## At a Glance

#### LOHENGRIN

#### MUSIC AND LIBRETTO BY RICHARD WAGNER

**Structure:** 3 acts, with 2 intermissions **Running time:** 4 hours, 20 minutes

Language: Sung in German, with English supertitles

#### **Key Characters:**

- Elsa, Princess of Brabant, accused of murdering her brother
- · Lohengrin, a mysterious knight and Elsa's protector
- · Ortrud, a pagan priestess who schemes against Elsa
- · Telramund, Ortrud's husband, a pawn in her intrigues
- · Heinrich, King of Germany

Rooted in an episode from the tenth century when a German king united the country to repel foreign invaders, *Lohengrin* elevates historical events into a mythic tale featuring mystic elements including Knights of the Holy Grail. On the surface, the plot resembles a medieval fairy tale with magic spells, a damsel in distress, a knight in shining armor, and a trial by combat. Yet, more than spectacle or pageantry, it is the intimate relationships of the characters that are at the heart of this deeply moving story. The work's dramatic impetus is driven by Elsa's love for her protector, Lohengrin, whom she marries under the stipulation that she never ask his name or where he comes from. *Lohengrin* explores the nature and the limits of blind faith and true love.

Wagner frames the stage action in the opera with an expansive orchestral prelude before the first act and a vigorous, exhilarating prelude that opens the last act. Both are monumental in scope, with an ecstatic brilliance and ethereal strangeness that only an iconoclast like Wagner had the ambition to imagine. Director David Alden's staging of the work moves the action from a medieval, Germanic setting to a midtwentieth-century European state at war.

**Did you know?** Due to his political agitations during the European revolutions of 1848, Wagner was living in exile when *Lohengrin* had its world premiere in Weimar, Germany in 1850. Despite the work's immediate popularity and multiple productions around Germany, the composer did not actually see his opera performed until 11 years later when he attended a performance in Vienna in 1861.

Thank you to all of you who participated and made it so memorable. From there we surged forward with Mason Bates and Mark Campbell's high energy portrayal of the triumphs and tribulations of a tech icon in *The (R)evolution of Steve Jobs*.

We would like to offer sincere thanks to all of you who support San Francisco Opera. You, the community of San Francisco, have collectively sustained this company for the last hundred years. 





nce again, the unprecedented generosity of Cynthia and John Gunn has set the stage for a dazzling season at San Francisco Opera. Since 2002, when John joined the Opera Board, the couple has underwritten numerous productions and provided exceptional support for many of the Company's innovative endeavors. In September 2008, the Gunns made a historic commitment—believed to be the largest gift ever made by individuals to an American opera company—to help fund the signature projects of then General Director David Gockley, including new operas and productions, multimedia projects, and outreach programs, and they have proudly continued that support for General Director Matthew Shilvock. This season, the Gunns' inspired generosity is helping make possible four productions—Il Trovatore, The (R)evolution of Steve Fobs, Lohengrin, and The Magic Flute. The Gunns invite everyone to give and join them as a member of San Francisco Opera's donor community. John comments, "Opera is a dynamic art form, and all of us play a role in keeping it a meaningful part of our social fabric. With you we can propel San Francisco Opera into its next 100

years of artistic history." John is the former chairman and CEO of Dodge & Cox Investment Managers. He joined the firm in 1972, the year he received his MBA from Stanford Business School and married Cynthia, who graduated from Stanford with an A.B. in political science in 1970. Early in her career, Cynthia was the editor and director of *The Portable* Stanford book series for 10 years. She edited 28 books by Stanford professors on a vast array of topics, including Economic Policy Beyond the Headlines by George Shultz and Ken Dam. In addition to their support of San Francisco Opera, the Gunns are active members of the community. John is a former trustee of Stanford University and is Chairman Emeritus of the Advisory Board for the Stanford Institute for Economic Policy Research. Cynthia currently serves as a trustee of the Fine Arts Museums of San Francisco, is a former overseer of Stanford's Hoover Institution, and has been a member of the advisory board of Family and Children Services and the board of the Lucile Packard Foundation for Children's Health. Opera lovers are grateful to Cynthia and John and applaud their commitment to keeping San Francisco Opera a leading-edge company.

## Barbara A. Wolfe

arbara Wolfe has been a longtime opera fan and supporter of San Francisco Opera. Works of Mozart and Wagner, and operas in the classical Italian tradition are particular favorites. Most recently, Barbara supported the Company's new productions of La Traviata, Don Giovanni, and Tosca, as well as the 2018 Ring cycle and Die Frau ohne Schatten. ## **Donor Spotlight**



#### Jerome and Thao Dodson (Production Sponsor, Lohengrin)

"A fiery horse with the speed of light, a cloud of dust, and a hearty, 'Hi-Yo, Silver!"

Those words, accompanied by the galloping excitement of Rossini's *William Tell* Overture, transfixed a young Jerry Dodson as he listened to *The Lone Ranger* on the family radio in Oak Park, Illinois. Just as Bugs Bunny's *Rabbit of Seville* had done for many, a lighthearted entertainment sparked a future operatic devotion.

That little boy grew up to attend Berkeley in the 60s, serve with the American Embassy in Vietnam where he and Thao met, and attend Harvard Business School. Eventually, the couple married, settled in the Bay Area, and raised a family. In the 1980s, Jerry was a pioneer in the field of socially responsible investing with little interest in

opera. But in 1992, when San Francisco Opera decided to celebrate Rossini's bicentennial with the rarely performed *Guillaume Tell*, Thao, already an opera lover, suggested to Jerry that they go.

*Tell* was praised for its striking Mansouri production, and the Dodsons began attending regularly. They became season ticket holders in 1999 and supporters, "in a small way," as Jerry puts it. A friendship with David Gockley, which endures to this day, led to a larger role as Company Sponsors. "I so admired what he did for the opera, but it was not very good for my pocketbook," Jerry laughs. Jerry also lends his financial expertise to the audit committee.

In 2016, Dodson considered the import of Gockley's departure. He met with Matthew Shilvock and joined the Board that year. "We hit it off right away!" Jerry says. He felt a similar affinity with Keith Geeslin, then President of the San Francisco Opera Association. Eager to continue support, the Dodsons see this as a perfect time to revitalize and energize the Company within the San Francisco community. The initial fire ignited by *William Tell* continues to burn brightly.



**Burgess & Elizabeth Jamieson (Production Sponsor, Lohengrin)** 

Libby and Burgess Jamieson have made an extraordinary commitment to San Francisco Opera for more than three decades by supporting traditional classical productions. Their ongoing generosity has ensured an enduring place on the War Memorial Opera House stage for such applauded and memorable works as *Die Meistersinger von Nürnberg, Il Trittico, La Bohème, Madame Butterfly, Turandot, Tosca,* and *La Traviata*. #### Bernard & Barbro Osher (Production Sponsor, Lohengrin)

A native of Maine, Bernard Osher became involved with San Francisco Opera as a subscriber over 50 years ago, shortly after moving here from New York. He and his wife, Barbro, a native of Sweden, have supported every aspect of the Company's work, from artist appearances to production facilities to audience building programs. 

#### **TAMBOURINE \$22**

Encircled by repeating pairs of metal discs, the "22" level is inspired by the prominence of the tambourine in the opera. Most scholars agree that the origins of the tambourine date back to 1700 BCE or even earlier, and it appears in sacred texts from West Africa, Turkey, Greece, Italy, India, and throughout the Middle East.



#### **KUFI \$120**

The traditional hat worn by Omar in the opera is called a Kufi from the Kufi script it resembles. It plays a significant role in the opera as Julie, an enslaved woman, becomes close to him. The Kufi script is thought to have gone into general use in the 12th century. The hat is a part of the national dress of many West African countries and symbolizes African descent in many American cultures.

#### **AKONTING \$517**

The akonting is an African gourd lute known as the ancestor of the modern banjo played by co-composer Rhiannon Giddens, who studied the instrument. The three strings of the akonting are tuned to the pattern 5-1-7, which inspires the name for this level! (7-note scale with 7th, 5th, and 1st notes.)



The best known of the scholar Omar Ibn Said's writings is his autobiographical essay, "The Life of Omar Ibn Said." Written in 1831, the work forms the basis of the opera.



In honor of co-composer Rhiannon Giddens' frequent genre, bluegrass. Bluegrass was born out of North American blues music which was directly influenced by West African music. Recognized as a new American art form in the 1940s, bluegrass is a fusion of music styles and experiences, much like the fusion of opera, Senegalese, and American styles found in *Omar*.



#### TAMA \$7.280

The Senegalese tama, or talking drum, is known to project sounds imitating human speech across a seven-to-eight kilometer distance, or 7-2-8. Omar ibn Said was originally abducted from West Africa, in the Futa Toro region (modern-day Senegal) where the tama is played widely and used to send messages as well as make music.



#### OLIVE TREE \$30,000+

Omar sings of the olive tree during the moment of darkness when his humanity is attacked, "The example of His light is like a niche within which is a lamp, which is within a glass, which is like a brilliant star fueled by a blessed tree, an olive tree, neither Eastern nor Western, whose oil would almost glow, even if untouched by fire." The themes of our shared humanity can be seen in the symbol of the olive tree.



## Lohengrin

#### ACT I

King Heinrich, in Brabant to raise an army, calls on Friedrich von Telramund to explain why the country is wracked by strife. Telramund claims that Elsa, daughter of the late ruler of Brabant, has murdered her brother, Gottfried, the heir of Brabant and ward of Telramund. Convinced of Elsa's guilt, Telramund has married Ortrud and staked his claim to the kingdom. Elsa is summoned to defend herself and tells of a vision she has had of a knight who will be her champion. Twice the Herald calls on the knight to appear, but only after Elsa has added her prayer does he arrive, borne in on a swan. The stranger announces that he has come to vindicate Elsa and to be her husband—but only if Elsa never asks him his name or where he is from. Elsa agrees. To establish her innocence, the stranger defeats Telramund in combat.

#### -INTERMISSION-

#### ACT II

Cast out and banished, Telramund broods on his defeat and blames Ortrud for ensnaring him in her plot for the throne. Ortrud defends herself and convinces Telramund that the stranger won the battle through trickery. When Elsa appears, Ortrud insidiously ingratiates herself with Elsa, laying seeds of doubt as to her mysterious knight. Offering forgiveness and friendship, Elsa leads Ortrud into her chambers.

The Herald tells the Brabantian men of Telramund's banishment, stirs up patriotic fervor, and persuades them to join King Heinrich's army. Joyful preparations are made for the wedding. As Elsa prepares to enter the cathedral with her bridal procession, Ortrud halts the festivities, claiming that the "nameless knight" is an imposter. The king intercedes but then Telramund bursts into the crowd, accusing the stranger of sorcery. Put under enormous pressure, Elsa remains strong and assures her champion of her faith in him. The King leads the couple into the cathedral.

#### -INTERMISSION-

#### ACT III

Elsa and her Knight are ushered into the bridal chamber to the famous bridal chorus. As they express their love, Elsa's anxiety slowly grows. Seized by the need to know his identity, she begs him to reveal his name. Suddenly Telramund invades the bedroom and attacks the stranger but is himself slain. Elsa's distraught husband says that he will meet her with the King to answer her questions.

As King Heinrich gathers the armies for the coming battle, the body of Telramund is carried in, followed by Elsa, pale and silent. Her husband arrives, revealing Telramund's treachery and the news that Elsa has asked the "forbidden questions." He declares that he is one of the Knights of the Holy Grail and that it is his duty to defend those, like Elsa, who are beset by evil. He is the son of Parsifal, and his name is Lohengrin. Elsa's promise having been broken, he must now return home to Monsalvat. As the swan returns to carry him home, Lohengrin bids Elsa a painful farewell. Ortrud rushes in declaring that the swan is actually Elsa's brother, Gottfried, whom she cursed. Lohengrin brings Elsa's brother back to human form and proposes that Gottfried be the new leader of Brabant. He sets off on his long journey back to the castle of the Grail, leaving behind a grief-stricken Elsa and the hope and promise of Gottfried.

# A Grand Opera for the Modern World

n irony of Wagner's career is that his most performed music drama until the 1930s was modeled on a genre he despised, grand opera. This dislike arose in part from the French genre's dependence on pageantry and spectacle, which was the main cause of its international appeal. Wagner's resentment was sharpened by his animosity toward Giacomo Meyerbeer, grand opera's most popular composer, to French culture in general, and from his perception of grand opera's musical and dramatic shortcomings. Nevertheless, Wagner's first great success, *Rienzi* (Dresden, 1842), was considered by many to be the acme of grand opera, and, as his career progressed, he seemed unwilling to abandon the genre, above all, in the composition of *Lohengrin*.

The music drama's setting of 10th-century Brabant required the detailed, historical scenic and costume designs that mid-19th-century audiences loved. Wagner employed large-scale social celebrations, such as public

to the audience as well, and the purpose of the play is to reveal the secret. Through an initial exposition, the backstory to the tale is explained, followed by a series of ever-intensifying crises leading to a major confrontation that has been anticipated from the start—the *scène obligatoire*, or obligatory (necessary) scene—followed by a denouement in which the secret is revealed.

Wagner's libretto to *Lohengrin* follows the techniques of the well-made play with almost obsessive precision. It begins first with the political background, followed by Elsa's trial (exposition). She is saved by the miraculous advent of Lohengrin, who defeats Telramund and offers to marry Elsa if she never asks him his name or origin (secret). Act II is composed of a series of rising climaxes in which Elsa's confidence in Lohengrin is ruthlessly undermined by Ortrud. The obligatory scene is the confrontation between Elsa and Lohengrin in Act III, followed by the killing of Telramund and the denouement when Lohengrin explains who he is, and the political

prayers, trials, duels, elaborate processions, and the mustering of troops, as well as spectacular orchestral interludes, to create on stage a bustling world of social, political, and military activity. This, too, delighted audiences, as did the intrigue between the principals, in which personal desires and ambitions are intertwined with public events. All were salient features of grand opera.

Lohengrin also displayed Wagner's mastery of another ubiquitous genre of the 19th-century European lyric and spoken theater, which originated in France—the pièce bien-faite, or well-made play; indeed, arguably it is the best example of this model not only in Wagner's output but in the entire 19th-century operatic repertoire. The action of the well-made play usually revolves around a secret that is unknown to almost all characters, and often

situation is resolved as he restores Gottfried, the rightful Duke of Brabant, to his people. It is the most tightly plotted of all Wagner's music dramas. The gripping action unfolds with an inevitability leading to the parting of Lohengrin and death of Elsa, which is the bleakest tragic ending in Wagner. In *Lohengrin* Wagner meticulously combines the spectacle of grand opera and the rigorous tightness of the well-made play as no other composer did.

However, the greatness of *Lohengrin* does not reside in how precisely Wagner followed "foreign" models but in how he transcended them. Both grand opera and the well-made play tend to become mechanical, driven either by the need for spectacle or a perfectly constructed plot in which characters are more cogs in the action than self-determining individuals. Wagner resisted these tendencies.

First, the political and military background to the action were not a matter of indifference to Wagner's audience but a vital concern. In 1850, when Lohengrin was first performed in Weimar, Germany was still a fragmented assemblage of nation-states, large and small. In 1848-49, a national Parliament in Frankfurt had attempted to create a state that would unify all Germanspeakers but failed, mainly due to in-fighting. However, the prospect of German unity was still in the air. The symbolic figure who served as an inspiration for the nationalist movement was none other than Henry the Fowler, the King in Lohengrin. As Duke of Saxony (912-936) and King of East Francia (919-936), Henry had ignited German nationalist ambitions and almost 900 years later was still considered to be the symbolic founder of the German state. While most grand opera was distinctly conservative and rejected the voices of change, Lohengrin's nationalism appealed to the liberal segments of German society. The work spoke more to current affairs than to history.

The durability of Wagner's music drama arises from the dramaturgical and musical changes he initiated. Characters in most grand operas are not particularly heroic or resilient, they lack inner strength and wholeness and capitulate too easily to oppressive forces. Wagner—and Verdi for that matter—introduced characters of a different mettle, not necessarily figures of unalloyed goodness but full of spirit, courage, and will-power, carrying drama inside themselves as well as participating in external struggles. The most striking examples of these figures in *Lohengrin* are Telramund and his wife, Ortrud. Ortrud stands for the dark forces of paganism that are striving to overcome nascent





Christianity, while Telramund, a prototype for the modern anti-hero, is a man crippled by inner division, unable to do what he knows is right and helplessly dependent on his wife. Meanwhile, Elsa, who is technically the hero of the drama, undergoes a radical and disturbing transformation from idealistic young woman to one who fully knows the pain the outer world can impose on the inner. Her emotional growth is what drives the action. We feel deeply the agony caused by her indecision and ignorance of Lohengrin's name, and as great political changes occur because of this, we come to care acutely about the human cost of conflicts in the larger world. Character drives the action more than the need for spectacle.

Above all, Wagner's score brings urgency consequence to the action. In Lohengrin he continues the process, already started in Der Fliegende Holländer and *Tannhäuser* of abandoning the formal structures of aria, duet, ensemble, and chorus, to achieve a stream of action that is unbroken by the closure of discrete musical forms. He is already adept in his composition and treatment of the *leitmotif*—listen especially to the versatility with which he treats the banned question melody-and uses the orchestra to establish the characteristic music for each figure. King Henry is the most conventional; he sings with the authoritative tone of a grand opera ruler, with a confidence that is matched by the ever-present chorus. Lohengrin is a less realistic character; he is characterized by the extraordinarily refined, high strings that we first hear in the celebrated prelude; while Lohengrin becomes embroiled in the emotional turmoil of the secular world, his voice seems always to occupy the sublime realms of perfect trust and transcendent being, a space that

tragically cannot be visited by any human. Lohengrin's notably high tessitura is complemented by Elsa's equally high soprano, suggesting that she dwells imaginatively in the otherworldly domain that he comes from. She does not take on the darker, sinister tones of Ortrud, but as her high-pitched tones oscillate between her desire for Lohengrin and her rising panic at the sinister dilemma she finds herself in, we follow with appalled sympathy her psychological collapse.

But what is most remarkable in Wagner's character music is his restriction of the conversational style of dialogue that would be so distinctive and radical a feature of the *Ring* mainly to Ortrud and Telramund. In the great scene at the beginning of Act II as the couple plot Elsa's downfall, we hear more directly than anywhere else in early Wagner how music can trace and express the flow of thought and the subversive power of unspoken, even unconscious human volition. Such music also increases our regard for and attention to Telramund and Ortrud, so that while they remain villains, we understand them and how they too are a necessary part of the human world.

While *Lohengrin* first appealed to the world as a splendidly composed grand opera, it survives today as a formidable psychological drama. Both grand opera and the well-made play presented audiences with a simplified moral perspective that did not question established values. Wagner questioned those norms and in so doing made tragedy out of melodrama.

oprano Julie Adams, who makes her role debut as Elsa this fall, feels right at home in the lyric roles of Richard Wagner. The California native credits legend Marilyn Horne as the first to recognize her true fach. Horne, who brought Adams to the Music Academy of the West for *The Magic Flute*, told her, "Darling, you're singing Pamina now, but you're going to be great doing Wagner and the Slavic roles one day." As early as 2015, when Adams sang "Einsam in trüben Tagen" on her way to winning the Elizabeth Connell Prize, her rich, glowing tone, riveting blend of vulnerability and passion and ease in riding the wave of Wagner's surging vocal lines made it clear where she was headed. "It's nice to be at that age where I'm in my prime and singing those roles of 'You're going to be a great this one day," she says. "So 'one day' is now, and here I am!"

Adams' bright eyes, brilliant smile and blond good looks lend themselves ideally to the youthful, romantic heroines she plays, but her connection to character is far more than skin deep. "Coming from a theater background, I just take it to the story," she says of her preparation process. "If there are any source materials, I try to get as many books as I can, so I can make my own view of who the character is. Then I go to the music, I learn my pitches, and oftentimes I'll take it to a coach. Only then, when I feel confident enough in the music, will I start to listen to recordings, just to see how the greats have phrased it. I like to research the heck out of my shows to really make my own version of the character stand out.

"I think there's a pureness to Elsa—a sense of innocence that is really beautiful, and that's shown in her music," she says. In the case of Elsa, she also feels a personal affinity. "I was telling my husband last night, 'She's just like me—she *has* to know his name at the end. I don't think I could be patient enough to just sit there and go 'Sure.' So I love it when she finally is so impatient she just says 'What's your name????"

Adams was thrilled to have a chance to prepare the role in advance with conductor Eun Sun Kim. "When they said, 'Maestro wants to work with you on this,' I was so excited













because that's a very rare opportunity. In the olden days, the greats would have that luxury. If they were debuting a role, they would get to work with the conductor. We were able to really dissect the score, not be rushed, and work on fine details. It has been an incredible experience to work with someone of her caliber and to see the passion for this music—her passion, and my passion as well."

Adams' first musical leanings were not operatic. "When I was about nine, my mother put me in summer musical-theater programs, and I fell in love. I was going to be a Broadway superstar," she says with a laugh. Her horizons opened up after she persuaded her parents to let her attend a performing-arts high school. "Musical theater was an elective. You couldn't major in it—you had to focus on either opera or vocal jazz. Opera did a musical in the spring, so I said, 'I'll just put up with the opera to be in the musical.'

That was my first experience of opera. When I auditioned for colleges, they were like, 'Your voice is so strong—you need to be auditioning for the voice department.'" Adams spent one year at Cal State Northridge, then transferred to the San Francisco Conservatory of Music to further her studies as a classical singer. "Musical theater is wonderful," she says, "but there is something about the music of opera that just pierces right to your soul."

"I always say opera chooses you—you don't choose opera," she adds. "It's really funny to be doing this as long as I have and still giggle when I say 'I'm an opera singer."

Adams recently made her mark in Europe: in 2020, on short notice, she was offered a contract at Staatstheater Braunschweig, where she sang Rusalka and Cio-Cio-San. "It was great," she says. "I didn't really have time to think or freak out—I just *did*. You realize quickly that it's much better to just get up and sing. Singers love to overthink and micromanage. Of course you have to think of some technique—what's the arc of my character, what's the arc of the music, how much do I have to give?—but at the end of the day, when I'm onstage, I am not trying to think of 'Oh gosh, I have to sing this high B.' My job is to tell a story and be in the moment, and when you sing from the heart, most of the time that's the best singing you'll do."

"It's such a process from when you're learning the music to when you finally get up there onstage," she adds. "Of course, it's wonderful at the end to hear people applaud. Everyone loves that. But for me what's almost more rewarding is the personal growth—just seeing where I started and taking this out of basically notes on a page to making art and making music."

Adams, who studied at San Francisco Conservatory of Music and has impressed San Francisco Opera audiences in roles such as Freia and Mimì, is delighted to be back on her old stomping-grounds. "I feel such a sense of homecoming," she says. "San Francisco has always had a special place in my heart. I lived here for 12 years, doing the Merola Opera Program and being a San Francisco Opera Adler Fellow, so I was truly humbled to be back for this. It's amazing to hear people say, 'Oh Julie, you've grown up!"

"A role debut, especially given the size and caliber of this house, is nerve-wracking," she notes, "but they're so supportive and welcoming here. They want me to do well just as much as I want to do well."





# A Voyage with Giants

CAROLINE H. HUME MUSIC DIRECTOR EUN SUN KIM UNVEILS HER NEW VERDI AND WAGNER INITIATIVE

his fall San Francisco Opera embarks on a glorious adventure, starring two of the greatest composers in operatic history: Giuseppe Verdi and Richard Wagner. Beginning in 2023–24 with *Il Trovatore* and *Lohengrin*, Music Director Eun Sun Kim will conduct a Verdi and a Wagner opera each season well into the future.

No one is more excited about the Verdi/Wagner initiative than Kim herself. "It was my idea," she explains. "After I debuted here with *Rusalka* (2019), we talked through other possibilities. When I accepted this position, Wagner was there from the beginning. I wanted to add Verdi as I planned my ongoing collaboration with the orchestra."

Kim's goal in that collaboration is to set priorities that will lead to the artistic growth of the Company. In considering how Verdi and Wagner can help in achieving that goal, she begins by comparing this project with a symphony music director's cycles of Beethoven, Brahms, Schumann, or Mahler—"composers who showed enormous range within their own style as they developed." It's the same with Wagner and Verdi. Kim declares with great enthusiasm, "It will be wonderful to work with our orchestra on this repertoire on a long-term basis."

Examining any Verdi or Wagner score is meaningful to Kim because "they have such depth musically, and you can't detach the relationship between the music and the drama. The musical language simply *goes* with the drama! In bel canto opera, you have such beautiful melodies but not necessarily with real drama behind them." Wagner described his own works as "music drama," but for Kim that phrase clearly applies to Verdi as well.

Initially, the Company will present better-known Verdi operas. (As a "prelude," Kim led *La Traviata* last season.) The Verdi opera for 2023–24 is a longtime audience favorite, *Il Trovatore*, written in 1853—the same year as *Traviata*—when the composer was mid-career. "I'm hoping we'll move toward Verdi's later works eventually," says Kim, mentioning *Simon Boccanegra* as a work of particular interest.

Born in the same year (1813), Verdi and Wagner are described by Kim as "giants." That designation comes, above all, from her feeling that "their music moves our hearts." She's also especially invigorated by the rhythmic vitality that makes Verdi immensely enjoyable to perform, both for singers and orchestral musicians. One word figuring prominently in Kim's conversation is "nuance,"

particularly vital in Wagner. "In a Wagner score, you can find nearly 30 measures within which he might give only one musical indication, from *piano* to *crescendo*. How will you create the necessary nuances there? As opposed to Puccini, where in *La Bohème* he wrote four different musical indications in *one* bar."

In addition to *Traviata*, Kim's Verdi conducting to date has included *Rigoletto*, *Il Trovatore*, *Un Ballo in Maschera*, and the Requiem. In any Verdi work, she feels it is essential "to balance between bringing out the music's virtuosity and making the drama happen." She recognizes the excitement of the musically grand-scale, thrillingly impassioned episodes that abound in *Trovatore*, but she also appreciates the intimacy that Verdi makes possible: "His orchestra totally reflects the singers' emotion, the *internal* voice of the characters—that's what makes him one of the giants."

In *Trovatore*, Kim can't really pick a favorite moment, but she does especially relish the Manrico/Azucena duet in Act II, "which really *hurts* when you think about this story—it's really *doloroso* [painful]. That's a moment in the opera on which I am most concentrated. It's not only *doloroso* but

also sensitive and delicate as well, in presenting the relationship between these two characters."

It's often lamented that there are few great Verdi singers nowadays, but the Company's *Trovatore* artists have been triumphantly successful internationally in Verdi roles. Kim has worked previously with Ekaterina Semenchuk and George Petean, was a "first date" for her with the other three principals. Paraphrasing a quip from the legendary tenor Enrico Caruso, she notes that "I always joke that casting *Trovatore* is very easy—you just need to find the five best singers in the world," adding, "I really think we have those singers on our team!"

As for Wagner, his music was new to Kim when she arrived in Europe from her native Korea to finish her studies. "In Germany, Wagner came into my life. I had to get over all the clichés about Wagner being long, boring, difficult." Her first time conducting Wagner was an unexpected work, rarely heard today: *Das Liebesverbot*. "I don't feel I need to perform it again," she said of the composer's first staged opera, written at age 22, "but it was a great beginning in getting to know Wagner." That production in Meiningen was followed by *Der Fliegende Holländer*, first in Bergen and then

Frankfurt. It was a Bergen performance for students that showed Kim how Wagner could affect an audience. Her listeners, ranging in age from seven-year-olds to teenagers, were "so silent, so into the drama. At the end, it was like a rock concert—they went *crazy* over that music! Wagner speaks to kids, to adults, to everyone."

Kim is clearly delighted to launch the Wagner portion of the Verdi/Wagner initiative with her first *Lohengrin*, the work with which Wagner began to find his own style. "With *Holländer* and *Tannhäuse*r, Wagner was experimenting," Kim notes. "*Lohengrin* is the first piece where he's on the way to getting rid of 'numbers' [distinctly defined, self-contained arias and duets]." When Wagner wrote about the *Lohengrin* Act I prelude, "he said he wanted it to be '*erstmalig, einmalig, neuartig*' [as if for the first time, unique, new] and also *überirdisch* [unearthly, celestial]. That music is a perfect way to begin the opera."

Wagner composed magnificently for the *Lohengrin* chorus and Kim looks forward to working on this opera with the Company's choristers. "In our rehearsals we'll work on details, nuances, and on how we'll drive the drama forward."



Surprisingly, Kim finds *Lohengrin* relatable to contemporary lives. No matter that it was created nearly 175 years ago: "What makes us human beings hasn't drastically changed! Figures like Lohengrin, like Ortrud, are always present in our own time. As long as the storytelling is strong and it works onstage, I think the audience can connect with the piece very easily." She's reminded in that respect of last season's *Die Frau ohne Schatten*, where "you could feel the audience's energy, how connected they were to the drama. That's the power of a live performance and why we all gather together to experience it."

As with *Trovatore*, Kim can't wait to collaborate with the *Lohengrin* cast. "I haven't worked with [tenor] Simon O'Neill, but I've heard him perform a lot in Europe. There's such clarity in his voice, and what he does with the text makes the storytelling meaningful. Heldentenor repertoire is physically demanding and the singer must pace himself, yet without letting the audience think, 'Oh, now he's saving his energy to get to the end.' Simon understands this. I have huge respect for him." Opposite O'Neill is Julie Adams, a former San Francisco Opera Adler Fellow singing her first Elsa. "I've been working with her on the role since last summer. We're both people who are picky about the details—this work has been really exciting."

Kim hasn't seen the productions by Sir David McVicar (*Il Trovatore*) and David Alden (*Lohengrin*), but she conducted the McVicar *Rusalka* in San Francisco "and I admired its wonderful *Personenführung* [lit., "guidance of the characters"]. When seen in London, Alden's Lohengrin was hailed by Bachtrack's critic as "provoking far more thought and tension than any *Lohengrin* I've ever seen." Kim is "very, very excited to finally work with David Alden. Like David McVicar, he's totally connected with the *music* as well as the drama in all his productions."

In all the upcoming Verdi and Wagner repertoire, Kim knows that "what the audience gets from the live performances will always be different. For longtime subscribers, I hope experiencing these operas will be meaningful for them, and that they'll realize how closely the orchestra and I are connected—that we're a team. And for firstcomers, I hope these operas will be a special voyage of discovery. If one of our performances is a lifechanging moment for them, what more can I expect?"

# The Crucible of Great Artistry

n the first act of Wagner's *Siegfried*, the eponymous hero forges Nothung, the sword that will ultimately slay the dragon Fafner and shatter Wotan's spear. As Siegfried fans the flames of the furnace, he sings, "With showering sparks they shoot aloft, to fuse the splintered sword."



With this production of *Lohengrin*, we embark upon a thrilling journey into the operas of Wagner, all under the baton of Music Director Eun Sun Kim. It is a journey that will lead to our next *Ring* cycle, some years hence. The extraordinary promise of this journey makes me think about the role that San Francisco Opera has played over the years in forging our own Wagnerian tradition, out of the sparks created in this opera house. From our first *Ring* cycle in 1935, in which legendary Norwegian soprano Kirsten Flagstad sang her first cycle of Brünnhildes anywhere in the world, this company has been a great crucible of Wagnerian creativity.

Just in recent memory, our stage has been home to a number of important Wagnerian role debuts by singers like Brandon Jovanovich who sang here his first Walter in *Meistersinger*, his first Lohengrin, his first Siegmund in *Die Walküre*. Or Nina Stemme taking on her first full cycles of Brünnhilde in 2011, beautifully mirroring Flagstad.

The crucible of creativity also comes into its own in the training of young heroic voices that might eventually develop into Wagnerians. This is something we take very seriously as we select singers for both the Merola Opera Program (a 12-week summer training program) and our Adler Fellowship Program (usually a two-year residency). We place a particular importance on being a company that welcomes heroic young voices, even if that means something of a trade-off. Wagnerian voices generally take longer to develop and may be less suitable for the smaller roles for which we often use Adler Fellows onstage. This means that these Adlers can get less stage time than their peers. But the support and safe space of a training program

is exactly what these larger voices need if they are to develop into the great Wagnerians of tomorrow, following the likes of Deborah Voigt, Stuart Skelton, and Mark Delavan.

This commitment to training the Wagnerian voices of the future is evidenced in our two lead roles in *Lohengrin*. Simon O'Neill was a member of the Merola Opera Program in 2002

and Julie Adams was a Merolina in 2014 becoming an Adler Fellow in 2015 and 2016. Simon is well established as one of the great Wagner tenors of our generation, and Julie is emerging as a very exciting Wagnerian (if you attended our 2018 *Ring*, you've already heard her as Freia and Gerhilde). Even once a singer leaves the Adler program, we take their training very seriously. Julie has been working in coachings with Eun Sun Kim for several months now as she prepares for this important role debut as Elsa in *Lohengrin*. It's so important that we nurture new, exciting talents like Julie's.

It's not just the singers that exist in this crucible of artistic possibility. We have many new people coming into the Orchestra and Chorus at the moment, following a number of retirements. Having a journey through the Wagner operas allows Eun Sun Kim to develop a stylistic fluency in the Orchestra and Chorus as new members take on these works for the first time, and the ensembles as a whole find these operas afresh, together.

Likewise, for every devoted Wagnerite in our audience who has seen numerous Wagner operas, there will be dozens of attendees who are discovering this opera and Wagner for the first time tonight. That is thrilling!


