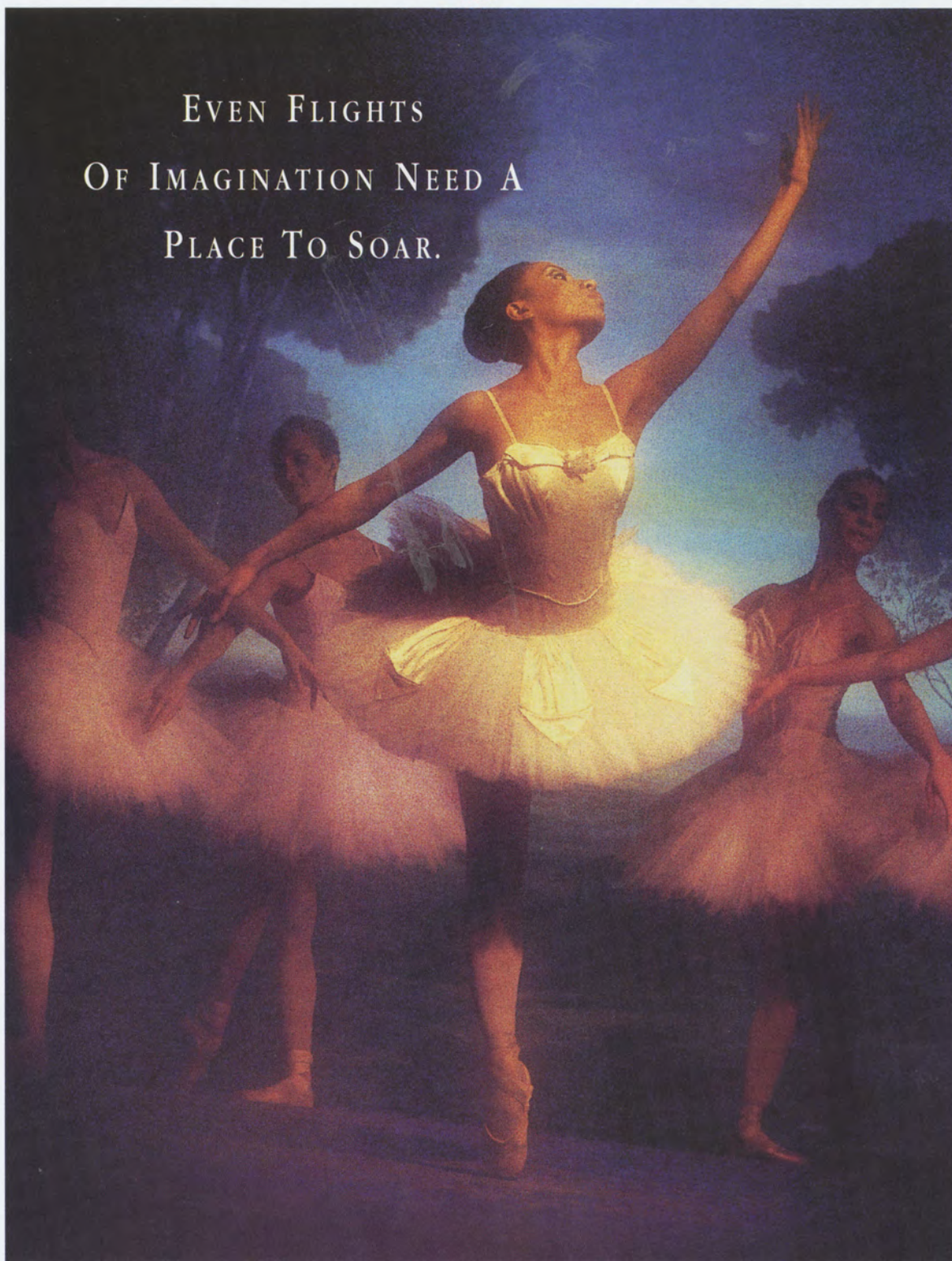
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A MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIRMAN AND PRESIDENT, SAN FRANCISCO OPERA ASSOCIATION

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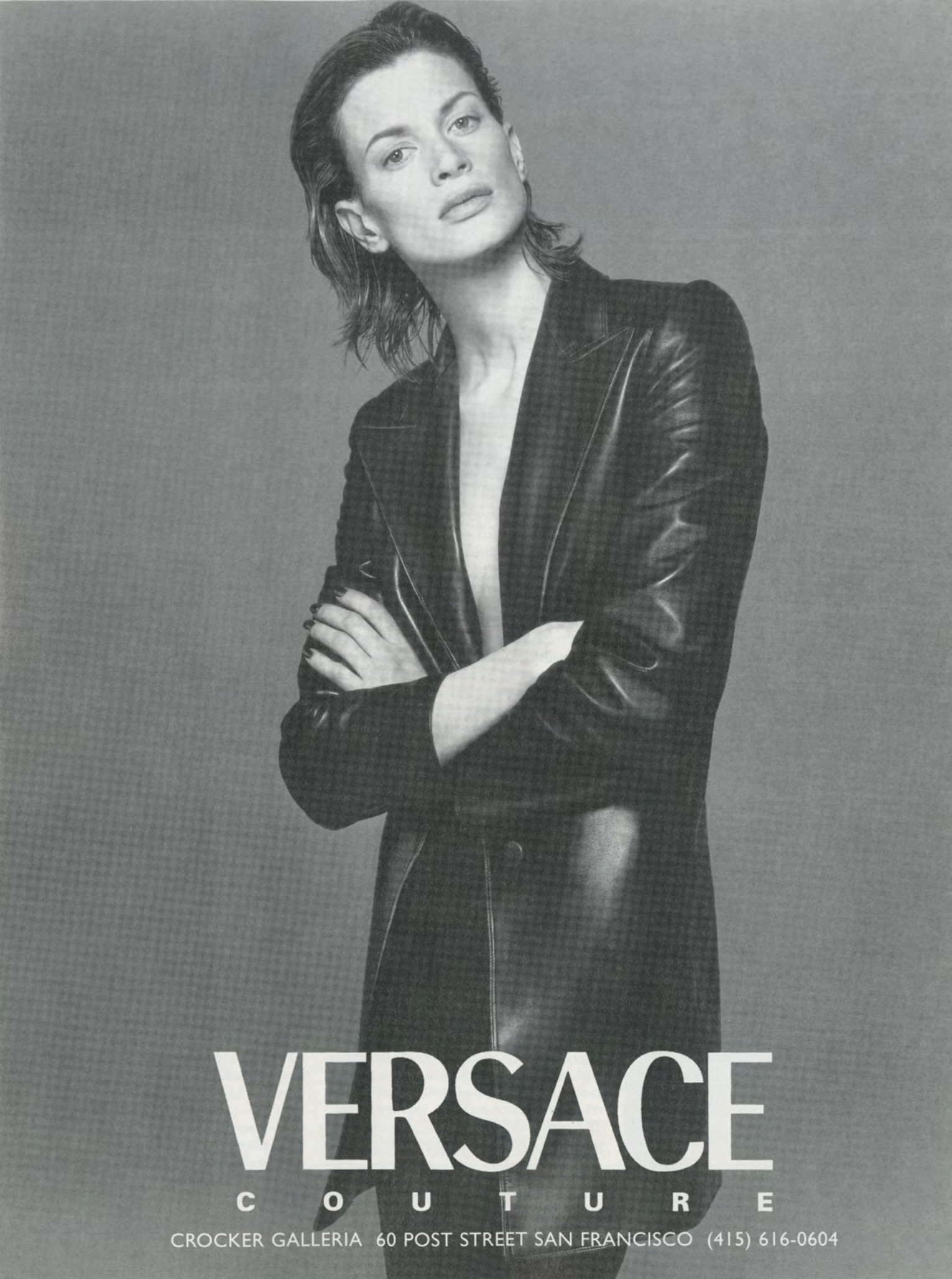
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Ahead of its Time

A REVOLUTIONARY OPERA—that is how Verdi would describe *Rigoletto* in the years to come after its premiere. At first sight this seems like an exaggeration.

There are no revolutions in Italian opera comparable to the one accomplished in Germany by Wagner's *Das Rheingold*, which dates from the same decade. Audiences throughout the Italian Peninsula had a set of expectations which no composer could afford to disregard. Yet within these limits Verdi's seventeenth opera did indeed blaze a number of fresh trails, thereby acquiring a stamp of modernity that remained to impress listeners even in the years preceding the Verdi renaissance of the 1920s, when the composer's reputation was at a low ebb and only *Otello*, *Falstaff* and the Requiem were thought worthy of serious attention. One of

the opera's keenest admirers was Edward Elgar.

The subject of Victor Hugo's play first occurred to Verdi in 1849, the year in which he set up as a man of property, freed from the theatrical rat race and able to write merely when he felt inclined to do so. He proposed it to Vincenzo Flauto, impresario of the Teatro San Carlo, Naples, as a possible successor to *Luisa Miller*, already scheduled for the current autumn season—"a fine drama with marvelous situations" was how he put it. His suggestion was duly passed on to Salvatore Cammarano, the theater's resident poet who, however, had his doubts ("I've

read *Le Roi s'amuse* again. . . . but what about the censorship?" In such matters Cammarano was nothing if not a realist. As one who had removed the religious and political stings from Voltaire's *Alzire* and Schiller's *Kabale und Liebe* for Verdi's benefit [Luisa Miller], he realized that Hugo's piece was far more dangerous than either. After a stormy reception at its first night in 1832, the play had been suppressed by the government on the grounds of immorality. In a preface to the printed edition, the poet rebutted the charge at length. His argument may be summarized as follows: Triboulet, court jester to King François I of France, has a divided nature. As a hunchback, he is bitterly resentful of all who are not similarly deformed; his constant aim, therefore, is to set his fellow men against one another. He urges his royal master to every kind of vice so that, in Hugo's words, "in the hands of Triboulet, the king is nothing but an all-powerful puppet who destroys the lives of all those among whom his jester sets him." But there is another side to Triboulet; he has a daughter, the one being in the world whom he loves, and whom he tries to bring up in virtue and innocence. One day he mocks the nobleman, Saint-Vallier, whose daughter, Diane de Poitiers, the king had seduced. The old man raises his arms and

curses the mocker, and the curse falls on Triboulet the father, not the jester. What could be more moral than that?

It is an ingenious defense, but it overlooks an important fact. Saint-Vallier curses both Triboulet and the king, but the king goes scot-free. At any rate, it is nonsense to describe François I, one of the most powerful monarchs in Europe, as a puppet. The sharp intelligence that gleams from Jean Clouet's famous portrait is enough to give such a notion the lie. The play, however, shows him behaving outrageously and irresponsibly. That such a portrait of royalty should be permitted in conservative Naples, ruled by a Bourbon monarch, especially in the years following the defeat of the 1848

uprising, was unthinkable. Even in Venice, under the comparatively tolerant regime of the Austrians in 1844, royal dignity was jealously guarded. In Verdi's *Ernani*, another Hugo subject that had its premiere that year at the Teatro La Fenice, the character of Don Carlo [Charles V], king of Spain, had to be softened in respect of the original play. All suggestions of profligacy were removed from his wooing of Donna Elvira; nor was he allowed to hide in a cupboard! Such changes in no way damaged the opera; indeed they may even be said to have improved it, giving a certain consistency to the character of the monarch that is lacking in the verse drama. But, as Verdi was later to point out, the royal seducer of *Le Roi s'amuse* must remain an out-and-out libertine, otherwise the plot makes no sense.

Anyway, it was at Venice that he decided to stage his opera once the Neapolitan contract had fallen through, with Piave, not Cammarano, as his collaborator, to whom he waxed ever more enthusiastic. "It's a subject which, if the police would permit it, would be one of the greatest creations of modern theater. Who knows? They permitted *Ernani*; they might permit this too, and here there wouldn't be any conspiracies." And later, "Oh, *Le Roi s'amuse* is the greatest subject, perhaps even the greatest drama of

modern times. Triboulet is a creation worthy of Shakespeare!"—than which Verdi could bestow no higher praise.

What were the qualities that attracted Verdi so strongly to the play? First of all, surely, the "divided nature" of the protagonist. Up to then his leading characters had been relatively monochromatic, actuated by similar impulses throughout. Triboulet gave him the opportunity of filling out a personality in all its human contradictions. Then, too, the play is a drama of paternity, a relationship which never failed to evoke a deep response from a man who had lost both his children in their infancy; hence his long-held but ultimately unrealized ambition to write a *Re Lear*. Lastly, there was his desire, expressed earlier on, to "unite the comic with the terrible in Shakespeare's manner." The subject of a court jester would allow him to do precisely that.

But it was not all plain sailing. Piave, resident librettist and stage director at the Venice Teatro La Fenice, evidently received assurances by word of mouth (though it is not clear from whom) that the subject would meet with no objection. Accordingly, he set to work on the scenario of what Verdi insisted should be called *La maledizione di Vallier* or, for short, *La Maledizione*. This he sent off to Carlo Mazzari, the theater's pres-

ident, who was less optimistic as to the outcome. Piave, however, stood firm, reiterating Hugo's arguments regarding the "morality" of the play. Verdi followed up his defense with a note to the effect that Mazzari's doubts caused him considerable embarrassment; for, though he could not claim to have begun setting music to a libretto yet unwritten, he had already pondered the subject deeply and found the appropriate "color" (*tinta*—a favorite word of his in this connection) for the music; therefore, the hardest part of his task had already been accomplished. If the subject were refused, he would be unable to compose another opera in time for the scheduled date.

The text of *La Maledizione* was duly dispatched to the Venetian authorities; and the prospect appeared sufficiently favorable for Verdi to begin the composition. Then, barely three weeks before the opening of the opera season, the blow fell. A decree from the Military Governor forbade the subject absolutely and "regretted that the poet Piave and the celebrated Maestro Verdi have not been able to choose some other field in which to exhibit their talents than one of such repellent immorality and obscene triv-

iality as is the plot of the libretto entitled *La Maledizione*." It was not to be re-submitted in any form whatsoever.

But Piave did not give up hope. He re-worked the text, preserving his original meters but changing the king into a subordinate nobleman, who would take on the opera's title. It is in *Il Duca di Vendôme* that we first encounter the names Rigoletto, Gilda, Maddalena and Giovanna. The Duke himself is single, so there is no question of adultery; moreover, he declares to his courtiers (who are understandably astonished) that he intends to give up his life of philandering for Gilda's sake. He is not enticed to Sparafucile's inn, but drops in merely to seek shelter from the coming storm. There is no sack for Gilda's body and no hump on Rigoletto's back.

Surprisingly, in view of the earlier ban, the police gave their approval. It was Verdi who objected to the elimination of Hugo's most

daring strokes, and above all to the decision not to make Rigoletto a hunchback. "I find it very fine," he wrote, "to represent this character, outwardly deformed and ridiculous, inwardly impassioned and full of love. I chose the subject precisely for all these qualities and these original features, and if they're removed I can no longer write the music. If you tell me that the notes will fit this drama just as well, I can only reply that I don't understand such reasoning, and I tell you frankly that, good or bad as my notes may be, I don't write them at random; I always manage to give them a character."

Nevertheless, the chief hurdle had been surmounted. The bones of Hugo's drama were still discernible beneath the surface trappings; and it was a short step to the definitive version in which—with a further alteration of names and locale—the original situations were restored. A cryptic remark of Piave's indicates the identity of the Duke of Mantua during the period chosen. ("Everyone knows who was reigning in Mantua at that time.") It was that notorious roué, Vincenzo Gonzaga, patron of Rubens and Monteverdi. An appropriate choice,

therefore; but it was prudent not to have him mentioned by name.

The premiere took place on March 11, 1851 and was an instant success, of which the somewhat cautious reviews in the press give very little idea. So, the opera had no difficulty in circulating. But, over the next decade, few audiences south of Lombardy-Venetia were allowed to hear the opera as Verdi and Piave had written it. Indeed, the various adaptations that prevailed make *Il Duca di Vendôme* seem a model of fidelity to Victor Hugo. In *Viscardello*, the Roman version, the Duke of Nottingham may have a roving eye, but, as he tells us in the second verse of his *ballata*, his conduct is always irreproachable. In the last act he merely pretends to flirt with Maddalena, as is clear

Rigoletto

ACT I

Scene 1—The Duke of Mantua surveys his court to choose a woman with whom to pass the night and selects the Countess Ceprano. She is flattered but nervous; her husband is present. This leads to an impasse. Marullo enters with news for his fellow courtiers that Rigoletto, the jester, has a mistress in town. The Duke then discusses his dilemma with Rigoletto, who suggests the following alternatives for Ceprano: prison, exile or beheading. Ceprano and the courtiers are outraged and swear vengeance on Rigoletto. Monterone, an old nobleman, comes to denounce the Duke and his dissolute court. With the Duke's consent, Rigoletto mocks the old man and his dishonored daughter. Monterone curses both Rigoletto and the Duke for laughing at a father's grief. Rigoletto suddenly fears for the safety of his own daughter, whom he has kept carefully hidden from the court.

Scene 2—Later that evening, Rigoletto is accosted by Sparafucile, who offers his services as a killer. Rigoletto spurns his offer and then reflects on their encounter. He sees Sparafucile as his alter ego: one kills with a sword, the other with words. Monterone's curse continues to haunt him.

Scene 3—Rigoletto returns home and greets his daughter, Gilda, declaring that she means the world to him. She reciprocates his feelings but questions why he has kept her concealed. He fears the courtiers and warns the nurse to guard Gilda carefully. Hearing a noise in the street, he goes out to investigate. The Duke, disguised as a student, enters and is astonished to discover that the girl he had seen in church is Rigoletto's daughter. He and Gilda declare their love. Then, fearing Rigoletto's return, he leaves. Left alone, Gilda rhapsodizes on the "student's" false name, Gualtier Maldè, while outside the courtiers gather to kidnap the woman they believe to be Rigoletto's mistress. To exact their revenge on the jester, they will present the girl to the Duke. Rigoletto returns to find the courtiers near his house, but they fool him into thinking they have come to abduct the Countess Ceprano, who lives next door. Too late, Rigoletto discovers the trick.

ACT II

The Duke, unaware of what has occurred, laments the fact that when he returned to Gilda's house he found it deserted. The courtiers describe how they kidnapped Rigoletto's mistress, and the Duke leaves to find her. When Rigoletto enters, a remark from the page alerts him to Gilda's whereabouts. He rages at his tormentors, but is soon reduced to begging them for pity. When Gilda bursts onto the scene, Rigoletto orders the courtiers to leave him alone with his daughter. She explains how she met the Duke, whom she had taken to be a student, at church. Rigoletto comforts her. Monterone, on the way to his beheading, laments that no one has yet struck down his daughter's seducer. Rigoletto promises to do so. Gilda begs mercy for the Duke.

ACT III

Rigoletto has brought Gilda to Sparafucile's inn to show her the real nature of the man she loves. The Duke, once again incognito, flirts with Sparafucile's sister, Maddalena. Gilda laments his faithlessness, but still continues to love him. Rigoletto sends her home and hires Sparafucile to kill the Duke. Maddalena urges her brother to spare him, and he agrees, provided another victim can be found as a substitute so that he can keep his pact with Rigoletto. Gilda, unable to follow her father's orders, returns and, overhearing the conversation, presents herself as the victim. Rigoletto returns to collect his victim and is given a body. Hearing the Duke's voice in the distance, he quickly uncovers the wraps and finds the dying Gilda. Monterone's curse has been fulfilled.

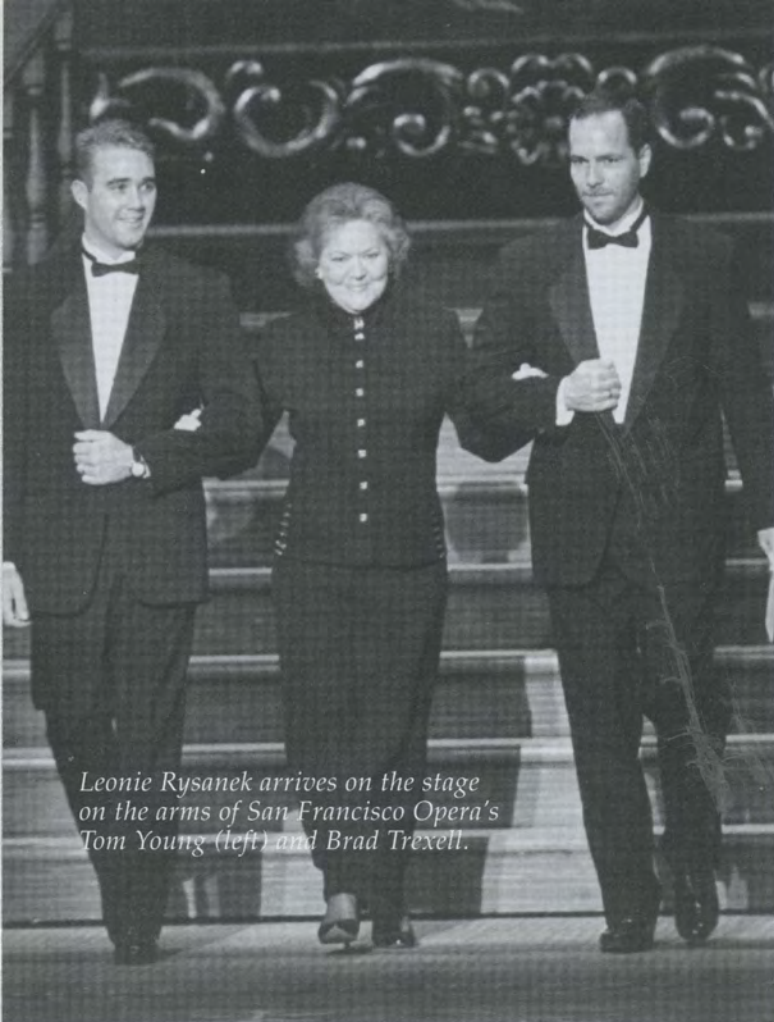

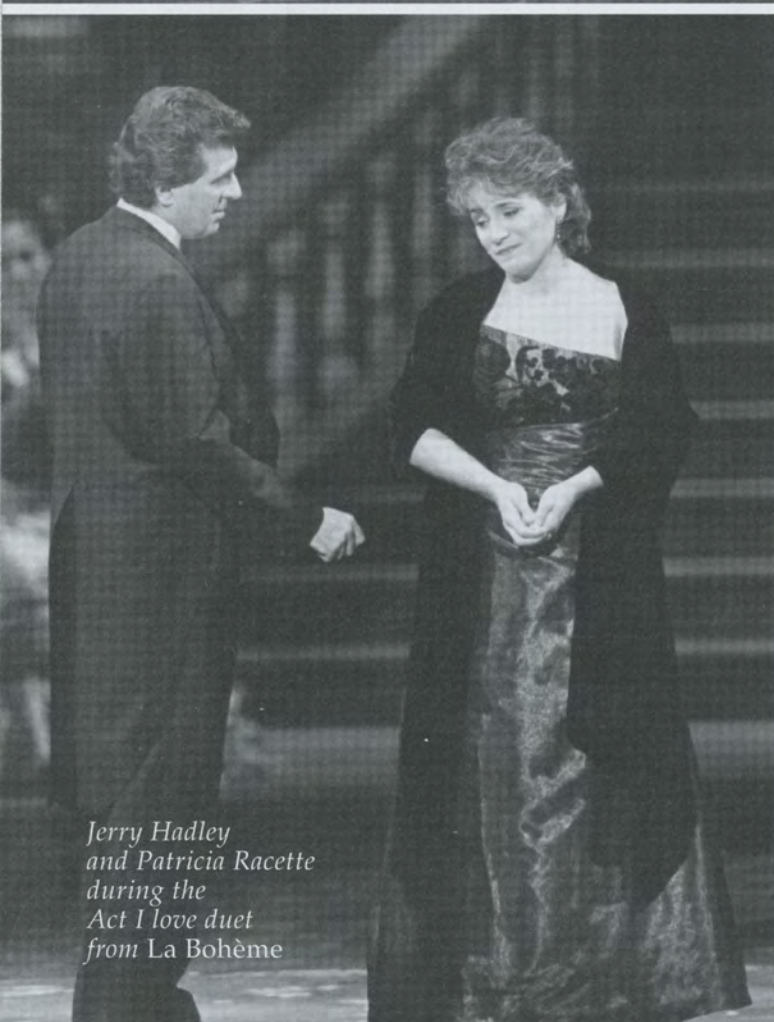




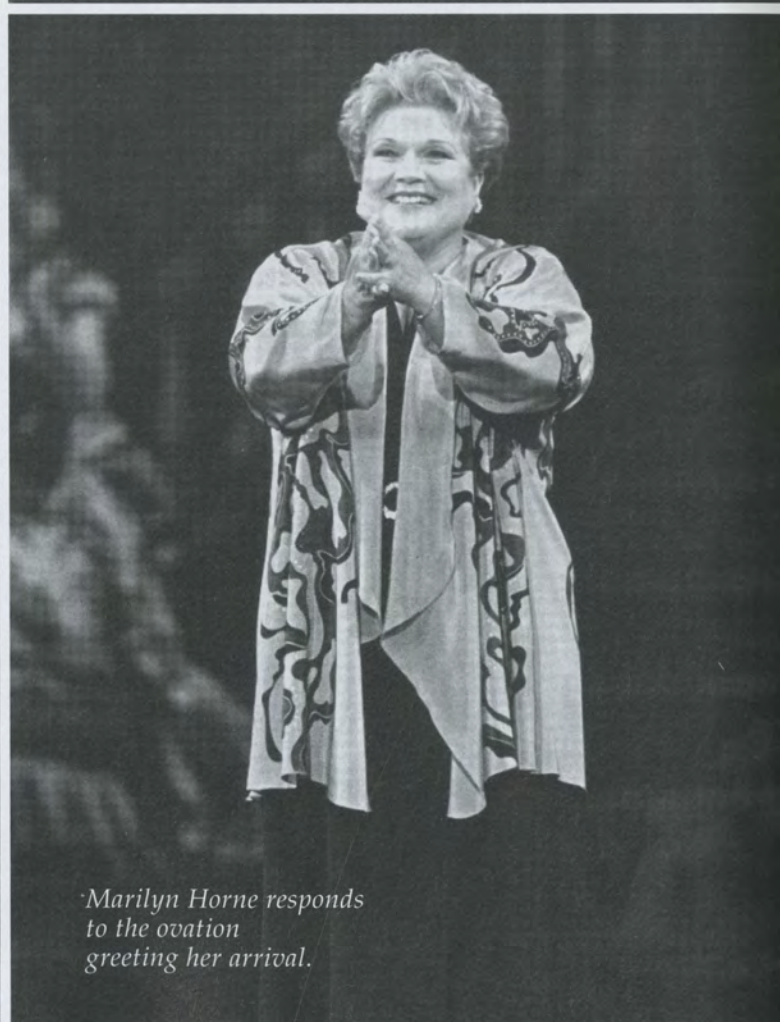

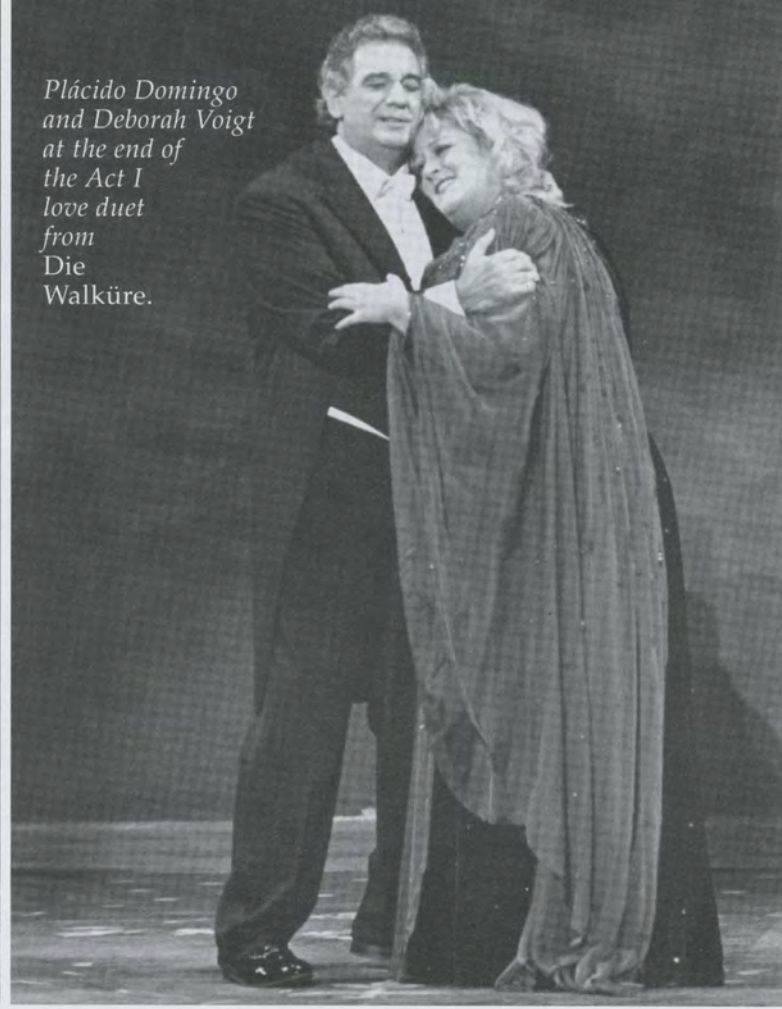

Sponsors fill a supporting role in the development of Opera Center singers

WE ALL NEED THEM. The people who will be there for us through thick and thin, good and bad times, no questions asked. They might be friends, family, a teacher or a colleague... whatever the official title, they are our champions. For young opera singers, there is a need for a very special kind of champion: a sponsor. A person who will put the money down to make it possible for an artist to focus

entirely on the craft: building technique, learning languages, repertoire, acting, and all of the myriad elements needed to build a career. A person who might even help to purchase concert attire and lend a friendly ear every now and then. Somebody who will do all of this because they believe in you and where you are going, plain and simple.

Over the years, the San Francisco Opera Center (under the direction of Richard Har-

rell since 1996) has built a special family of sponsors to fill the "supporting role" that makes it possible for the young singers to flourish, including the Adler Fellows—the young resident artists of San Francisco Opera—and the young singers of the Merola Opera Program. In providing this support, wonderful relationships develop and a variety of careers are nurtured.

Many Opera Center alumni return each year to perform in the Company's main sea-

son. For example, *Rigoletto* features performances by Ruth Ann Swenson, Catherine Keen and Kevin Langan. Conductor Patrick Summers (who went through the apprentice coach program and became the Opera Center music director from 1989 to 1994) leads the final four performances of *Rigoletto* and the production of *Guillaume Tell* which features Patricia Racette and other alumni. Recent participants Zheng Cao, Nicolle Foland, Anna Netrebko and David Okerlund are featured in the January production of *Le Nozze di Figaro* with current Adler Fellow John Relyea in the title role.

"I became a sponsor last year, and it's one of the great joys of my life," says Pat Beresford. "It has energized me incredibly. I'm going to be 70 this year and people think I'm 55... my energy comes from this. You could say that these young singers have become my extended family. I have a son who lives with his wife and family in Ohio and I don't get to see them very often, so this fills a wonderful place in my life.

"I sponsored Peggy Kriha Dye last year, and now I'm co-sponsoring her along with John Autry and Mel Ulrich. Peggy and John just amazed me in the Showcase production of *Ezio* this year, and Mel made his Company debut as Yamadori and Sharpless in *Madama Butterfly* [at the Golden Gate Theatre] during the summer. I was just beaming with pride. And you know, his mother came up to me, gave me a big hug and said 'I'm so glad Mel has another mother down here!'

"I also sponsored Armando Gama in this summer's Merola Opera Program—he was Alidoro in the Stern Grove production of *La Cenerentola*. I think I'm becoming the baritone mom! [Autry, Ulrich and Gama are all baritones.] When you hear these phenomenal young people sing, you feel so good knowing that you've had something to do with their development. I mean, they are such incredible talents, and they are the 'alive' part of opera."

Beresford has chosen to take a very active role in her sponsorships. "Not all spon-

sors want to get as involved as I do, but then, I'm a born actress and I love being in the middle of it all." Indeed she does. In 1995 she became a supernumerary in *Faust* as "one of the dead ladies that Sam Ramey called up from the underworld." Since then, she has "supered" in a number of operas, sometimes with the very singers that she sponsors as in *Il Barbiere di Siviglia*, *Carmen*, *Aida*, and last summer in *The Elixir of Love* at Stern Grove.

During *Barbiere*, she became friends with acclaimed mezzo-soprano Jennifer Larmore, who sang Rosina. "If an international career is what a young singer wants, then you have to be willing to go for it 100%," says Larmore. "This means total dedication and, for a while, at least until you are solidly on your way, total focus. With a sponsor, you can worry more about what to sing at your next audition than what time you have to report to the restaurant to wait tables. I had two sponsors in Georgia and the most wonderful thing was that they believed in me enough to invest

in me financially. It made it 10 times easier to concentrate on my music and I didn't have to work two jobs just to make ends meet."

James Schwabacher, one of the pillars of the Opera Center who himself enjoyed a successful career as a singer, has sponsored countless singers over several decades and has created additional performance opportunities through the Schwabacher Debut Recital Series.

"In a way, it feels like a continuation of my own career," he states. "I think it's terribly important to give these young people every opportunity to develop their gifts. And we're able to do that here with a very high standard. The happiest moments of my life have been on the stage and it's fantastic to be able to pass that along."

Schwabacher's 1997 recital series featured soprano Sari Gruber, baritone Kamel Boutros, soprano Nicolle Foland and bass-baritone John Relyea. It was the most heavily subscribed season since the series was founded 15 years ago.

"The song recital must be preserved," he states emphatically. "Think of the great repertoire there is . . . and there's only one way it's going to stay alive. It's wonderful training for singers, too, because I maintain that there's nothing more challenging than giving a full recital. I'm very proud of the programming we've had on the series . . . spanning the important traditional repertoire and the new works that keep it fresh."

He continues: "Of course, there's no substitute for role models in singing. I was lucky to have great people who inspired me through my singing career: Gaetano Merola, Kurt Herbert Adler, Povla Frijsch, Martial Singher, Jan Popper . . . real legends in this field. These were people who really pushed me forward and made me want to work harder and achieve more."

Recognizing the importance of role models in singing, the Opera Center brings in a number of master teachers each year. During the summer, the great soprano Régine Crespin came for her 15th season with the Merola Opera Program. Over a three-week period, she worked with the Merola singers and the Adler Fellows every day. Additional teachers included director Lotfi Mansouri, pianist and opera coach Warren Jones, director Colin Graham, vocal teacher Marlena Malas, and many others.

Without sponsors, these young artists most likely would not have the opportunity to work with such master teachers or the extraordinary coaches on the Opera's musical staff.

Prior to her Schwabacher recital this year, Nicolle Foland (who completed her Adler Fellowship this year) singled out mezzo-soprano Frederica von Stade as a role model. "She's a beautiful singer. There's a freshness to her singing, a giving, the way she communicates with the audience. Just the way she moves and acts onstage." Von Stade is an inspiration to legions of young singers, and this year she will be the honorary chairman for Front and Center, the Opera Center's annual benefit. "It's the easiest role I've ever had!" the mezzo says with a laugh.

"The Opera Center is extraordinary," von Stade continues, "and the reason is, it's my impression, that there is an incredible organization behind these kids. They are really nurtured and get good training, plus they get so many performance opportunities. I mean when it comes to performing, how you do it is—you do it!"

"I didn't have anybody like Jim Schwabacher or Annette Campbell-White around when I was going to school, so I had to find jobs the whole time. I did temp work and sang a lot of church and synagogue jobs. I was very lucky because I happened to be in the right place at the right time. There had been a strike at the Met and they suddenly needed a lot of comprimario singers. It was just good timing.

"I have strong associations with many of the singers who have come through the Opera Center, like Tom Hampson and Brian Asawa, so I was delighted to be asked to help out with the benefit." The evening,

which takes place on December 7, features dinner and a concert by the Adler Fellows—usually filled with unexpected surprises and a lot of humor.

Countertenor Brian Asawa, an Opera Center alumnus who is enjoying an international career, remembers the sense of security he felt from his sponsors: Reid and Peggy Dennis, and Michael and Rusty Roland. "Without sponsors who are willing to put down thousands of dollars to build your career, it would be impossible. A young singer just can't afford to pay for all of the things you need, from housing and a living stipend to coachings and so on."

Pat Beresford says that the reason she became a sponsor was a conversation with Deborah Voigt, a soprano of international acclaim and a Merola Opera Program and Adler Fellowship alumna.

"We got to know each other about five years ago," Beresford says. "I remember driving back from a fun evening we spent with the Opera Standees Association—yes, I'm a member of that, too—and she turned to me and said, 'You know, Pat, I see how enthusiastic you are about the young singers coming along and let me tell you, I don't know what I would have done if I hadn't had the support I got when I was here in Merola and as an Adler Fellow, both financially and emotionally. I think that's the way you should go. And you'll find that you will get so many rewards . . . it will absolutely blow your mind.'

"And you know what?" Beresford asks. "She's right." ♦

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from the indications "ironico . . . ridendo . . . con caricatura." Nor does he behave arrogantly towards Sparafucile; instead, like the perfect English gentleman that he is, he converses with him and his sister about the weather:

Duke: And then . . . Boston is far away. . . A storm is threatening.

Sparafucile: Indeed.

Maddalena: It looks like it's clearing up.

Duke: I don't think so.

(It is, of course, Boston, Lincolnshire, but might just as well be Massachusetts . . .)

In *Clara di Perth*, written for Naples by Leone Emanuele Bardare, who would later complete Cammarano's libretto for *Il Trovatore*, the Duke of Rothesay (the name taken from Walter Scott's *The Fair Maid of Perth*) is even more virtuous. In the Act III quartet, far from chatting up Maddalena on his own account, he is trying to persuade her to look kindly on an absent suitor. It is not his fault if Clara and her father, looking on from a distance, misunderstand the situation. In both versions, the heroine is saved from death, leaving the jester to exclaim, "You live? Oh, merciful heaven!" Was the mode of the concluding bars changed from minor to major? If so, one can sympathize with Verdi's observation that when certain theaters perform his works they ought to print under the title "Words and music by" . . . and fill in the name of the censor. "How would you like it," he wrote to his friend, the sculptor Vincenzo Luccardi, "if someone tied a black ribbon around the nose of one of your statues?"

Fortunately, the unification of Italy put an end to censorship, thereby allowing *Rigoletto* to make its full effect. With Verdi, new and unusual situations never failed to provide new musical solutions. To convey the full range of the jester's character he has recourse to a recitative ("Pari siamo") which has all the importance of an aria, while encompassing a far wider variety of mood. *Rigoletto*'s own formal solo ("Cortigiani, vil razza dannata"), the opera's centerpiece, is in one movement only, articulated in three sections. In the first, he inveighs passionately against the courtiers who have abducted his daughter with his own unwitting connivance; in the second, he pleads with one of them; in the last, he throws himself on their mercy; and it is just at this moment of abject humiliation that the music carries him to heights of nobility that make us forget his deformity, both moral and physical.

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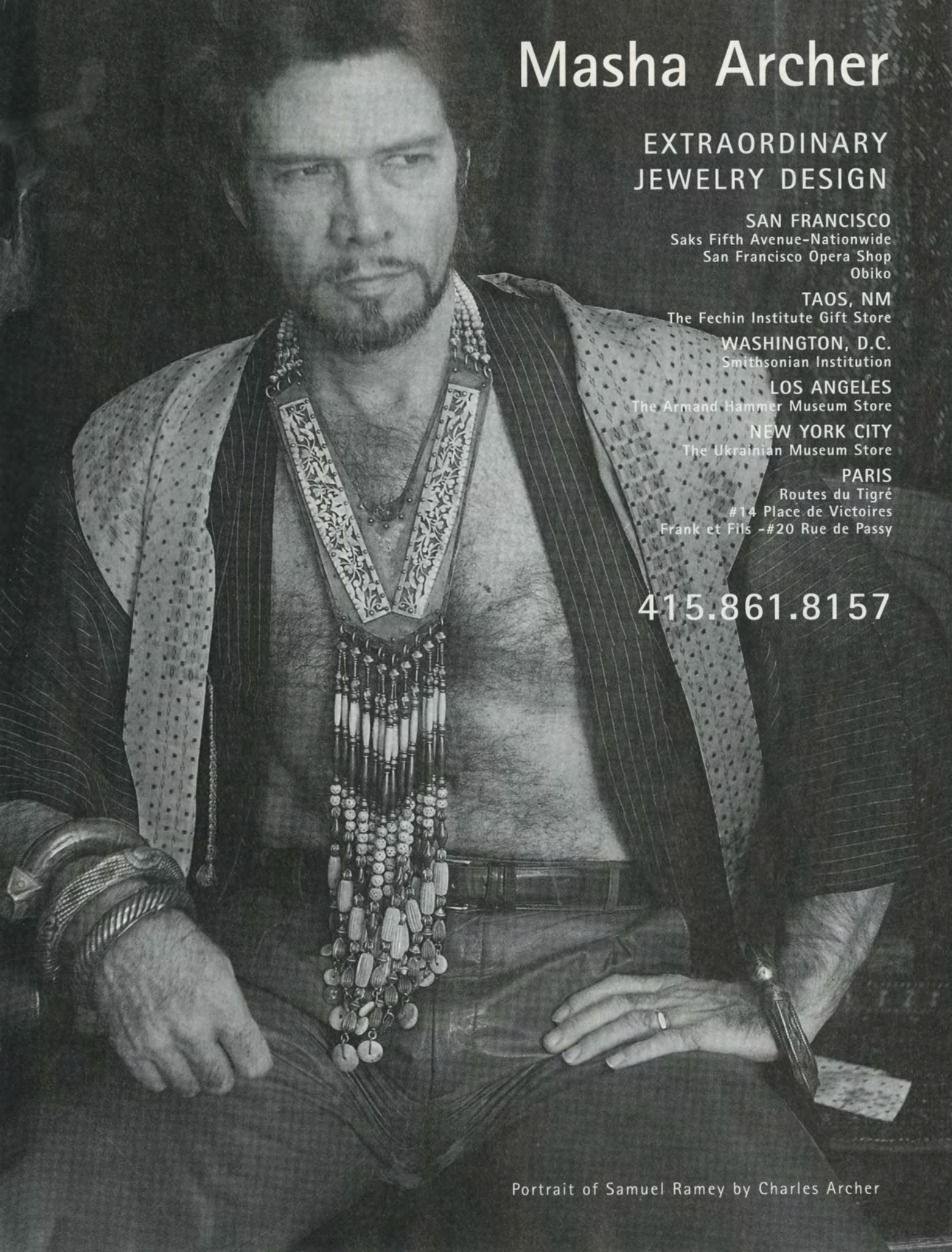

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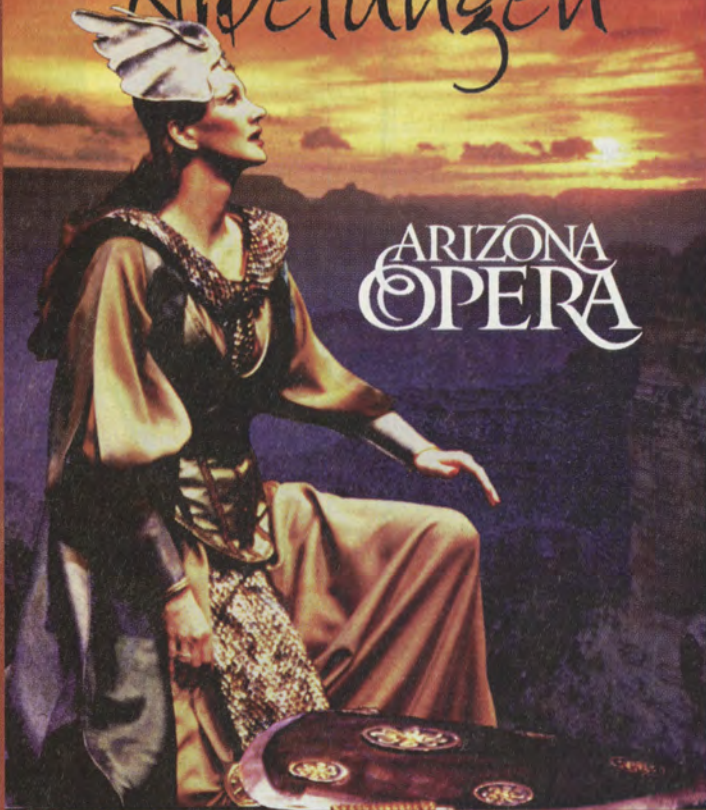
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Certain of the opera's innovations are foreshadowed elsewhere. The duettino between Rigoletto and Sparafucile, during which neither sings together, has a precedent in that of the two spies in Donizetti's *Lucrezia Borgia* (Hugo again, with another unappealing protagonist); but the strange, phosphorescent scoring gives it a sinister quality all its own. The use of a wordless chorus to portray the moaning of the wind can be found in Auber's comic opera *Haydée*, but merely as background to a lighthearted refrain. Where *Rigoletto* most notably breaks fresh ground is in its treatment of time. Occurrences of the "expanded moment," so common in Italian opera of the time, during which the action freezes just where one expects it to move forward, are here reduced to two only: the general dismay (brief enough) following Monterone's curse, and the Duke's cabaletta ("Possente amor mi chiama") with its conventional repeat. No model exists for the design of Act III, in which the drama never halts for a moment. Even during the famous quartet ("Bella figlia dell'amore") we are aware of the passing of time. Can we say the same of similar ensembles: "Mir ist so wunderbar" (*Fidelio*), "A te, o cara" (*I Puritani*) or even "Selig, wie die Sonne" (*Die Meistersinger*)? Most certainly not. In Italian opera of the past, storms have been either preludes (as in *I Puritani*, Act III) or interludes (as in *Il Barbiere di Siviglia* and *La Cenerentola*). The storm in *Rigoletto* develops concurrently with the action, interspersed with "cut-away shots" of the singers, who then join with the orchestra to reinforce the climax in the terzetto, "Se pria ch'abbia il mezzo." No Italian composer had created so powerful a fusion of tone-painting and drama. The ploy of using a song (the king's "Souvent femme varie") as a dramatic prop belongs, of course, to Hugo. The problem lies in giving it the same force in a context in which everything is sung. Verdi solves it by devising a popular, catchy melody ("La donna è mobile") which stands out from the surrounding music, while never jarring with its basic idiom. Nothing is more chilling than the moment when it impinges on the ear of the avenging father.

Such, then, are some of the qualities that set *Rigoletto* well ahead of its time. Some years later Verdi, when asked which he considered his best opera, is said to have replied, "Speaking as an amateur, *La Traviata*; speaking as a professional, *Rigoletto*." Intending no disparagement to the former, we can see what he means. ♦

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ARTIST PROFILES



Soprano **RUTH ANN SWENSON** returns to San Francisco for one additional performance as Gilda in the second cast of *Rigoletto*, while portraying the role of Liù at the Metropolitan Opera for the first time in her career. She has won critical accolades internationally in such theaters as the Chicago Lyric Opera, Opéra National de Paris, Cologne Opera, Munich State Opera, Royal Opera at Covent Garden, Berlin State Opera, Grand Théâtre de Genève, Hamburg State Opera, Vienna State Opera, Metropolitan Opera, and San Francisco Opera.

A 1983-84 Adler Fellow, she made her Company debut as Despina in the 1983 season production of *Così fan tutte*, and has since been applauded here for a variety of roles including Dorinda in *Orlando*, Aennchen in *Der Freischütz*, Nannetta in *Falstaff*, Inès in *L'Africaine*, Juliette in *Roméo et Juliette*, Gilda in *Rigoletto*, Pamina in *Die Zauberflöte*, Adina in *L'Elisir d'Amore*, the title role of *Lucia di Lammermoor*, and her first Ophélie in *Hamlet*. Since her 1989 Met debut as Zerlina in *Don Giovanni*, Miss Swenson has been heard each subsequent season in several roles which have included Gilda, Adina, Juliette, Susanna in *Le Nozze di Figaro*, Rosina in *Il Barbiere di Siviglia*, Zerbinetta in *Ariadne auf Naxos*, and Elvira in *I Puritani*. Additional highlights include three major debuts: with the Berlin State Opera as Gilda in a new staging of *Rigoletto*, with the Vienna State Opera as Constanze in *Die Entführung aus dem Serail*, and with the Royal Opera at Covent Garden in the title role of Handel's *Semele*. Engagements during the 1997-98 season include Adina at the Metropolitan Opera and the title role of *Manon* in Paris. The American artist's growing discography includes Juliette in *Roméo et Juliette*, Musetta in *La Bohème*, a recital disc with Plácido Domingo and Thomas Hampson, an album of art songs, *I Carry Your Heart*, as well as a solo recording of coloratura arias, *Positively Golden*.



Soprano **GIUSY DEVINU** has performed in theaters throughout Europe; theaters such as Milan's La Scala, Vienna State Opera, Barcelona's Liceu, Opéra de Monte Carlo, the Châtelet in Paris, as well as other major opera houses in her native Italy. She has been highly praised for her performances of roles in the bel canto repertoire (the title characters of *Anna Bolena*, *Lucia di Lammermoor*, *Beatrice di Tenda*) as well as for her appearances as Violetta in *La Traviata* and Mimì in *La Bohème*. After her professional debut in Cagliari, Miss Devinu achieved international attention when she sang Violetta at La Scala under the direction of Riccardo Muti. Her success in the role led to performances of *Traviata* at the Teatro San Carlos in Naples, Teatro la Fenice in Venice, Teatro dell'Opera in Rome, and was the vehicle of her Vienna State Opera debut. She has also appeared in Vienna as Lucia, Adina in *L'Elisir d'Amore*, Norina in *Don Pasquale*, and Gilda in *Rigoletto*. Additional appearances include a return to La Scala as Amenaide in *Tancredi* and Lucia; the title role of *Anna Bolena* in Monte Carlo; Giulietta in *I Capuleti e I Montecchi* in Genoa; a debut at the Châtelet as Violetta; and her first Mimì in Macerata. The artist began her 1997-98 season as Lucia at the Teatro alla Scala and most recently appeared as Gilda in Vienna. Miss Devinu is making her U.S. opera debut with these performances of *Rigoletto*.



CATHERINE KEEN has already established herself as one of America's most promising mezzo-sopranos. The young artist, a 1989-90 Adler Fellow and a 1987-88 Merola Opera Program participant, has sung numerous roles here since her 1989 Company debut in *Satyagraha*. They include Fricka and Waltraute in *Die Walküre*, Maddalena in *Rigoletto*, Prince Orlofsky in *Die Fledermaus*, Sonya in *War and Peace*, Zulma in *L'Italiana in Algeri*, Hermia in *A Midsummer Night's Dream*, Magdalene in *Die Meistersinger*, Venus in *Tannhäuser*, Suzuki in *Madama Butterfly*, and Giulietta in last season's new staging of *Les Contes d'Hoffmann*.

Among her many Opera Center credits are a Schwabacher Debut Recital and Leocasta in Handel's *Giustino*. Highlights from recent seasons elsewhere include her European debut with the Deutsche Oper Berlin as Dalila in *Samson et Dalila*, a debut with the Netherlands Opera as the Duchess in *Luisa Miller*, *La Traviata* at the Orange Festival, *Samson et Dalila* in Amsterdam, *Luisa Miller* in Geneva, Venus with Copenhagen's Royal Danish Opera, *Otello* with the Netherlands Opera (telecast throughout Europe), Falla's *The Three-Cornered Hat* with the Atlanta Symphony, a recording of *La Vida Breve* with the Cincinnati Symphony, Mahler's *Lied von der Erde* in Paris, and Mahler's Eighth Symphony both in Lyon and Edinburgh, the latter concert led by Donald Runnicles. Miss Keen has appeared in recital throughout North America, and as soloist with several prominent orchestras. Future plans include her Italian debut at the Arena di Verona in *Aida* (Amneris) and *Nabucco* (Fenena); *Aida* at Houston Grand Opera; *Samson et Dalila* for the Washington Opera; the *Ring* cycle in Amsterdam; and *Tristan und Isolde* (Brangäne) with the Cincinnati Symphony. She is the recipient of a George London/William Sullivan Study Grant, a Puccini Foundation Award, and a grant from the Wagner Society of Northern California.



Since completing her master of music degree at Yale University, mezzo-soprano **MARY PHILIPS** has begun a very promising career. Holding degrees in both music and theater from Rhode Island College, and as a recipient of the Kennedy Center National Acting Award, the young American artist is equally comfortable in concert, recital, opera and musical theater. In past seasons she gave her first performances of the title role of *Carmen* with Connecticut Grand Opera, appeared with Bronx Opera in productions of 20th-century works ranging from *The*

Yeomen of the Guard (Phoebe Meryll) to *The Devil and Daniel Webster* (Mary Stone), and appeared in New York's Circle in the Square production of *Sweeney Todd*. As an orchestral soloist during the 1996-97 season, she has sung the Hindemith Requiem with the Yale Philharmonic, Handel's *Messiah* with the Atlanta Symphony, Mendelssohn's *Elijah* with the Orchestra of St. Luke's (all performances led by Robert Shaw), and Schubert's Mass in A flat at the Berkshire Choral Festival. She also recently appeared in concert with the Opera Orchestra of New York (*Ernani*) and in Tenerife (Rossweisse in *Die Walküre*). Engagements during the current season include several debuts: with the Dallas Opera (Ceres in *The Tempest*), Mobile Opera (Zerlina in *Don Giovanni*), and Sarasota Opera (Siebel in *Faust*, Karolka in *Jenůfa*). On the concert platform this season Miss Philips performs Beethoven's Ninth Symphony with the Des Moines Symphony and the Alabama Symphony, as well as Mahler's Eighth Symphony (her first) with the Canterbury Choral Society.

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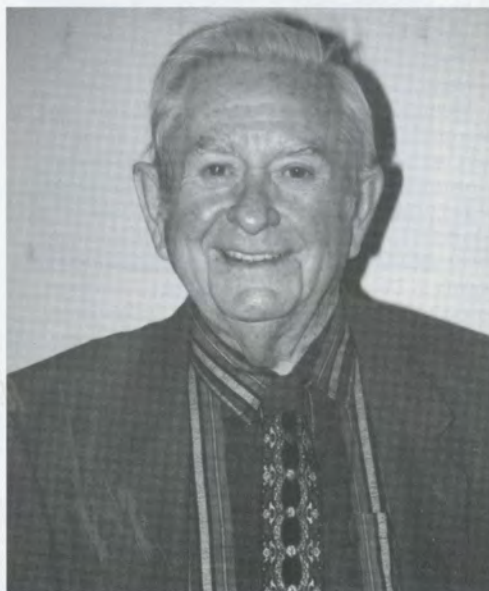
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REX ROGERS

ARTIST PROFILES



In her second year as an Adler Fellow, **ALISON BUCHANAN** made her 1996 San Francisco Opera debut as Mimi in *La Bohème*, returning for the Company's 1996-97 season to appear in *Harvey Milk* and *Aida*. Originally from Bedford, England, she graduated from London's Guildhall School of Music where she won many prestigious awards. She was a winner of the Maggie Teyte Prize in 1991 and sang in recital at the Royal Opera House Crush Bar as a result of the award. Shortly thereafter, the young artist received a Wingate scholarship and a Countess

of Munster Award, enabling her to study at the Curtis Institute of Music where she completed her master of music degree. Miss Buchanan was also a prize winner of the Mario Lanza Competition, Luciano Pavarotti Competition, Ferrier Competition, and was a finalist in this year's International Belvedere Competition. Her roles include the Countess (*Le Nozze di Figaro*), Rosalinda (*Die Fledermaus*), Helena (*A Midsummer Night's Dream*), Madama Cortese (*Il Viaggio a Reims*), Fortuna (*L'Incoronazione di Poppea*) and Musetta (*La Bohème*). As a member of the 1995 Merola Opera Program, the soprano appeared in *La Périchole* and replaced an ailing colleague to sing the role of Mozart's Countess, subsequently repeating this part on Western Opera Theater's national tour of *Le Nozze di Figaro*. Opera Center credits also include a critically acclaimed Schwabacher Debut Recital, the role of Juliana in the '96 Showcase production of *The Aspern Papers*, and the part of the Mother in the Opera Guild's holiday presentation of *Hansel and Gretel*.



CHRISTOPHER ROBERTSON, who made his San Francisco Opera debut during the 1996-97 season as Amonasro in *Aida*, returns to sing the title role of *Rigoletto* for the first time in his career. Lauded as one of the most important young baritones on the operatic scene, he has already appeared with many of the leading opera companies in the United States and Europe including the Metropolitan Opera, Rome Opera, Bavarian State Opera, Royal Opera at Covent Garden, English National Opera, Flanders Opera, Frankfurt Opera, Berlin State Opera

and the Madrid Opera. Career highlights include his Metropolitan Opera debut during the 1992-93 season as Marcello in *La Bohème*; his European bow with the Frankfurt Opera as Guglielmo in *Così fan tutte*; his first appearance with the Bavarian State Opera as Count Almaviva in *Le Nozze di Figaro*; as well as debuts with the Royal Opera (Egberto in Verdi's *Aroldo*) and the Berlin State Opera (Oreste in Gluck's *Iphigénie en Tauride*). The American artist has also performed with, among others, the Minnesota Opera, Seattle Opera, Opera Theatre of St. Louis, New Orleans Opera, Montreal Opera and Edmonton Opera, as well as in Rio de Janeiro, Montpellier, Valencia, Madrid, Catania, Bordeaux, and Santiago, Chile. His most recent engagements include Germont in *La Traviata* at New York City Opera, debuts at the English National Opera and the Washington Opera in *Traviata*, Renato in *Un Ballo in Maschera* (role debut) for Flanders Opera, the title role of *Don Giovanni* at the Met under James Levine, Jaroslav Prus in *The Makropulos Case* for Vancouver Opera, and Donner (role debut) in *Das Rheingold* in Valencia. In the future, the baritone appears at Houston Grand Opera in *Madama Butterfly* and *Billy Budd*, sings the title part of *Guillaume Tell* (role debut) with Washington Concert Opera, makes his debut at the Teatro Comunale in Florence as Ford in a new staging of *Falstaff*, and returns to the Met as Albert in *Werther* led by Donald Runnicles. Robertson was a member of the 1987 Merola Opera Program and was the recipient of a Robert Jacobson Memorial Grant from the Richard Tucker Music Foundation.



FRANK LOPARDO, one of the leading tenors of our day, regularly appears in theaters including the San Francisco Opera (1991 debut, Don Ottavio in *Don Giovanni*; '92, Lindoro in *L'Italiana in Algeri*; '93, Tonio in *La Fille du Régiment*), Metropolitan Opera, Milan's La Scala, Munich's Bavarian State Opera, Chicago Lyric Opera, Royal Opera, Covent Garden and at the festivals of Salzburg, Glyndebourne and Aix-en-Provence. He is also often heard as soloist with leading orchestras as well as on disc, and has collaborated with most of the major conductors of this era including Georg Solti, Leonard Bernstein, James Levine, Claudio Abbado, Riccardo Muti, Seiji Ozawa, Zubin Mehta and Colin Davis. Recent highlights include *La Traviata* (Alfredo) at the Met, London's Royal Opera, Vienna State Opera and in Salzburg; *Don Giovanni* at the Lyric Opera of Chicago and the Met; his Bastille Opera debut as Lensky in *Eugene Onegin* (role debut) and Edgardo in *Lucia di Lammermoor*; his first performances as the Duke in *Rigoletto* at the Metropolitan Opera, as well as in Vienna and Paris; and Tamino in *Die Zauberflöte* in Chicago. Among the artist's future engagements are his first Des Grieux in *Manon* at the Bastille Opera and a return to the Met for Tamino, Nemorino, and his first Rodolfo in *La Bohème*. Lopardo's growing discography includes Mozart's Requiem, Mass in C Minor, *Così fan tutte* and *Don Giovanni*; Rossini's *Il Barbiere di Siviglia*, *L'Italiana in Algeri*, *Semiramide* and *Il Signor Bruschino*; Verdi's *Falstaff* (on CD under Davis, on video led by Levine) and *La Traviata* (CD and video); Donizetti's *Don Pasquale*; in addition to Orff's *Carmina Burana*. The New York native was the recipient of numerous vocal awards and made his professional debut in 1984 as Tamino with the Opera Theatre of St. Louis.



In his 17th year with San Francisco Opera, **KEVIN J. LANGAN** has appeared in more than 30 different productions here, beginning with the telecast presentation of *Samson et Dalila* in 1980, through performances as Timur in *Turandot* ('82, '93), Colline in *La Bohème* ('83, '86, '88), Ramfis in *Aida* ('84, '89), Henry VIII in *Anna Bolena* ('84), Zoroastro in Handel's *Orlando* ('85), Sarastro in *Die Zauberflöte* ('87, '91), Astolfo in *Orlando Furioso* ('89), Sparafucile in *Rigoletto* ('90), Padre Guardiano in *La Forza del Destino* ('92), Elmiro in Rossini's *Otello* (he celebrated

his 250th performance with the Company during the 1994 *Otello* presentation), and the Ghost in the Company premiere of *Hamlet* (1996). A favorite at many other major opera companies, career highlights include his Metropolitan Opera debut as Colline, Leporello in *Don Giovanni* with Los Angeles Opera, Méphistophélès in *Faust* at Houston Grand Opera, King Philip II in *Don Carlos* with the Canadian Opera Company, Don Basilio in *Il Barbiere di Siviglia* with Seattle and San Diego Operas, Osmin in *Die Entführung aus dem Serail* and Seneca in *The Coronation of Poppea* with Santa Fe Opera, as well as Dr. Bartolo in *Le Nozze di Figaro* with the Netherlands Opera. His recent engagements include *Poppea* and the title role of *Le Nozze di Figaro* for Florida Grand Opera, Hobson in *Peter Grimes* and Ariodates in Handel's *Xerxes* at the Lyric Opera of Chicago, Alidoro in *La Cenerentola* for San Diego Opera, Friar Laurence in *Roméo et Juliette* at Dallas Opera, and Leporello in Santa Fe. Among his future plans are the Father in Picker's *Emmeline* with New York City Opera as well as *Turandot* in Dallas and Antwerp. A noted recitalist, Langan has presented solo programs at London's Wigmore Hall and the Carnegie Recital Hall in New York. In 1987, the Merola Opera Program member (1979-80) also took part in San Francisco Opera Center's Schwabacher Recital Series.

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ARTIST PROFILES



Bass **RAYMOND ACETO** continues to gather both popular and critical praise for his performances at leading opera companies. A graduate of the Metropolitan Opera's Young Artists' Development Program, the Ohio-born artist has appeared at the Met each season since his debut in *Tosca* during the 1992-93 season. He has performed there in many productions including *Madama Butterfly*, *Der Rosenkavalier*, *Parsifal*, *Elektra*, *Aida*, *Turandot* and *Salome*. In past seasons the young artist has been seen as Basilio in *Il Barbiere di Siviglia* and Monterone

in *Rigoletto* with Dallas Opera; as Ratcliff in a new Colin Graham staging of *Billy Budd* with Opera Theatre of St. Louis; as the King in *Aida* at the Opera Company of Philadelphia and Toledo Opera; as Méphistophélès in *Faust* with Piedmont Opera; and in several roles at Spoleto (USA) Festival's production of *The Excursions of Mr. Brouček*. Highlights of his 1996-97 season include Raimondo in *Lucia di Lammermoor* for the Opera Company of Philadelphia and debuts with four companies: the Netherlands Opera (Monterone in *Rigoletto*), Montreal Opera (Sparafucile in *Rigoletto*), Kentucky Opera (the Commendatore in *Don Giovanni*) and Baltimore Opera (Ferrando in *Il Trovatore*). Concert engagements include Balthazar in *La Favorite* with L'Opéra Français de New York, his Carnegie Hall debut as Andrea Cornaro in *Caterina Cornaro* with the Opera Orchestra of New York, Handel's *Messiah* with the Raleigh Symphony, and Bach's cantata *Christ lag in Todesbanden*, at the Marlboro Festival. Aceto can be heard on a recent recording of *The Rake's Progress* conducted by Seiji Ozawa.



Bass-baritone **BOJAN KNEŽEVIĆ** most recently performed with the Company during the 1996-97 season in *Hamlet*, *Il Barbiere di Siviglia*, and *Les Contes d'Hoffmann*. He also portrayed Benoit and Alcindoro in San Francisco Opera's production of *La Bohème* and sang the role of the Painter in San Francisco Opera Center's Showcase '96 presentation of *The Aspern Papers*. A 1995 Adler Fellow, his debut season with the Company was in 1995 when he sang the parts of Marquis d'Obigny in *La Traviata*, Don Magnifico in the student matinee production of *La Cenerentola*,

and the Hunter in *Rusalka*. A native of Belgrade, he received his bachelor's and master's degrees from the Academy of Music in Novi Sad, and has performed with the National Theatre in Novi Sad, as well as in Zagreb and Belgrade. As a three-year member of the Merola Opera Program (1992-94), he performed in Merola stagings of *La Bohème* (Schaunard), *Falstaff* (Pistola), *Die Fledermaus* (Frosch), and *Don Giovanni* (Leporello). He repeated the roles of Schaunard, Frosch, and Leporello for Western Opera Theater's national tours. The young artist's credits also include Marcello in *La Bohème* and Leporello with Virginia Opera; Carnegie Hall performances of Mozart's *Coronation Mass* and Great Mass in C Minor, as well as the U.S. premiere of Mascagni's *Silvano* (available on CD). Last season he appeared as Leporello with the Minnesota Opera and as Escamillo in *Carmen* to inaugurate the new opera house in Fort Worth. Future plans include Papageno in *Die Zauberflöte* for Minnesota Opera, Colline in *La Bohème* in Fort Worth, and Sharpless in *Madama Butterfly* with the Bohème Opera of New Jersey.



JOHN ROBERT AUTRY recently received critical acclaim for his portrayal of Sharpless in San Francisco Opera's 1997 production of *Madama Butterfly*. In his second year as an Adler Fellow, the baritone made his 1996 Company debut as Schaunard in *La Bohème*, returning for SFO's 1996-97 season to sing roles in *Hamlet*, *Lohengrin*, *Il Barbiere di Siviglia*, *Carmen*, *Harvey Milk* and *Les Contes d'Hoffmann*. Additional recent credits include the role of the Father in the Opera Guild's holiday presentation of *Hansel and Gretel*, and Emperor Valentiniano in the

West Coast premiere ('97 Showcase) of Handel's *Ezio*. In 1995, he made his New York City Opera debut as Figaro in that company's national touring production of *Il Barbiere di Siviglia*. Other engagements include Dr. Malatesta in *Don Pasquale* with Birmingham Opera Theater, Sharpless in *Madama Butterfly* with Shreveport Opera, and Ping in *Turandot* with Palm Beach Opera. A 1994 National Winner in the Metropolitan Opera National Council Auditions, Autry has also won awards at vocal competitions in Palm Beach, Birmingham and Mobile. Most recently, he was the recipient of career grants from the Shoshana Foundation, Opera Index and the Richard Tucker Foundation. Next season, the native of Atlanta, Georgia, will make debuts at Opera Pacific as Marcello in *La Bohème* and at Michigan Opera Theatre as Lescaut in Massenet's *Manon*.



1996-97 Adler Fellow **STUART SKELTON** performed a number of roles for San Francisco Opera during his 1996-97 debut season, appearing in *Hamlet*, *Lohengrin*, *Carmen*, *Harvey Milk*, *Les Contes d'Hoffmann*, *Die Fledermaus*, *Salome* and *Aida*. First-prize winner of this year's prestigious International Belvedere Competition, the tenor made his operatic debut in his native Australia as Alfredo in *La Traviata* with Rockdale Opera Company. The winner of two of Australia's most important competitions, the Marianne Mathy Award and the McDonald's

Aria Award, he made his 1993 Australian Opera debut in *Die Meistersinger von Nürnberg*. Skelton completed his master of music degree from the University of Cincinnati College Conservatory of Music where his credits included Sam Polk in *Susannah* and Quint in *The Turn of the Screw*. Concert engagements include Beethoven's Ninth Symphony with the Marin Symphony, the Coronation Mass with the S.F. Midsummer Mozart Festival, as well as Verdi's Requiem with the Lubbock Symphony Orchestra and the San Mateo Masterworks Chorale. San Francisco Opera Center credits include Piquillo in *La Pêricle* as well as Don Basilio and Don Curzio in *Le Nozze di Figaro* for the 1995 Merola Opera Program; the reprise of his Figaro roles for Western Opera Theater's 1995 national tour; Aspern in the 1996 Showcase production of *The Aspern Papers*; and the role of Massimo in the '97 Showcase presentation of Handel's *Ezio*. Next season, Skelton will return to the Australian Opera to sing the role of Alfredo in *La Traviata*.



1997 Adler Fellow **MEL ULRICH** recently made his first San Francisco Opera appearance, singing the roles of Sharpless and Prince Yamadori in the new staging of *Madama Butterfly*. The baritone, a native of Puerto Rico, received his bachelor of music and bachelor of arts degrees from the University of Washington, as well as an Artist Diploma from the Oberlin Conservatory. A finalist in this year's International Belvedere Competition, his additional competition victories are the Seattle Civic Opera Competition, the Brechemin Scholarship, and a two-year fel-

lowship with the Singers' Club of Cleveland. In addition, the young artist was a national finalist in the MacAllister Awards (1994) and a Sullivan Award Winner (1997). His appearances with Seattle Opera include Napoleon's aide in *War and Peace*, Amantio di Nicolao in *Gianni Schicchi* and Brühlmann in *Werther*. Ulrich also performed with Wolf Trap Opera as Prodocimo in *Il Turco in Italia*, Pantalone in Mozart/Griffith's *The Jewel Box*, and the Speaker in *Die Zauberflöte*. During the 1995-96 season he was a Principal Resident Artist with Opera San José where he performed the title roles of *Don Giovanni*, *Tartuffe* and *Eugene Onegin*, as well as Figaro (*Il Barbiere di Siviglia*), Guglielmo (*Così fan tutte*), Escamillo (*Carmen*), Germont (*La Traviata*), Zurga (*Les Pêcheurs de Perles*) and Dr. Falke (*Die Fledermaus*). A member of the 1996 Merola Opera Program, the young artist sang Figaro in *Il Barbiere di Siviglia* and repeated the role on the subsequent Western Opera Theater 30th-anniversary tour of the same production. Future engagements include the role of Tarquinius in *The Rape of Lucretia* with the Vienna Kammeroper.

ARTIST PROFILES



PATRICK SUMMERS was recently appointed Music Adviser and Music Director Designate of the Houston Grand Opera. Long associated with San Francisco Opera, he served as Music Director of the Opera Center from 1990-1994 and made his Company conducting debut in 1990 with performances of *Die Fledermaus*. He has since led SFO productions of *Così fan tutte*, *La Traviata*, Rossini's *Ermione* (U.S. premiere) and *Otello*, *L'Elisir d'Amore*, *Tosca*, *La Bohème*, *La Fille du Régiment*, *La Cenerentola*, *Faust* and last season's new staging of *Il Barbiere di Siviglia*. He

also led the Company's 1994 and '95 Opera in the Park concerts. Maestro Summers has numerous credits for the various programs of the Opera Center—Showcase presentations, Merola Opera Program productions, and Western Opera Theater tours. He has traveled extensively for the Center, leading performances of *Carmen* in Guam and Japan, *Tosca* in Shanghai, and *La Bohème* in Japan. Elsewhere, he has been applauded at Lisbon's Teatro Nacional São Carlos (*Tosca*, *Ariadne auf Naxos*), Wolf Trap Opera (*Giulio Cesare*), Rome Opera (*Manon Lescaut*), Calgary Opera (*Lucia di Lammermoor*, *La Cenerentola*), Opera Australia (*La Cenerentola*, *La Bohème*, *Lucrezia Borgia*, *Madama Butterfly*, *Werther*), Washington Opera (*La Finta Giardiniera*) and the Dallas Opera (*L'Incoronazione di Poppea*, *The Tempest*), among others. He also recently led concerts at London's Royal Festival Hall, Amsterdam's Concertgebouw, the Théâtre des Champs Élysées in Paris, the Deutsche Oper Berlin, and with the National Orchestre de l'Aquitaine in Bordeaux. Next season, the maestro is scheduled to make his Metropolitan Opera debut. A native of Indiana, Summers graduated from the Indiana University School of Music.



Stage director **MARK LAMOS** has been artistic director of the Hartford Stage Company since 1980. During his tenure there, he has directed premieres of new plays by Tom Stoppard, Tony Kushner, Simon Gray and Lanford Wilson, as well as an acclaimed series of Shakespeare productions. In 1989 he accepted a Tony Award for the company. Elsewhere, he has staged productions for Canada's Stratford Festival, Moscow's Pushkin Theater, the La Jolla Playhouse, the California Shakespearean Festival (where he was artistic director), and the

Old Globe, among others. He received a Tony nomination for his Broadway directing debut (*Our Country's Good*) and the Lortel Award for best revival with his Lincoln Center production of *Measure for Measure*. His work in opera began with the 1979 premiere of John Harbison's *Winter's Tale* as part of San Francisco Opera's American Opera Project. Since then he has created new productions for the Metropolitan Opera (*Wozzeck*, *I Lombardi*), New York City Opera (*The Turn of the Screw*), Dallas Opera (the world premiere of Dominick Argento's *The Aspern Papers*), Canadian Opera Company, Washington Opera, Santa Fe Opera, Opera Theater of Saint Louis, Sweden's Gothenburg Opera, the Munich Biennale, and Glimmerglass Opera, where he recently staged a new production of *Madama Butterfly*. Last season saw his new staging of *La Bohème* at the Orpheum Theatre for San Francisco Opera. He has also acted on- and off-Broadway, at many regional theaters, and he made his film debut in *Longtime Companion*. Lamos holds honorary doctorates from three universities: Trinity, Connecticut College and the University of Hartford. His upcoming schedule includes a revival of Edward Albee's *Tiny Alice* next year, and the world premiere of Harbison's *The Great Gatsby* during the Metropolitan Opera's 1999-2000 season.



MICHAEL YEARGAN is a professor of stage design at the Yale School of Drama and the resident designer for the Yale Repertory Theatre, where he has designed more than 50 productions. Since his San Francisco Opera debut with the 1993 staging of *I Puritani*, his designs have been seen here in new productions of *La Bohème* (summer 1996), *Carmen* (1996-97), and *Madama Butterfly* (summer 1997). Yeargan's North American opera credits include designs for the Metropolitan Opera (*Ariadne auf Naxos*, *Otello*, *Così fan tutte*), Los Angeles Music Center Opera (*Stiffelio*, *Hänsel und Gretel*), Lyric Opera of Chicago (*Antony and Cleopatra*, *Susanah*), Dallas Opera (*Vanessa*, *Rigoletto*), San Diego Opera (*Aida*), Houston Grand Opera (*Carousel*), Virginia Opera (*Anna Bolena*, *Così fan tutte*, *Porgy and Bess*), and Glimmerglass Opera (*La Finta Giardiniera*), among others. Internationally, he has designed productions for Welsh National Opera (*Beatrice and Benedict*, *Eugene Onegin*, *Norma*, *La Bohème*, *The Merry Widow*, *Cavalleria Rusticana*, *Pagliacci*), Covent Garden (*Stiffelio*, *Simon Boccanegra*, *Aida*, *Attila*), Scottish Opera (*La Forza del Destino*, *La Bohème*), Théâtre Musical de Paris (*Die Zauberflöte*), Frankfurt Opera (*Così fan tutte*), and Opera Australia (*Werther*, *La Traviata*, *Rigoletto*, *Il Barbiere di Siviglia*). Yeargan has also designed New York productions of Terrence McNally's *Bad Habits* and *The Ritz*, and has worked extensively with the New York Shakespeare Festival, American Repertory Theatre and at London's West End.



CONSTANCE HOFFMAN has created costume designs for numerous operas and theater works across the country. Works designed for regional theaters include *Richard III* (directed by Mark Lamos) for the Hartford Stage Company, in addition to *Day of Absence* and *A Midsummer Night's Dream* for The Center Stage. She has also created costume designs for Glimmerglass Opera (*Madama Butterfly*, *Lizzie Borden*, *Paul Bunyan*), Los Angeles Music Center Opera (*Der Fliegende Holländer*), Virginia Opera (*Julius Caesar*), and the Manhattan School of Music (*Mahagonny Songspiel*, *The Tsar Has His Photograph Taken*). Upcoming engagements include *La Traviata* directed by Christopher Alden at the New Israeli Opera in Tel Aviv, *Tosca* at Glimmerglass Opera, in addition to *Richard II* and *Richard III* at Theatre For a New Audience.

Lighting designer **PAT COLLINS** has extensive international credits in opera, ballet and theater. On Broadway, she has created the lighting for, among others, *An American Daughter*, *Once Upon a Mattress*, *The Sisters Rosensweig*, *Conversations with my Father*, *The Heidi Chronicles*, *I'm Not Rappaport* (Tony Award), *Execution of Justice* (Drama Desk Award), *Ain't Misbehavin'*, and *Arsenic and Old Lace*. Her lighting schemes at Lincoln Center have been seen in *The Threepenny Opera*, *The Floating Lightbulb* and *Measure for Measure*. She also designed the lighting for The Royal Ballet's production of *The Sleeping Beauty* and American Ballet Theater's staging of *Othello*. Operagoers have seen her designs at the Metropolitan Opera (*Lucia di Lammermoor*, *I Lombardi*), Royal Opera House (*Katya Kabanova*, the Ring cycle), English National Opera (*Rienzi*, *Simon Boccanegra*, *Mazeppa*), Opera North (*Don Giovanni*), Scottish Opera (*Die Walküre*), Netherlands Opera (*Der Fliegende Holländer*), Vlaamse Opera (*La Fanciulla del West*), Glyndebourne Festival (*Così fan tutte*, *Peter Grimes*, *Le Nozze di Figaro*), Munich's Bavarian State Opera (*Tannhäuser*, *L'Incoronazione di Poppea*), and the Maggio Musicale in Florence (*Die Zauberflöte*). Additionally, she has designed for the opera companies of Los Angeles, Boston, Houston and Washington, D.C.



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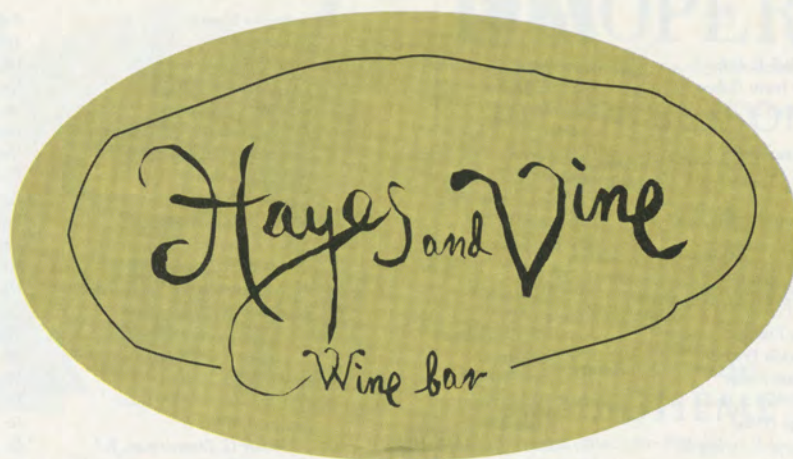

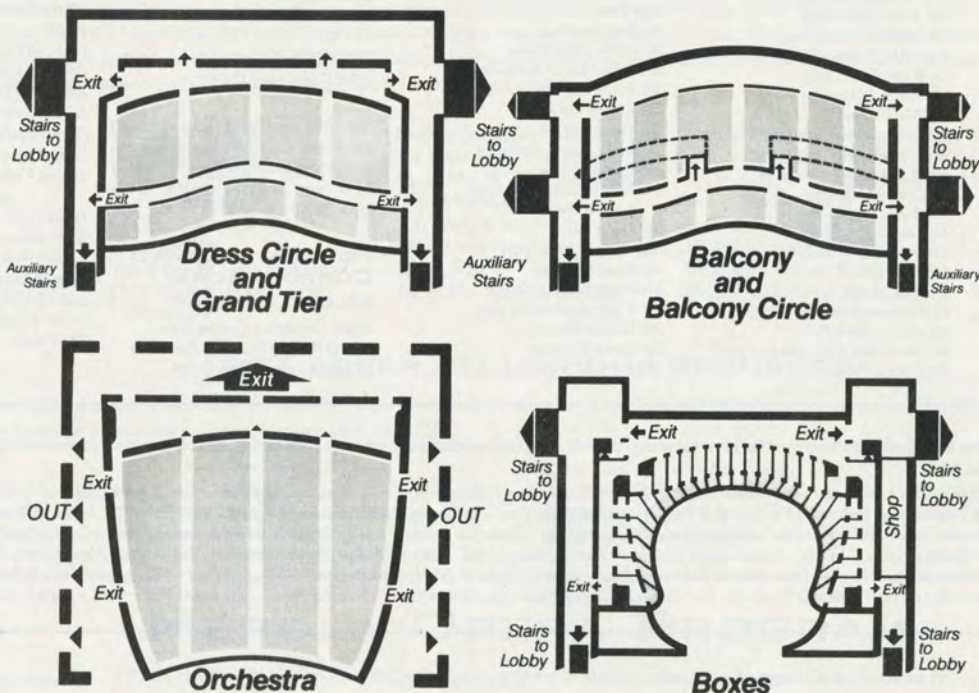
Accessible restrooms are located on all floors except the orchestra (1st floor) and balcony (5th floor) levels.

The role of the Duke of Mantua in tonight's performance of *Rigoletto* will be sung by Richard Leech.



American artist **Richard Leech** sings many of the most demanding and well-known tenor roles of the Italian and French repertoire, both on disc and on the stages of the world's great opera houses. Since making his 1990 San Francisco Opera debut as the Duke of Mantua in *Rigoletto*, he has appeared with the Company as Rodolfo in *La Bohème* (1993), as well as Pinkerton in *Madama Butterfly* and in the title role of *Faust* (1995). Among his performances during the 1996-97 season are: the Verdi Requiem at the Ravinia Festival and the Hollywood Bowl; *La Bohème* at London's Royal Opera; his first appearance at the Prague Festival in *La Damnation de Faust*; *Madama Butterfly* at the Teatro Comunale in Florence; *Tosca* with the Los Angeles Music Center Opera; his role debut as Don José in *Carmen* at the San Diego Opera; a return to the Metropolitan Opera for *L'Elisir d'Amore*, *Bohème* and *Faust*; and his debut at the Opéra National de Paris as Des Grieux in *Manon*. In recent seasons, Leech has made notable debuts at Milan's La Scala, Vienna State Opera and the Deutsche Oper Berlin. He has also made acclaimed appearances with the Vienna Philharmonic, New York Philharmonic, National Symphony and Montreal Symphony, among others. A number of his performances have been televised, including several Richard Tucker Foundation Galas, New York City Opera's new staging of *Rigoletto*, and the Met's new production of *Madama Butterfly*. The tenor has made complete recordings of *Rigoletto*, *Faust*, *Der Rosenkavalier*, *Les Huguenots*, *Salome*, *Die Fledermaus*, *La Bohème*, *Un Ballo in Maschera*, *La Damnation de Faust*, the forthcoming *I Lombardi*, as well as his first solo album, *from the heart*, comprised of arias and songs. Among his future engagements are *La Bohème* with the New Israeli Opera, *Madama Butterfly* for the Chicago Lyric Opera, the title role of *Les Contes d'Hoffmann* at the Met, and *Roméo et Juliette* in San Diego.
