art form. Our mission is to bring together growing audiences to experience opera's transformative power.

It's a celebration of the power of opera to move people to deep emotions, to thrill with spectacle, and to connect audiences, existing and new, in singular moments of soaring art. This is the fundamental promise of our art form.

Then comes our new vision statement. This is an aspirational expression of where we're heading in the coming decade. It is bold and succinct:

To crack the code on producing big art in the 21st century.

It expresses a fundamental need:. how do we ensure that the "big art" uniqueness of what we do is sustained and furthered in this new century? We tell big stories on a big stage with big emotions and a big impact. We are privileged to produce opera on one of the largest canvasses in the world and we need to find the replicable way to do that in the 21st century.

Being successful in this vision will require both respect for the legacy of excellence that has so defined our first hundred years, and a vision and courage for what we can become in a new century.

The mission and the vision are the key elements of our strategic framework. But we also articulated six values that will guide our priorities in the course of the next decade:

- Pioneering new approaches to producing largescale opera
- Striving for the highest standards of artistic integrity and excellence
- Fostering a positive, collaborative, diverse, inclusive organization
- Developing new audiences and creating dynamic audience relationships
- Creating impactful reciprocal connections with the community through education and engagement
- Upholding fiscal rigor and sound management as prerequisites for creativity

Finally, and something I'm particularly excited about, is an expression of our personality: what we stand for, what defines our identity as an organization, and what guides every interaction we have:

Creative, Bold, Inspiring, Welcoming, Excellent

These are the personality traits that you should expect from us at all times and I urge you to let us know if we're falling short in any area, or if you experience something that you feel particularly exemplifies these traits.

This is just the beginning of our journey. There is much exciting art and work ahead as we look to ensure that we are the beating heart of our community. This new strategic framework is a wonderful encapsulation of our commitment to forge a bold new path ahead and I look forward to being on this thrilling journey with you.
